# Audrey memorial to be considered here

Topics ranging from property assessments to cats were discussed at Tuesday's regular Police Jury meeting. Jurors also heard a request for a Hurricane Audrey Memorial.

Part-time Oak Grove resident Dean Rome spoke to the jury on the subject of Hurricane Audrey, citing a recent Victoria, Tex. news article "blaming the people of Cameron Parish for not heeding warnings, even though the Weather Service had lost the storm and was 15-16 hours behind in their predictions." He said 150 or more victims were never recovered, and the marshes south of the Intracoastal Canal are, in effect, a burial ground.

Rome asked the jury to consider promoting a national or local memorial to the victims of Hurricane Audrey, perhaps a large granite cross near the Big Burn. He said, "There is no marker for those people, and I think we should have one."

Parish Administrator Tina Horn noted that the 50th anniversary of the storm is only three years away, and jurors agreed it would be a good target date for such a project.

J. W. Cross, also of Oak Grove, asked the jury to amend the parish animal control ordinance to include cats. He said a large population of wild cats are getting under trailers, tearing out insulation, having kittens, and getting into trash at the trailer park he lives in.

Animal Control Officer Joseph Dyson reported that the feral cat population is out of control in a number of areas around the parish.

Juror Scott Trahan said the only recourse available to homeowners under the present ordinance is to trap the cats themselves and bring them to the pound in Cameron. Cross said this is a hardship for elderly people who are at risk for tripping over the cats and who may not have transportation.

The District Attorney was asked to bring a proposal for amending the ordinance to next month's meeting.

A lively discussion of the new property assessments which were recently mailed out by Tax Assessor Bobby Conner resulted in a decision to ask Conner to attend the jury's agenda meeting July 26 to explain the assessment process.

Juror Darryl Farque said

he was tired of getting phone calls and wanted to know if there was anything the jury could do about it. He said a representative from the Assessor's office will be at the town meeting he has scheduled for July 12 in Grand Lake.

Many people's property valuations went up in the recent parishwide re-assessment. Juror Charles Precht noted that the action was state mandated and statewide. He said the Assessor uses formulas set down by the state to arrive at property values, and anyone may register a protest of their valuation with the Assessor's office.

### OTHER ACTIONS

The jury appropriated an additional \$20,000 to a pilot road project in Grand Lake, adding Parish Road 417 (Miguel St.) to the existing PR 4124 (Basile Daigle Rd.) project. The contract was then awarded to Asphalt Associates.

Jurors also appropriated \$4400 for Recreation District #5, Grand Lake, to replace a broken air conditioning unit, at the request of jurors Precht and Farque.

Juror James Doxey asked for permission to hire a replacement for a Cameron road and

bridge crewman who had quit. Permission was given on a vote of 5-2, with Scott Trahan and Farque voting nay.

The Festivals and Fairs ordinance was amended to include the Cameron Fishing Rodeo, to be held at the Jetty Fishing Pier August 7.

Michelle Thompson Mudd of Cameron was crowned Mrs. Louisiana America at the state pageant held in Lafayette in May.

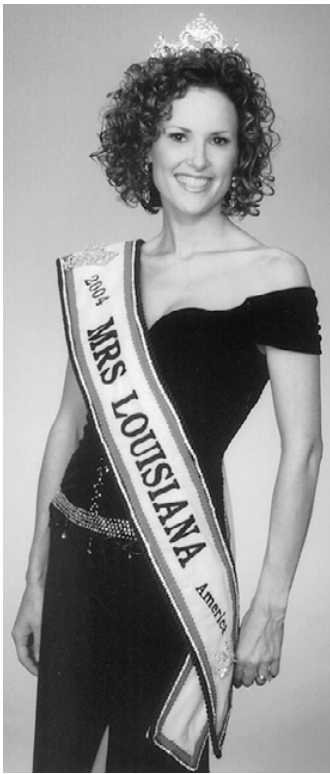
Mrs. Mudd is married to Chad Mudd of Cameron and they have twin daughters, Ava and Alivia, 2 1/2 years old.

ed out in local stores and banks.

The group has been instrumental in securing a post office for the area, publishing a directory of services for Cameron Parish and mailing it to all households in the parish. The group has worked with the local police jury on securing business for the area and for the parish property in Grand Lake (80 acres), establishing and reestablishing the rural health clinic in our area, working on road projects with the state and police jury, and the group has secured a cemetery for the area. A web page is being designed for the area at the present time. The community group has worked on community beautification projects.

Last November the Action Alliance secured a "Team City" status for the Grand Lake-Sweet Lake area.

# Creole folks get fire insurance reduction

Effective July 12, the residents of the Creole Fire District, will begin reaping the benefits of their labor. About 3 years ago the Creole Fire Dept. lost their fire protection rating.

The community then joined together to improve their fire department. Many new volunteers joined the department, and a new fire chief, Jude Primeaux was elected by the members. A Bingo was organized by The Creole KC's and Fire Dept. members to raise money for new equipment.

Over the past 3 years volunteers and members of the community gave hundreds of hours of their time bringing

the Creole Fire Dept. up to standard. The Cameron and Grand Chenier Fire Departments joined in helping Creole improve their fire protection.

Oscar Reyes with The Cameron Fire Dept. was instrumental with the continuous assistance and guidance he gave to the Creole Fire Dept. members. Juror Scott Trahan helped secure funds the district desperately needed.

The Cameron Parish OEP dedicated 8 new breathing apparatus (SCBA) to the Creole Fire Dept., which were very needed. The Creole water district's improvements and willingness to work with the

fire department were key to the districts successful rating.

Some of the accomplishments over the past 3 years for the department were: adding a new substation to cover the western end of the district. Increasing the number of pumpers from 2 to 3, and adding 2 service trucks to their fleet.

Fire officials begin keeping extensive records of fires and training required by PIAL. The department went from no working SCBA's to having their entire fleet fully equipped with almost all required equipment.

Department training was implemented for members and dry hydrants were placed

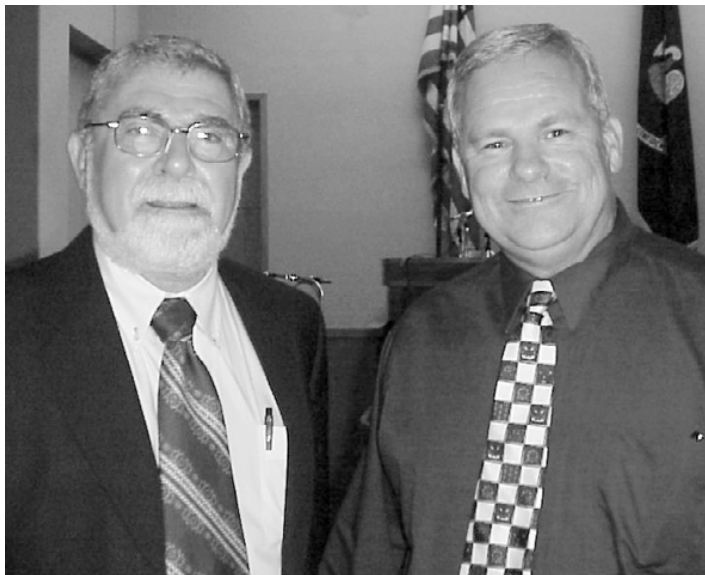
in key areas of the district to increase fire flow where needed. Creole Fire Dist. also hired Tom Cassisa as a Fire Rating consultant. Mr. Cassisa was instrumental in setting up the road map for the district to follow.

It is important for the residents of the Creole Fire District to remember that the department is made up of volunteers. More dedicated volunteers are needed as well as continued support of the community, to sustain the new fire rating of a Protection Class 5.

Next meeting is set for July 15, new volunteers wishing to join are welcome to attend and sign up.

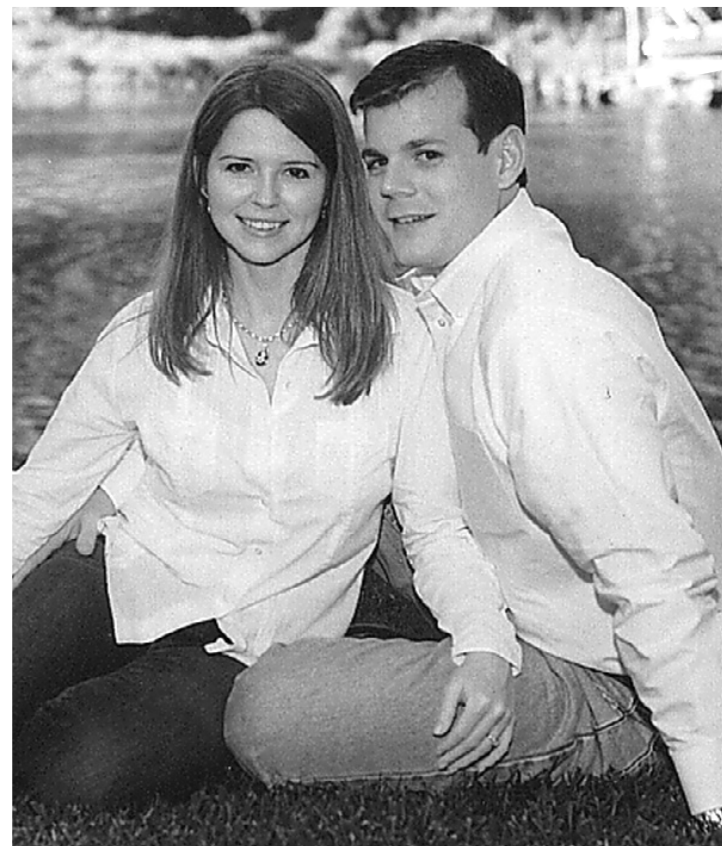
