For the first time in years the nesting Brown Pelicans, Louisiana's state bird, have been found west of Terrebonne Parish -- on Rabbit Island in Calcasieu Lake a few miles northwest of the town of Cameron.

> Until last year, all of Louisiana's flocks were offshore. Most were on barrier islands from the Chandeleurs, off St. Bernard Parish, to the Dernieres, Terrebonne Parish.

> State biologists found the newest nesting flock in Louisiana when they went to count alligator nests last June off Rabbit Island, between the Sabine and Cameron Prairie national wildlife refuges.

The flock raised seven fledglings last year, said Tom Hess, the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries biologist in charge of annual wildlife censuses.

It had only four nesting pairs, but hundreds of pelicans were loafing about, he and Noel Kinler noted in their survey report.

Pelicans don't mature until they're three of four years old. Hess hopes some will be doing more than just hanging out during this year's spring and summer nest counts.

The Rabbit Island colony was encouraging news in a year when Tropical Storm Bill destroyed nearly 1,000 nests, washing away eggs and chicks.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service began drafting a proposal last year to remove brown pelicans from the endangered species list in Louisiana and Texas. It is not yet ready to submit, said Edith Erfling, of the Fish and Wildlife office in Clear Lake,

Last year's colonies ranged from the four on Rabbit Island to more than 4,600 on West Breton Island, near Venice.




Stone size for the break-water would be 650 pounds maximum (largest stones would be approximately 24 inches in diameter), and would require approximately 185,000 tons of stones. The stones would be placed on geotextile fabric that is 3600 pounds per linear foot. Gaps for fish access would be built approximately every 1,000 feet, would have a top width of 50 feet, and would extend to the lake bottom.

Additional access dredging is likely to be required in the vicinity of the project site in order to allow rock transport from the Gulf Intracoastal Waterway of Mermentau



JUST A DREAM

Our state has a new governor, Governor Kathleen Blanco and we'll see a new Secretary for Louisiana Wildlife & Fisheries, Dwight Landreneaux, replacing Jimmy Jenkins who has held this position since Mike Foster was governor the last eight years. We also have a new commissioner from Vermilion Parish that will also represent Cameron Parish, Broussard will be there to help us out.

I talked to a few rabbit hunters that went out and did fair, with four in a group getting ten. February is always a good month for rabbit hunting, as we usually get colder weather. Rabbit season runs through Feb. 29 as does quail and nutria season. We are beginning to see more snipes on the ridges at the edge of our marshes and this season runs through February 28.

Hunters are doing fair on pecklebelly and snows, but I'll tell you, it seems they're getting smarter each year. The woodcock season closes Jan. 31 and the goose season closes Feb. 6 statewide, however the Conservation Order for light geese which is snows, blues and ross geese will be from Feb. 7 through Mar. 7. Only snow, blue and ross geese may be taken under the terms of the conservation order, which allows the use of electronic calls and unplugged shotguns. This order also eliminates the daily bag and possession limits. Shooting hours begin onehalf hour before sunrise and extends until one-half hour after sunset.

HUNTER'S TALK

A lot of deer hunters tell me that there weren't near the deer this year, as there had been. That story makes me think we have too many either-sex days in Cameron Parish. This 2003-04 season, we had 21 days to kill does. I think 8 to 10 doe days is plenty. It could be each Saturday of each weekend of the gun season. Besides the still hunting doe days, there's archery season and muzzleloaders which is all either-sex days in Area 3.

JUST A DREAM

I spoke with a friend of mine a week after the hunting season was over and said, there's the great hunting guide and jokingly he said, oh I went yesterday and killed a limit of mallards and pintails. My answer was I went also and killed two limits of mallards and two limits of pintails and awoke from my dream before the game warden checked me, now that's just a hunter's dream.

Another friend of mine told me the reason the ducks were flaring one morning, was because I forgot my cap and the ducks could see the white head. So friends I've decided if you can buy dye for your hair in colors like brown, black, red, blond, even blue, and green. I'm talking to my barber to try and mix a dye that is camoflauge and I'll keep my hair camo all winter long so I

don't flare the game.

NEWS BRIEFS The say old fishing lures and tackle could be worth money. Well a construction worker from South Carolina broke the record for the highest price paid for any one item of fishing tackle when he paid \$101,200 for a 1859 Haskell minnow last November. The price more than doubled the record from 2 months before when a 1900 chartreuse minnow sold for \$45,885.

There has also been other old lures with high prices, like the 1820 era Snyder reel for \$45,000, another Haskell minnow sold for \$19,250. There are only 15 Haskell minnow lures known to exist.

FISHING

Lake Fork, an east Texas reservoir is still the big_bass lake for good bass. From March to August 2003, anglers reported catching 1,571 bass that were 7 nounds or larger Biologist believe that there may have been twice that number of trophies that were actually caught, but not reported in the survey taken.

March is the best month, as last March 685 fish heavier than 7 pounds, of which 16 percent of the fish weighed more than 10 pounds. There were 47 trophy bass caught and reported in one day in March 2003. There's a slot limit of 16 to 24 inches, so 29 percent of all fish reported were longer then 24 inches.

Our local anglers are still catching redfish and speckletrout. There were two over 10 pound specks caught in Big Lake under the lights in the last two weeks.

The Mermentau River is shaping up now that the dredge boats are gone and some nice redfish are being taken.

DID YA KNOW!

Bass Pro Shop stores have 5,000,000 square feet combined, equal to more than 20 U. S. Navy aircraft carrier flight decks. Their parking lots have 25,000 vehicle spaces, equal to more than 70 miles of parking. Water aquariums and displays equal 600,000 gallons, enough water to fill 17,143 bath tubs. All their fishing line sold for 2003 could stretch to the moon and back 82 times.

Call to Order The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Mr. Merchant

Pledge of Allegiance Wendell Wilkerson led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of Minutes It was moved by Mr. Dupont and seconded by Mr. Wilkerson to dispense with the reading and approve the minutes of the previous meeting. Motion carried. Camelot Update

Mr. Bob Hicks, CEO of Camelot Healthcare, LLC, presented the Board with a letter of intent from a company called PACER Health Corporation. This letter stated that it was that company's intention to merge with Camelot Healthcare of Cameron, LLC. Mr. Hicks stated that PACER will assume the financial side of operations of the Hospital, while Camelot Healthcare will continue to operate the Hospital on a day to day basis. This merger will allow the Hospital to have access to new resources of capital in an amount up to \$10,000,000. He stated that this additional infusion of capital would allow the Hospital to catch up on all of its current financial obligations and help in the future development of new revenue producing sources. Mr. Hicks also stated that he is continuing the process of securing a line of credit with Cameron State Bank. The Hospital's Accounts Receivable will be used as collateral for this line of

Mr. Hicks then reported that during the past 18 month, a total of 6 emergency room diversions were required due to outdated equipment in the Hospital's emergency room and in the lab. During the last month's Board meeting Mr. Hicks had presented the Board with his "wish list" of new equipment needed for continued hospital operations, the total which had exceeded 1 million dollars. Ms Jones asked Mr. Hicks if he could prioritize the new equipment needed so that the equipment could be purchased in phases over the next several months. Mr. Hicks responded that the equipment with the highest priority is the emergency room, laboratory and nurses station equipment on his list. The total of this equipment would be around \$288,000.

Ms. Jones then reported to the Board that efforts to secure monies to help purchase this new equipment had been very successful. Representative Mickey Frith had pledged \$30,000 from his Rural Development funds and an additional USDA Grant of around \$75,000 would be possible, leaving the District's share of the first phase monies for equipment replacement to be around

New Business

Mr. Joseph A Delafield next presented the Board with a resolution which would allow the Lower Cameron Hospital Service District to go to the Louisiana State Bond Commission to ask for permission to incur debt in an amount not to exceed \$1,100,000 in the form of excess revenue bonds. Delafield then explained to the Board that for the Phase I amount of \$180,000 the interest rate should be around 2.25% to 2.75% on a two year pay back. The monies to pay back the amount borrowed will come from tax monies collected that is usually paid to Camelot as a subsidy for emergency room operations and hospital maintenance during the year. Camelot has signed an agreement that states that they will forgo this subsidy so that the Board can purchase new equipment that is badly needed. When asked why the Board should not just use it's tax money to purchase the equipment, Mr. Delafield responded that it is always better to borrow the money in case the District's excess cash is needed for an emergency reason such as an economic downturn in the Hospital's normal operations. Also due to the fact that interest rates are at an all-time historic low, this makes borrowing the money to replace equipment even more attractive at this time. When asked why the District is requesting an amount of \$1,100,000 for approval from the Bond Commission, Mr. Delafield responded that this amount represents the entire "wish list" of equipment. The actual amount borrowed, however will probably be less due to the fact that other monies can come in the form of federal, state, and foundation grants and all that the District would have to borrow are the matching funds. This action will, however, establish a line of credit for the District should the funds be needed at a later date. Also, no monies will be approved to be borrowed without approval from both

the District and the Police Jury. The resolution attached hereto and identified as Exhibit A was offered by Ms. Nunez, seconded by Mr. Wilkerson and declared duly adopted by the Lower Cameron Hospital Service District on this 17th day of December, 2003. The resolution authorized the Lower Cameron Hospital Service District to incur debt in an amount not to exceed \$1.100.000 for a term not exceeding six (6) years at a rate or rates not exceeding 4.75% per annum, for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring certain equipment for South Cameron Memorial

Hospital. The Board entered a temporary recess in order to allow the Cameron Parish Police Jury members present to vote on the Resolution adopted above.

The meeting reconvened after the Police Jury approved the above Resolution.

Structural Report Mr. Fawvor reported to the Board that he had contacted Mr. Lonnie Harper so the Mr. Harper could perform a survey of the structural support pilings for the Hospital. Mr. Harper's survey indicated that there had been a normal amount of settling that had occurred during the life of the structure, however no major repairs are indicated at this time.

Mr. Hicks then reported to the Board that the roof over the business office is currently being repaired by the maintenance staff at a cost significantly less than had originally been anticipated. These repairs should be completed within the next 2-3 weeks.

HUD Grants/Loans

Ms. Jones reported to the Board that while consulting with the USDA personnel in Baton Rouge, the fact that the Parish does not have a nursing facility was discussed. They recommended that the Hospital look into a new type of alternative called an Assisted Living Facility. This facility would consist of modular living units, like apartments, which would be located adjacent to the Hospital, and would provide services to the residents such as meals, nursing visits, bathing assistance, and laboratory testing. The first step in assessing the need for this type of facility would be a statistical analysis to see if the Parish residents met the threshold for further study. Then a feasibility study would be necessary which would cost around \$10,000 to \$15,000. Next the USDA would provide loans to fund the cost of construction of the living units, and finally residents could go to the Louisiana Housing Finance Authority for vouchers or rent subsidies for those who can not afford the rent. Ms. Jones stated that she felt that the Cameron Council on Aging would work with the District on the first phase of the analysis and that McNeese State University may be enticed to do the feasibility study for free.

On a motion by Mr. Dupont, seconded by Mrs. LeBlanc it was moved that Ms. Jones is herby authorized to consult with the Cameron Council on Aging and McNeese State University to begin gathering data on an Assisted Living Facility located in Cameron Parish. The motion carried.

On a motion by Mr. Fawvor, seconded by Ms. Nunez it was moved to give the Chairman authority to sign amendments to the Cooperative Endeavor Lease Camelotwith Agreement Healthcare to comply with requirements to secure USDA loans for the new equipment purchases. The motion carried.

Shall the Parish of Cameron, State of Louisiana (the "Parish") under the authority of Article VII, Section 21(J) of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, as amended, exempt from property taxes, drilling rigs used exclusively for the exploration and development of minerals outside the territorial limits of the State of Louisiana (the "State") in Outer Continental Shelf waters which are within the Parish for the purpose of being stored or stacked for use outside the territorial limits of

the State, or for the purpose of being converted, renovated or repaired and any property in the parish for the purpose of being incorporated in, or to be used in the operation of said drilling rigs?

SECTION 5: The officers confirmed or designated to serve as commissioners-in-charge and commissioners, of such substitutes therefor as may be selected and designated in compliance with Section 1287 of Title 18 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes (R.S. 18:1287), as amended, shall hold the said special election as herein provided, and make due returns to the Clerk of Court of Cameron Louisiana and Cameron Parish Police Jury. The compensation of said officers be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum prescribed by law.
