## Sabine Pass LNG to get first cargo April 12th

Cheniere Energy, Inc. has announced that the first cargo of liquefied natural gas will arrive at its Sabine Pass LNG Terminal on April 12, delivered from Nigeria by the LNG tanker Celestine River. The cargo will be used for the "cool down" process which cools the terminal to its normal operating temperature.

The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission gave permission on March 14 for the terminal to receive the cargo for testing.

"After several years of development and construction, we are very excited to receive our cool down cargo on our own ship. We hope this marks the beginning of a long relationship with Nigeria LNG, a dominant LNG producer in the Atlantic Basin," said

Chairman and CEO Charif Souki.

The Celestine River is a new 145,000 cubic meter capacity LNG vessel owned and operated by K-Line LNG shipping and chartered by Cheniere.

The Sabine Pass LNG Terminal and Creole Trail Pipeline will officially open on April 21 with a ceremony at 11 a.m. Invitations have already gone out to the guest list which includes federal officials as well as local, state, and company dignitaries.

Sabine Pass is the newest and largest (when fully operational) North American LNG facility, at 4 billion cubic feet per day capacity. Like all LNG facilities, it is subject to high government safety and security regulations, so the event must be by invitation only.

## Go ahead given for Holly Beach project

The Cameron Parish Office of Planning & Development has received official notice to proceed with engineering work on the Holly Beach Sewer Project, according to Ernie Broussard, agency director.

This project has been identified as one of the top three projects necessary for the Parish's recovery and represents a \$5 million investment. The Police Jury was successful in securing a \$500,000 Priority 2 cash line allocation in last year's Capital Outlay venture, as well as, assigning the full construction property acquisition and initial maintenance in Priority 5.

In recent discussions with the legislative delegation,

Sen. Blade Morrish and Rep. Jonathan Perry were advised of the parish's intent to request and upgrade a continuation of this project from Priority 5 to Priority 2 which would allow the parish to not only proceed with its full engineering on this revised wetland assimilation engineering process, but would also place roughly \$4.5 million in line for cash funding.

"Our delegation was very encouraging about this opportunity and is now scheduling meetings between Parish and State representatives, subcommittees, and both senate and house leadership for this process," Broussard said.

## Cameron unemployment rate low

The Cameron Parish Office of Planning & Development has assembled labor market statistics through its 2007 Second Quarter Census Report of the Employment and Wage Program.

In its report, it has been established that the average weekly wage for Cameron Parish totals \$775. This compares to \$820 for the United States, \$711 for Louisiana, and \$688 for Calcasieu Parish.

Other information represented a civilian labor force of 4,435, with 4,302 being employed to date. This represents an unemployment rate of 3.0%, one of the lowest in the State and competitive with the country.

Cameron Parish's per capita personal income, as of 2005 represented \$8,184, this compared to Calcasieu Parish per capita personal income of \$24,152, which ranks Cameron Parish as 63rd amongst 64 Louisiana Parishes. This also represents a 12.9% average persons living below poverty.

## Tax list is published

Elsewhere in this issue of the Pilot is a list of real estate and property in Cameron Parish on which the 2007 parish taxes have not been paid. Owners are advised that these properties will be up for sale by the Sheriff's Dept. if the taxes are not paid by Wednesday, May 7, 2008.

# \$3.2 million awarded for fisheries' repairs

Millions of dollars in new grant funds are coming to Cameron Parish, it was announced Monday afternoon at the Police jury agenda meeting.

Parish Planning and Development Director Ernie Broussard reported that the parish has been awarded \$3.2 million to be used to repair the marine fisheries infrastructure in Cameron. It was the largest award in the coast-wide program.

The parish has proposed a \$15 million waterfront improvement project, which is to be completed in phases. The grant will begin to fund Phase I of the public-private project.

Broussard also announced that the Louisiana Recovery Authority has earmarked \$21 million for Cameron Parish through a new round of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding which should become available this summer.

This extra money will allow the jury to return the \$1 million previously allocated to surface transportation improvements to the general fund.

The waterfront improvement project, which the fisheries grant will jump start, is part of the overall Cameron Square project, designed to enhance the economic recovery of the town of Cameron. Other parts of that enhancement, announced by Broussard, are a casino/hotel/restaurant complex for which property has already been optioned west of the court house, and a \$25 million hurricane museum satellite branch which will likely be located adjacent to the courthouse square.

Broussard said a series of pedestrian walkways is envisioned which will connect the museum with the court house and other Cameron Square features. The satellite museum will focus on Hurricane Audrey. The main museum will likely be located in Calcasieu Parish, but is many years from becoming a reality, while the satellite can be completed much sooner.

Related to Cameron

Square, jurors declined to consider leasing property on Marshall Street near the Cameron court house to Offshore Cleaning Systems, which has located its business on Court House Square. The company had been storing equipment on the lot, but has now moved it elsewhere.

Jurors discussed releasing a \$3.8 million USDA loan which was approved in 2001 for the construction of a new parish jail. No entity was ever willing to guarantee the repayment of the loan, so it was never actually received. Now, with the approximately \$4 million the Sheriff's Office will receive from the Cheniere PILOT tax program and additional CDBG funds, it is felt that the loan will not be needed.

The new Law Enforcement Center and jail is to be built on parish property behind the court house. It is projected to cost \$10 million.

### MARSH FIRES

Jurors discussed the criminal and civil penalties possible for individuals who set marsh fires that encroach on or damage other people's property. The state statute against setting fires on someone else's land is discussed in more detail elsewhere in this issue. Several recent marsh fires, pushed by high winds, have threatened oil and gas facilities and exhausted volunteer fire departments across the parish.

### HOLLY BEACH ISSUES

The Creole Nature Trail board has asked Cameron Parish to be a partner in placing a restroom/shower facility at Holly Beach to enhance tourism there. Since the storm, there are no public restrooms in the area. The jury owns several properties at Holly Beach, but is still working on a site acceptable to local residents. Arrangements will also have to be made for someone to be responsible for security and maintenance.

The Holly Beach sewer system engineering is said to be moving forward. \$500,000 has been allocated by the state for the engineering, with another \$5 million working its way up

the priority list for actual construction.

### FEMA ISSUE

Holly Beach resident Ray Miller spoke to the Jury about building and FEMA code enforcement. He showed photos of a travel trailer that he said did not meet codes. Miles Hebert, Parish Flood Plain Manager, said he has already sent photos to FEMA District 6 for a clarification of the rules for travel trailers.

Hebert had already asked the Jury to consider assigning his office another inspector, strictly for FEMA inspections, since he is fully occupied with building code inspections. Miller also asked for the extra help, fearing that once code violators have established themselves they will be hard to move or change. He said someone can get a legal permit but then place something else on their property, and it may go unnoticed if there are not enough inspectors to follow through.

### BUILDING CODES

Teddy Broussard also spoke on code enforcement, asking the jury to think before enacting penalties for code violations. He said penalties will mostly affect poor people, because "certain people get by with everything; you won't be fair." Comparing the new codes to Communist rule, Broussard said, "People have rights; we didn't have all this before the storm. Going on three years after the storm there is no togetherness, no unity, no one wants to help anybody. These rules will keep our children and grandchildren from coming back."

Juror Scott Trahan countered that he had to build to FEMA elevation 20 years ago, so the FEMA rules are not new. The new building codes were mandated by the state after Hurricane Katrina and were not optional, jurors said. Juror Thomas McDaniel said the Attorney General had already been contacted about the legality of imposing penalties, which Jury President Sonny McGee said is their duty.

## Historic home is being renovated

The old Vincent home in Hackberry, which was built in the late 1860s, is being repaired and renovated by District Attorney Cecil Sanner. The house suffered roof damage in Hurricane Rita in 2005.

Joseph Vincent married Josephine Ellender and raised 14 children in the home. One of the daughters, Samantha (Mantie) Vincent married Muriel Raymond Sanner and lived in the home place. Their children were Joe and Gordie. Gordie died around the age of 5.

In place of insulation, at that time mud, straw and other raw materials were used. The old fireplace is in the same area it has always been. Across the mantel is an insignia with the number 18, an old English letter "V" and the number 61 following the letter. The top of the fireplace is made of marble.

The staircase had to be replaced and raised because of the earlier pioneers had a lower flooring for the staircase. Upstairs is the original pine wood flooring.

The attic is a spacious area that now holds the air conditioning unit and ductwork.

## Cameron Pilot, April 3, 1975 JURY GETS NEW FACES

The Cameron Parish Police Jury will have three new members sometime next week, and the voters have retired three incumbents, all the results of the first and second primaries of a special reapportionment election.

In Saturday's runoff election, Roland J. Trosclair, Jr., and Willie Ray Conner, political newcomers, were elected to the two seats in District 1, Division B (Ward 3) and incumbent Norman McCall lost his seat.

Archie Berwick, dean of the police jury with 23 years service, fought off a strong challenge from Mason Istre in District 1, Division A (Ward 5) to win 1057 to 725.

What was considered an upset was pulled in District 4 (Wards 4 & 1) when Ernest Myers defeated Charles Precht 397 to 336. Both men were incumbent jurors, Precht with 11 years service and Myers with three. They found themselves in the same election district because of reapportionment.

Two other jurors were elected in the first primary; Lyle (Butch) Crain winning re-election over two challengers in District 4 (Wards 1 & 2) and John R. (Bud) Rollins defeating veteran Juror Charles A. Riggs in Ward 6.

Trosclair, by winning a seat on the jury, may have helped establish a record in the state. He will be the third member of his immediate family to serve as police juror from Ward 3. His father, Roland Trosclair, Sr., served for several years prior to his death a few years ago. His wife, and the new juror's mother, then was appointed to fill the unexpired portions of his term.

With the seating of the jury, the body will go back to the one-man, one-vote rule. For the past several months while the reapportionment matter was being resolved by the jury and court, the jury

was under a weighed vote plan with Riggs and McCall having the majority vote because of the larger population of their wards.

As a writer, I will seek out opportunities to be at schools and among young people reading, telling stories, and encouraging learning. We must do better on education if Louisiana is to be better. We can do it, but everyone must help.

4. I will look for ways to help the less fortunate. The days after Katrina and Rita reminded me of how good-hearted our citizens are. The way that my area, SW Louisiana, opened its arms, homes, and hearts to Katrina evacuees, and then responded pro-actively to our own storm, Rita, still moves me deeply. (A shameless plug: My book, Hearts across the Water, is about the good done by our citizens after the Asian tsunami and hurricanes.)

Our citizens are always generous and giving. I'll not wait until a future disaster to care about my neighbor.

5. Finally, I'll positively share that there is a spiritual answer for every situation, need, and problem. Without being preachy, I will point others to what I've found to be the answer to every need I have: "On Christ the solid rock I stand. All other ground is sinking sand." When folk's hearts are changed, families, cities, and a state can be changed.

Well, I'll end this sermon/post/blog. I'd better get out to the highway, there's plenty of trash waiting for me.

Let's make Louisiana the best it can be. Together, we can.

## \$3.1 grant told for Cameron fisheries and waterfront

The West Cameron Port Authority was recently awarded a \$3.1 million grant to aid in reviving its working waterfront and the local commercial fishing industry.

The local grant was the largest for any agency in the state with only 14 of 59 applications for grants being funded. Pat Forbes, Director of the Disaster Recovery Unit and the Marine Fisheries Infrastructure Grant, noted that Cameron Parish's application represented "a true public/private partnership and demonstrated one of the best examples of integrating an industry sector with its Cameron Square Development."

This allocation represents Phase 1 of a multi-phased \$15 million projected development that is expected to extend over a 3-year period. The project includes wharfs, piers, docking facilities, fuel, ice and other support services and also represents an advanced shrimp processing facility, cold storage, and transfer center for the entire commercial fishing sector.

Ernie Broussard, Director of Planning & Development for Cameron Parish, stated "This initial award cumulates the efforts of a 1-year effort as we tried to assemble an impact team that had the commercial fisherman's best interest at heart. It represents a companion centerpiece to the Cameron Square Development that will create a permanent showcase for the parish's future."

West Cameron Port Commissioner, Howard Romero says, "We are extremely excited to not only receive this award, but to be ranked as the #1 application in the state. The Port also recognizes the continual contribution of Ernie Broussard and his staff, in achieving a milestone in our historic steps to recovery."

Larry Miller, President of Cameron Fisheries LLC says, "I'm thrilled about the recovery of our infrastructure, ice, fuel, docks and the unloading facility. These need to be replaced in order to re-qualify in the ranking of seafood landings. We were ranked 6th before the storm and 56th after the storm and this will create the viable path to introduce the landings back into Cameron. I

am hopeful that this dock will be able to service those ships that now have to travel to Texas to unload a large amount of seafood. This type of funding is also going to help the local people because they have to utilize the docks and the handling process will add value to the shrimp."

"While this program focuses on an often ignored recovery sector, there still remains a great need for more resources to help the communities that rely heavily on fisheries for their livelihood," said LRA Board Member David Richard.

Last month, experts from around the country traveled to Louisiana to discuss, review, and weigh the merits of the 59 different proposals that represented nearly \$114 million that was submitted to the LRA.

These experts recommended projects to a state team that made the final allocation of awards for proposals in the eastern and western areas of the coast. Proposals were evaluated to determine whether they contributed to the following:

Enhanced and ensured continued access to the state's coastal waters for commercial and recreational fishing, eco-tourism, and development of "working waterfronts";

Created/maintained employment in the commercial and recreational fishing industry;

Preserved the commercial and recreational fishing culture of coastal Louisiana;

Improved the economic efficiency of the fishing industry; and

Created storm harbors that provide vessels with temporary refuge during future storm events.

The top five funding allocations and priorities of projects receiving provisional grants are as follows:

Cameron Square Waterfront Development - \$3,115,000

Delcambre Fisheries Infrastructure Project - \$2,200,000

Bucktown Harbor Fisheries and Recreational Improvements - \$2,100,000

Grand Isle - Multipurpose fishing facilities - \$2,000,000

Venice Shipyard - \$1,441,961.

## Road Home Program tells operational changes

The Road Home program will modify its call center operations effective June 1. Operating hours will change to 8 a.m.-7 p.m. Monday through Friday. Phones will be answered by housing advisors who will either assist callers with their questions immediately or route homeowners to their pre-assigned Personal Application Liaisons (PALs).

The operational change is being made as a result of significantly lower call volume that continues on a steady decline. This decline in call volume is attributed to the fact that the program has closed more than 100,000 applicants and has launched the PAL program which is designed to provide one-on-one service to applicants by assigning dedicated program representatives to handle

their cases.

This shift in resources ensures the most effective use of program funding. This change also modifies the need for call center staffing that was required in previous stages of the program.

Approximately 200 current positions will be eliminated at the end of May. Impacted employees have been given 60 days notice of the change in the program and are being offered career management services designed to assist Road Home employees as program requirements are completed over the next year. Impacted employees also will be eligible to apply for any open positions in the program.

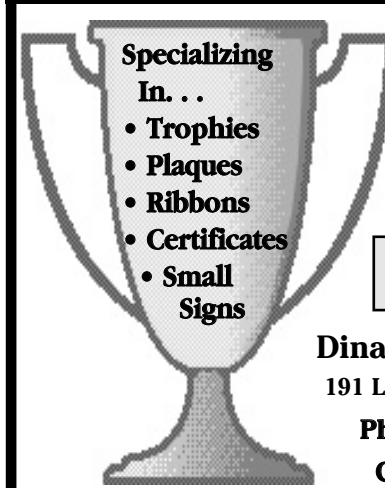

Limits of speckletrout are being taken and top water baits are producing. Some anglers are staying along the ship channel to beat the winds, so you can ease on by the nine mile area, the nine mile cut area and the old locomotive area.

## LACASSINE REFUGE

Catching numbers of bass on the Refuge Impoundment isn't hard when bass are feeding and some nice large bass are still being caught. Fishing plastic lures, with no weight, lizards, floating frogs, flukes and working but do not forget to keep a 1/8 ounce spinnerbait handy, as in the open pot holes, they can be a killer.

## DUCKTAIL

Question, how far can a duck fly for the winter, we do know thousands of miles and that the pintail is the duck of the sky. A pintail shot by a pair of Georgia hunters, had a band, or they were hunting near Ruleville, Mississippi. The inscription was a band with a Japan place and numbers. Making several contacts with biologist, landing laboratories and a bird migration research center in Japan and all this resulted in this news:

Records indicate the pintail was banded in Niigata, Japan on February 16, 2000. This pintail traveled by air 5,000 miles, which is a straight line between Mississippi and Japan, but they think the pintail flew thousands more miles between the two locations.

Pintails that are banded in Japan, have shown up in the Pacific Flyway, but this is a first to our Mississippi Flyway. It is known that the pintail duck, have one of the largest ranges of any duck.

# Zero Tolerance for Litter program is announced

The Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries Law Enforcement Division (LDWF-LED) will join forces with Keep Louisiana Beautiful, Louisiana State Police, local law enforcement agencies and other community partners across the state in the fourth annual "Zero Tolerance for Litter" campaign April 4-6.

Participating agencies and partners hope to raise public awareness that littering is illegal and punishable by fines, community service, driver's license suspensions and possible imprisonment.

"Our goal is to remind everybody that littering is an avoidable blight on our metropolitan and rural landscape and if simple steps are taken to dispose of trash properly, residents and visitors to Louisiana benefit from that effort," said Robert Barham, LDWF secretary. "Enforcement agents on the water and in the woods this weekend will be part of the heightened statewide push to stop violators."

The mission served by LDWF-LED includes protecting Louisiana's natural resources and serving the responsible, law-abiding people who use them. That duty includes reducing litter by detecting, investigating and prosecuting those who dispose of their trash carelessly, improperly and illegally.

A 2008 agency report, "The Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries Law Enforcement Division Continues Its Campaign Against Littering", details field activity from July 1, 1991 to June 30, 2007. LDWF-LED agents issued 4,819 citations for intentional littering and gross litter-

ing during that time. The report notes a rise in littering-related citations from 229 in fiscal year 1992 to 716 in fiscal year 2007. A copy of the report is available on the LDWF web site at [http://www.wlf.louisiana.gov/pdfs/publicservices/LED\\_Anti\\_Littering\\_Efforts\\_040108.pdf](http://www.wlf.louisiana.gov/pdfs/publicservices/LED_Anti_Littering_Efforts_040108.pdf).

Since 2006, when LDWF-LED started accounting for litter enforcement patrols as a specific reporting category, wildlife agents have logged nearly 6,900 patrol hours in this area.

In 2006 and 2007, Keep Louisiana Beautiful lent its support to the LDWF-LED by awarding the department two \$15,000 grants to fund overtime hours for wildlife agents on litter enforcement patrols. The first grant supported patrols in Region VII (in southeastern Louisiana) during a five-month period in 2006. The second grant helped fund patrols in Region III (in central Louisiana) during a three-month span in 2007. The number of littering citations rose markedly in these regions during the grant periods, demonstrating the success of LDWF-LED in pursuing litterers when it possesses the necessary resources.

LDWF-LED Col. Winton Vidrine reminds the public, "Not only is littering ugly and harmful to our environment, it is also against the law. Wildlife and Fisheries agents will continue to take a strong stance against littering."

Combine vegetable soup with sausage and place shredded cabbage over the top. Place lid on skillet and let cook on medium heat until cabbage is tender. Stir together and serve.

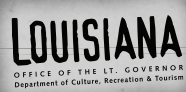

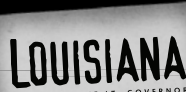

This event is sponsored by the McNeese State University Banners Arts and Humanities Series.

Louisiana's U. S. Congressmen have had a unique place on Capitol Hill, especially as it relates to the oil and gas industry, and topics relating to oil and gas, health care, wetlands and more are sure to make for a lively discussion. This year's panel moderator is Beth Courtney, president and CEO of Louisiana Public Broadcasting.

LPB will once again tape the event for statewide broadcast at a date and time to be announced. The underwriters for the LPB broadcast are AT&T Louisiana, American Press Foundation, Blue Cross/Blue Shield of Louisiana and Jeff Davis Bank.

Hayes, a native of Lafayette, was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in 1987. He represented the 7th District of Louisiana for 10 years. While in Congress, he was member of the Ways and Means Committee, House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee and the House Science and Technology Committee. He founded the "Blue Dog Caucus" in 1987.

Prior to his election, Hayes served as both state Commissioner of Financial Institutions and Commissioner of Securities where he co-authored the Louisiana Banking Code and the Louisiana Securities Code.

Upon leaving Congress, he became vice president of government affairs for the American Counsel of Life Insurers. He is currently CEO and managing member of Washington Matters, LLC, a consulting and government relations firm representing such clients as GE, New Jersey Transit, City of Lake Charles, Louisiana Department of Transportation, Calcasieu Parish and the Port of Lake Charles. He is also CEO of Evangeline Oil Realty Company and a managing partner of Partnership 202 in Lafayette.

John, a native of Crowley, represented the 7th Congressional District from 1997 to 2005 in the U.S. House of Representatives. While in Congress, he served on the House Energy and Commerce Committee.

A conservative Democrat, he is also a former member of the Louisiana House of Representatives, serving from 1987 to 1995, where his committee assignments included the House Natural Resources Committee.

Currently, John is president of the Louisiana Mid-Continent Oil and Gas

Association. Prior to joining Mid-Continent, John was managing director of Ogilvy Government Relations in Washington, D.C., representing the firm's clients in matters dealing primarily with energy legislation in Congress.

Leach, a longtime businessman and philanthropist in Southwest Louisiana, was elected to the Louisiana House of Representatives in 1968 where he served for 16 years. During his tenure he served as chairman of Ways and Means Committee and chairman of the Louisiana Legislative Council.

He served in the 96th U.S. Congress as the last Democrat to represent the 4th Congressional District of Louisiana. Leach was appointed to serve on the House Armed Services Committee, Small Businesses Committee and the Committee on Veterans Affairs.

Leach maintains a law office in Leesville and he is president and CEO of Sweet Lake Land & Oil Company, LLC, and North American Land Company, LLC, Lake Charles, and is chairman of the board of directors of Merchants and Farmers Bank.

In addition to serving on numerous professional and nonprofit boards locally, he also serves as National Democratic Committeeman from Louisiana and is a member the U.S. Rice Federation International Trade Committee and the National Cattleman's Association.

Moore, of Baton Rouge, served 12 years as a member of Congress representing the 6th Congressional District from 1975-1987. He served on the Ways and Means, Energy and Commerce, Budget and Agriculture committees and was appointed by the Minority Leader to serve on the Republican Policy Committee.

He was out of office two years when he was appointed by Pres. Ronald Regan as a U.S. Representative to the Panama Canal Consultative Committee. He also served as deputy secretary of the U.S. Department of Energy, Assistant to the President, Deputy Chief of Staff and Intergovernmental Affairs under Pres. George H.W. Bush from 1989-1993.

Moore retired as president and CEO of American Forest and Paper Association in 2006 after 11 years of heading this national trade association for the lumber and paper industry.

The annual McLeod lecture series honors the late Bill McLeod, a prominent retired district judge and former state legislator. McLeod, who died in 2003, practiced law in Lake Charles for 33 years until he was elected to a six-year term as district judge in 1990. He reentered the private practice of law upon his retirement from the bench in 1997. A distinguished public servant, McLeod also served 23 years in the Louisiana Legislature. All research materials, records and artifacts pertaining to the annual lecture will become a part of the McNeese Library Archives.

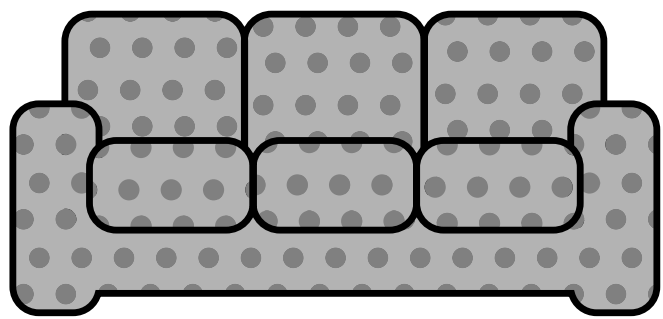
- Know your full name, address and telephone number.

If you are still concerned about the person who has arrived for you, find your teacher or principal for help.

- In case your parent(s) can't get home before you do, arrange to go to a neighbor's or relative's house.
- Never let anyone know you are home alone. If someone calls for your parent(s), tell the caller your parent(s) cannot come to the phone.
- Review your route to and from school with your parent(s). Stay away from alleys, vacant lots and wooded areas.
- Always let your parents know where you are going, who will be with you and when you will be home.
- Do not wear clothing that has your name on it.
- If a stranger asks you for directions, do not go near the person or the car.
- Do not accept toys, candy or anything else offered to you by a stranger.

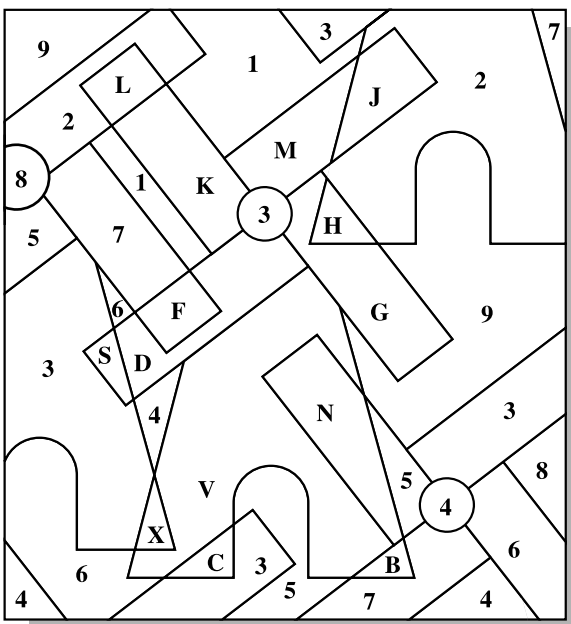

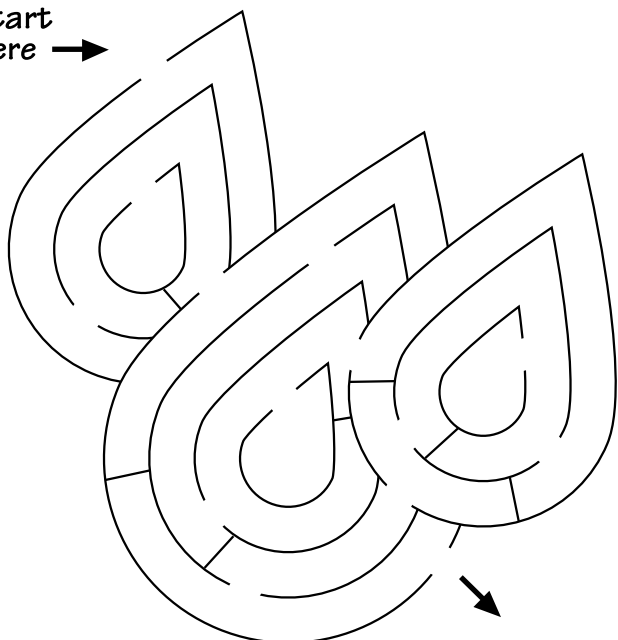

## Fish That Can Zap

Did you know there are about 500 species of fish that can discharge electric currents? These fish have organs, or body parts, that allow them to do just that. The fish use electric shock to capture prey, for protection and to guide them through the dark water.

The most well-known electric fish include the electric ray, the electric eel, the elephant fish and even some catfish.

Most of the time, the electric shock is not very powerful, but the fish release it in a series of pulses. Electric rays usually only discharge 50 to 60 volts of electricity. But the big zap comes from the electric eel, which can produce more than 600 volts of electricity. That's strong enough to kill small animals and stun larger animals and people.

## Incredible Edible Veggie Bowls

Prep time: about 10 minutes  
1 green, yellow, or red pepper, washed  
1 bunch of celery, washed  
1 carrot, washed and peeled  
your favorite salad dressing

Mennonite Disaster Services dedicated its last house in Cameron Parish on Thursday, March 27. Myrna Leger, of Johnson Bayou received the keys to her new home, built entirely by volunteers. An group of Canadian RV-ers worked on the house for two months, getting to know her and the Johnson Bayou area very well.

The project was coordinated through several agencies, including Cameron Community Action, Cameron Council on Aging, FaithShare, and AmeriCorps.

Julie Burleigh, AmeriCorps coordinator, said that at first Leger was leery of the offer to build her a house. She was to pay for the materials, and wasn't sure about writing the check. But after thoroughly investigating the people involved, she did, still a little nervous. But she was all smiles and laughter at the dedication.

MDS also dedicated a house renovation in Johnson Bayou for Archie Berwick on Thursday. The highly efficient MDS team was able to help several more families than originally planned, including remodeling a mobile home for Velma Mock in Cameron, and building porches and roofs for several others.

All the volunteers have gone back home now, to Canada, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Illinois, and other northern climes. Only the project managers remain to close out the base camp at the former Cameron Place

Apartments. But all will leave with fond memories of Cameron Parish people and a strong sense of accomplishment.

All told, Mennonite volunteers have built 10 homes in Cameron Parish since Hurricane Rita. Building is part of the Mennonite Church philosophy, their way of helping others in need. To be sure, Cameron Parish will never forget them and will always be grateful.

A book, "The Hammer Rings Hope," which details the work of MDS, has been donated to the Cameron Parish Library for anyone who wants to know more about this ministry. Each new homeowner also received a copy.

## Now you know: Louisiana law requires motorists to buckle up

Louisiana has what is called a "primary enforcement" safety belt law. That means that an officer can pull you over and issue a ticket if you are not buckled up according to state law. The fine for a first offense safety-belt violation is \$25.

State law requires drivers and front-seat passengers to buckle up while a vehicle is in motion. Kids under one year of age and weighing up to 20 pounds must be secured in a rear-facing safety seat. Kids ages 1 to 4 and weighing 20 to 40 pounds must be secured in a front-facing safety seat. Kids ages 4 to 6 and weighing up to 60 pounds must be secured in a front-facing booster seat and safety belt.

All other children up to age 13 must wear safety belts while the vehicle is in operation. Remember that children are always safer in the rear seat of a vehicle.

The Louisiana Highway Safety Commission advises all motorists to buckle up. Your chances of surviving a crash are improved by 45 percent if you are wearing your safety belt.

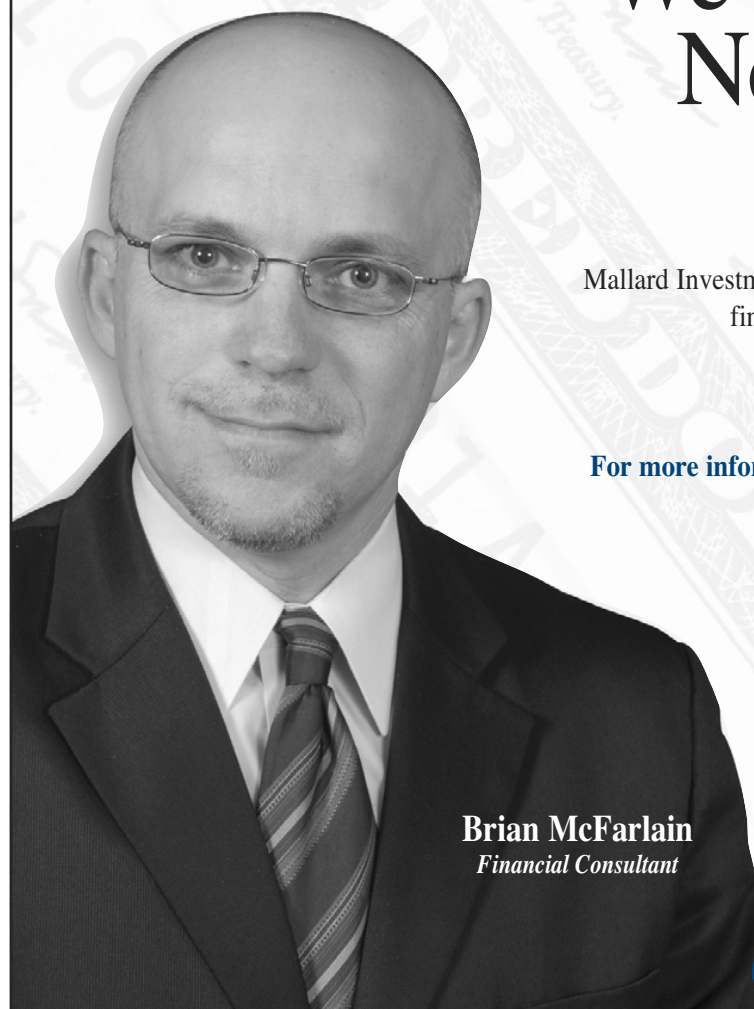
