Jury considers rollback on tax collection

The Cameron Parish Police Jury's agenda meeting, originally scheduled for Tuesday afternoon, was moved to Wednesday afternoon to accommodate the schedule of a member.

At press time, the Jury planned to discuss setting the tax levies for 2008, a temporary fire station for Cameron Fire District, and appropriations for the Creole recreation and fire districts.

Tax Assessor-elect Mona Kelley has projected a small increase in taxable property, so the Jury will be considering whether to take the automatic roll-back of millages prescribed by law. If they do so, millages will be rolled back in order to collect no more funds than were collected last year.

The only way a government entity can collect more

than originally voted is by advertising for a hearing to "roll back up" to a millage allowed by the original tax election.

This can only happen if property tax assessments have risen to a point that gives a greater return. The Police Jury has not advertised such a hearing, and therefore will likely take the roll-back.

The vote will be taken at the regular meeting set for Monday, June 2, at 5:30 p.m. The parishwide road, garbage, health unit, library, courthouse and jail maintenance, and general tax, as well as individual fire district taxes will be set at this time.

Also on Monday, bids are expected to be accepted for the first phase of the Jetty Fishing Pier and East Cameron Maintenance Barn repairs.

Authority is reactivated

The Louisiana Recovery Authority is reactivating a task force charged with identifying and addressing issues related to the continued recovery from 2005's Hurricane Rita.

Paul Rainwater, the LRA's executive director, said he hopes the task force will help identify and come up with ways to overcome any obstacles to recovery.

The state also wants input from local officials on recovery issues including housing, economic development and coastal protection. The task force is expected

to meet for the first time early next month.

Lake Charles Mayor Randy Roach will be its chairman.

Cameron Parish members of the committee are Ernie Broussard, executive director of planning for Cameron Parish; Tina Horn, Cameron Parish Administrator; and Stephanie Rodrigue, Cameron Parish School Superintendent.

Dr. Paul Coreil, LSU AgCenter vice chancellor, also is a member. He is a former Cameron Parish resident.

Fisheries meeting set June 12th

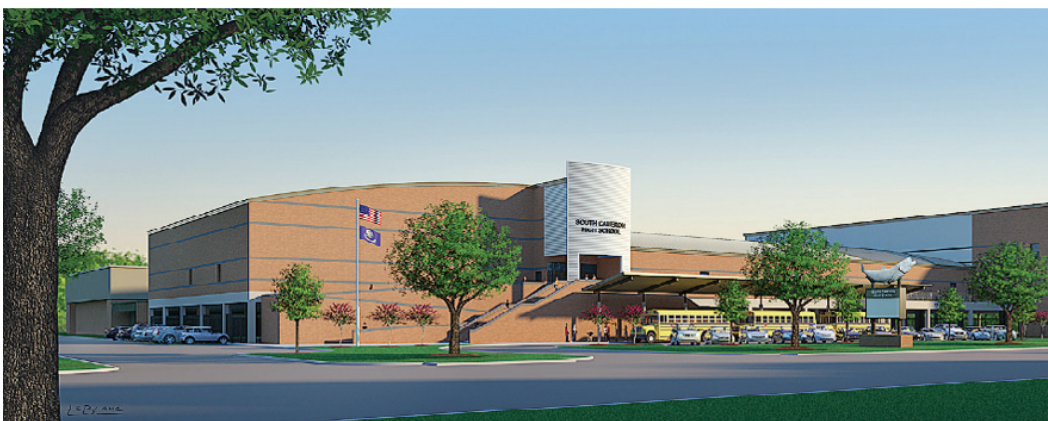

Five persons arrested in Hackberry brawl

An after-graduation party at the Hackberry Community Center ended in disarray last Friday, May 23, when five people were arrested on charges ranging from disorderly conduct to battery on a police officer.

Marine veterans attend reunion in Grand Chenier

The phrase "the few, the proud, the Marines" has a special meaning for a group of Korean War veterans who held their annual reunion in Grand Chenier last week. "Monk's Raiders," the 1st Marine Division Ammo Company led by Charles "Monk" Arndt, are getting older and fewer as the years go by, but the pride is still there.

"We aren't former Marines," said John Richard, host of this year's reunion, "we are just Marines. Like they say, once a Marine, always a Marine."

The men are also proud of their leader. Monk Arndt is the last survivor of the first U. S. offensive on Guadalcanal in World War II. Of the 24 men who set out on a largely humanitarian mission in August, 1942, only three survived, two of whom have since passed away. Monk is still going strong at 89, however.

"He's in better shape than all of us," says Richard. "He drove his motor home with a car behind it from Columbus, Miss."

Monk, nick-named for his agility in running up a coconut tree in Puerto Rico in 1939, was an intelligence

scout in WWII and saw much more action on Guadalcanal.

According to an article written by Tom McLeod, historian for the 1st Marine Division, he went on 22 solo intelligence gathering missions behind enemy lines. One mission lasted two weeks and covered 25 miles, during which Monk lived off the land, only taking with him one pound of raisins.

Being a small man, only 5'4" and 125 pounds, once saved his life, wrote McLeod, as he was able to crawl under a fallen tree to hide from an "entire Japanese company that ran over and past him."

Size meant nothing to the men of the ammo company to which he was attached during the Korean Conflict. At 31 he was considered an "old man" by the 15-19 year olds assigned to the company from 1950-53.

John Richard was one of those young men. Richard says, "If he told us to take a hill, even though we thought we would all die, we went; we all worshiped him so much."

They were called the "Frozen Few," because they had to endure temperatures as low as minus 53 degrees

She was preceded in death by her husband, Walter LeBleu; daughter, Betty M. LaBove; parents, Julian and Julie Granger; brothers, Clarivelle and Pierre Granger; grandson, Jody Nunez; and grandson-in-law, Wayne Guillot.

Her funeral service was held at 1 p.m. on Saturday, May 24, at the Johnson Funeral Home Chapel. Reverend Andrew Martin officiated. Burial was in Granger Cemetery.

DR. JOHN M. NORRIS JR.

Dr. John M. Norris Jr., 89, former McNeese member died Friday, May 23, 2008 in Lake Charles.

Dr. Norris was born in Natchitoches on Oct. 14, 1919, the first son of John M. Norris Sr. and Croquette Kelly Jones Norris. He was preceded in death by his parents; beloved son, John M. Norris III; brother, Crockett Kelly Norris; and son-in-law, Robert Travieso.

Dr. Norris graduated from St. Mary's Academy in Natchitoches in 1936. He received a B. A. degree from Louisiana State Normal College in 1939 and taught in Bastrop until he was drafted into the Army in 1941. He left military service in 1947 with a rank of lieutenant colonel in the infantry after serving in the U. S. and overseas in the China theatre. He received his master's degree from the University of Kansas in 1948. He pursued doctoral studies at the University of Texas from 1948 to 1952, serving as a graduate assistant and instructor in the Department of English at UT in Austin.

After being recalled to active duty during the Korean Conflict, he taught at Texas Western College (now, UT-El Paso) from 1954 to 1956. Dr. Norris was awarded his Ph.D. in English by the University of Texas in 1956.

He graduated from the Yale University School of Oriental Studies and completed advanced study in Mandarin Chinese at the Defense Language Institute at the Presidio in Monterey, Calif. Dr. Norris received

numerous military, academic and civic honors and awards throughout his career, including the Bronze Star and the Special Breast Order of the Yun Hui from the Chinese government. He was active in civic, academic and military affairs, retiring from the Army Reserve in 1972 as a full colonel of the Infantry.

Dr. Norris began his career at McNeese State University in 1956, when he came to the school as an assistant professor of English. Following his promotion to professor of English in 1960, he served as the head of the Department of Languages from 1961 to 1972. He was appointed dean of the School of Humanities in 1972 and served in that role until he retired in 1980.

He is survived by his wife, Hilda G. Norris of Lake Charles; three children, Cindy O'Brien and Terry Travieso of Houston and Pat Smith and husband Kenny Ray Smith of Lafayette; nine grandchildren; and three great-grandsons. He is also survived by his sister, Marie Norris Wise and husband Maj. Gen. Erbon Wise of Sulphur.

Dr. Norris was a member of Our Lady of Good Counsel Catholic Church.

His funeral was Tuesday, May 27, at Our Lady of Good Counsel Catholic Church. The Rev. Alan Trouille will officiate. Burial was in Consolata Cemetery under the direction of Johnson Funeral Home.

while establishing an ammo dump at a reservoir in northern Korea. The base was surrounded by 20 Chinese divisions. "Every one of us had frostbite. Some were evacuated, some were not, but all the survivors suffer from the effects of the elements today," Monk says.

McLeod's article in The Old Breed News, the division newsletter, quotes Monk as saying, "We would see Corsairs drop napalm bombs on the hills around us. After the explosion and ensuing fire, Chinese forces would rush into the area to warm themselves."

Monk was just as proud of his Marines as they are of him. "They could move ammo; they could move a mountain if they were turned loose. They are truly like brothers." He says Richard was the company "procurement specialist," who acquired necessary supplies and equipment. "The Army was pretty well supplied, but the Marines not so well. John got what we needed, legal or not"

Monk retired from the active military in 1964, and after 4 years in the reserves got his 30 year pin in 1968. He jokes that even though the men of Monk's Raiders call him the "old man," they are catching up quickly.

They thanked Jared LaBove, David Dimas, Ronald Dupuis, Doody LaBove, Cindy LaBove, and Carmen Dimas for helping with the food, which also included brisket, roast chicken, rice dressing "like Mama used to make" and all the trimmings.

June 16 deadline to apply for funds to raise houses

Louisiana homeowners have until June 16 to return forms to the state indicating they're interested in as much as \$60,000 for raising their houses.

The state of Louisiana said recently that it has mailed 109,000 survey packets to eligible Road Home applicants in the flood plain. The packets contain questionnaires about applicants' plans to raise their homes and forms to sign if they

want to participate in one or both of the elevation programs offered.

The state has \$1 billion to run the first program, a flat \$30,000 grant for most applicants as part of the larger Road Home rebuilding effort. Louisiana also got \$750 million from FEMA to run a second program as a reimbursement for as much as \$30,000 in additional elevation costs.

Returning the forms doesn't guarantee a grant and doesn't obligate the homeowner to elevate, but the state said it needed a clear

gauge of applicants' interest in the programs and how much money will be needed.

"Elevation is the cornerstone to rebuilding our homes safer and stronger," said Paul Rainwater, the Louisiana Recovery Authority executive director.

But the elevation programs haven't always been the state's focus -- the Road Home froze all elevation payments for more than a year because of a budget crunch -- and some applicants who say they're still waiting for the mail packets are worried about the new deadline.

"I have stopped all work on my home because I can't go any further until I get the elevation money to raise my house," said Debra Turner, a Road Home applicant from Lake Charles. "So, what do I do now? When do I get my letter? The deadline is June 16? I can't understand what is going on with the Road Home program."

Ghislaine Hegarty, who wants to rebuild her Lakeview home of 55 years, also is still waiting. She said program officials told her to wait another week for the packet to arrive in the mail, which would give her about two weeks to respond.

Any Road Home applicant

who thinks he or she is eligible for elevation assistance and hasn't yet received the documents should call the state's Elevation Technical Assistance toll-free hotline at 1 (877) 234-1513, officials said.

The first Road Home elevation grant program pays \$30,000 for stick-built homes and \$20,000 for mobile homes. Recipients must agree to use the money to raise their homes above the level set in local or base flood elevation standards.

But many applicants in the flood plain are unlikely to select the grant if they are selling their home, repairing a home that is already elevated or can't afford additional out-of-pocket costs to raise the house.

The second pot of elevation money comes from the Federal Emergency Management Agency's Hazard Mitigation Grant Program, or HMGP. It is a reimbursement program, with payments available after work is completed.

The state expects 22,000 homeowners to select that option. Signing the Elevation Incentive Form or the HMGP Award Form to show interest in landing assistance will not compromise anyone's right to appeal the rest of a Road Home grant, said Christina Stephens, spokeswoman for the state agencies overseeing Road Home.

Language in another part of the packet had raised concerns that participating in elevation programs would nullify any pending Road Home appeals. A portion of the agreement that participants eventually must sign includes an acknowledgment that all Road Home appeals "have concluded."

The state said that was only intended to ensure that elevation grants are paid after all appeals are complete, to make sure nobody gets more than the maximum \$150,000.

Louis LaCour Jr., an appellate lawyer and Road Home applicant, called the state's argument for the language "foolish" and said it must be changed. But he said that shouldn't be an impediment to people signing the preliminary forms to meet the June 16 deadline.

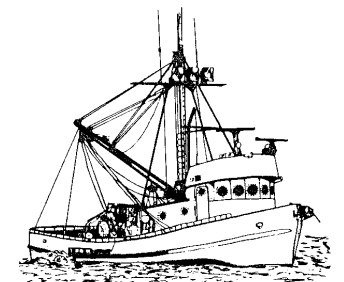

RESOLUTION OF CAMERON PARISH SCHOOL BOARD REGARDING EMPLOYMENT OF SPECIAL COUNSEL WHEREAS, Louisiana Revised Statutes 42:263 authorizes the retention of special counsel by any school board upon a statement of reasons why such counsel is necessary and upon the approval by the Attorney General; and

WHEREAS, the Cameron Parish School Board has employed the law firm Hammonds & Sills since 2002 as its special counsel with experience, training, and expertise in school law issues including, but not limited to, special education, school personnel matters, public bid law and general school board policy matters involving compliance with the federal and state laws and regulations, including due process hearings, tenure hearings, misconduct investigations and the handling of administrative hearings and litigation in state and federal courts; and

WHEREAS, through its representation of the Cameron Parish School Board and various school boards throughout the State of Louisiana, the law firm of Hammonds & Sills of Baton Rouge and Monroe, Louisiana, has special experience, training and expertise in those issues of school law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT DULY RESOLVED by the Cameron Parish School Board in regular session duly convened:

Section I - This School Board does hereby renew its employment of the law firm of Hammonds & Sills of Baton Rouge and Monroe, Louisiana as special counsel with training, experience and expertise in school law issues including, but not limited to, special education, school personnel matters, public bid law and general policy matters to include administrative hearings and litigation with respect thereto for the purpose of advising, consulting with, and representing this School Board in connection with such legal matters involving the school system.

Section II - Said law firm shall be paid for their services at hourly rates equal to the class=Section2> maximum hourly fee schedule for special counsel published by the Attorney General of the State of Louisiana in effect at the time of the services subject to a maximum hourly rate of \$150.00 and except that the paralegal rate shall be \$75.00 per hour and to be reimbursed for out-of-pocket expenses for long distance telephone calls, document duplication, expert witness fees, court reporter fees, printing costs, travel expenses and other expenses as a result of the legal services to and for this School Board.

Section III - Said law firm shall keep itemized time records for presentation to the Superintendent with respect to services rendered at said hourly rates and the expenses incurred, and the Superintendent is hereby authorized and directed to pay same upon submission and receipt thereof.

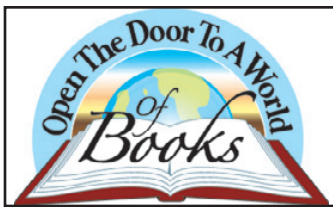
