Back to school meetings to be held around parish

Parents who will have children attending Cameron Parish schools this fall need to check a calendar of meetings which they need to attend to prepare for the start of schools on Aug. 17.

Meetings will be held at 9 a.m., Wednesday, Aug. 2 at Hackberry High School and at Grand Lake High School on Thursday, Aug. 3 for parents of students attending those schools who have a residency change, questions about residence change or will be new students at either school.

Also parents of students who will be attending Cameron Elementary, South Cameron Elementary, South Cameron High and Johnson

Bayou are required to attend a meeting at Grand Lake or Johnson Bayou high schools. (See the advertisement elsewhere in this issue of the Pilot for the schedule of these meetings.)

A list of information that the parents must provide at both sets of meetings may also be found in the ad.

Parents of new students who do not have copies of their birth certificates or Social Security cards should proceed to secure them now.

Grand Lake, Hackberry and Johnson Bayou students will attend schools at their respective school sites.

Students attending South Cameron High, South

Cameron Elementary and Cameron Elementary, whose schools were destroyed by the hurricane, will attend school in portable buildings on the South Cameron High campus located at Oak Grove.

The Cameron Parish school system is also welcoming displaced students from school systems other than Cameron who have also been affected by Hurricane Rita or Katrina.

Library is back!

The Cameron Parish Main Library in Cameron was destroyed by Hurricane Rita last September but the Library has now returned to the town of Cameron.

Parish Librarian Charlotte Troclair announced that the Cameron Bookmobile has been set up at 469 Marshall Street next to the old post office site.

She said that a grand reopening and open house will be held Friday, July 21 from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.

The hours of operation are 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday thru Thursday and 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on Friday.

The new facilities are a smaller version of what the library had prior to Hurricane Rita but many of the former services will be available.

The library will be able to provide color and black and white copy and fax services as well as wireless Internet to the patrons who utilize the Bookmobile.

Patrons are encouraged to

bring their personal wireless laptops to access the Internet during and after hours.

The Library also offers DVDs, videos, audios, magazines, newspapers, as well as books.

The Grand Lake and Hackberry Branches also are in operation and Johnson Bayou will be back in the near future.

Plans for a Grand Chenier branch are now on hold as the building being remodeled to serve as the branch was destroyed.

Ironically, the Cameron Parish Library was the product of another hurricane-- Audrey in 1957.

Following that storm, the Lake Charles and Louisiana Jaycees decided they wanted to help the parish and raised funds to build the library next

to the Cameron Elementary School.

The Louisiana State Library provided books and equipment for the library and financed a year's demonstration.

At the end of the year, Cameron Parish voters approved a tax to continue the operation of the library.

In recent years, the Library building had become too small to adequately serve the parish. Property was purchased next to the Cameron Post Office with the intention of building a larger library at a future date.

Due to some recent large grants to the Library by several organizations, that larger facility now may be realized, like the first library, as the aftermath of another hurricane.

Cameron recovery discussed at meet

"The largest rebuilding effort in American history," Louisiana's recovery from the twin disasters of hurricanes Katrina and Rita, is the task of the Louisiana Recovery Authority. The LRA has formed a Southwest Louisiana subcommittee to focus on the recovery from Hurricane Rita in the western part of the state. The subcommittee held its first meeting last Wednesday in the Cameron Courthouse.

Laura Leach, who chairs the subcommittee, says "the damages and losses sustained by so many from Rita have been enormous," but she foresees a complete recovery for SWLA through the work of the LRA.

LRA Board member Tom Henning, of Lake Charles, sees the formation of the subcommittee as a positive step for the area - a formalized way for the LRA as a whole to be kept informed about what is happening in SWLA.

Members of the subcommittee include Debbie Alexander, Dr. Paul Coreil, Lake Charles Mayor Randy Roach, Vermillion Parish OEP Vice-president Tim Creswell, SWLA Partnership Director George Swift, and Cameron Parish Planning and Development Director Ernie Broussard.

On Wednesday, Broussard presented the committee with

an outline and the first visual images of Cameron Parish's recovery plan.

Key to Cameron's recovery effort will be the offer by Cheniere Energy to prepay taxes on its LNG facilities, which would not become due for 10 years after operations begin. Some \$30 million dollars which will become available to the parish early through this plan will be used to leverage up to \$150 million in total funding, through grants and matching funds.

Cheniere's Creole Trail LNG terminal has just received its FERC permit and construction has begun north of the Cameron Ferry. The Sabine Pass terminal is well under way. Each terminal takes about three years to complete.

The Planning Department is about to hire a firm to complete the final planning. Of the firms that responded to a lengthy request for proposals, the field has been narrowed to two. A choice will be made by the first of August. The firm chosen will have 12 to 18 months to fund the funding needed for the recovery. Broussard said they will get paid from that funding.

The first task for the recovery firm will be to apply for a Community Development Block Grant by the Aug. 31 deadline. Other sources will be identified as time goes on.

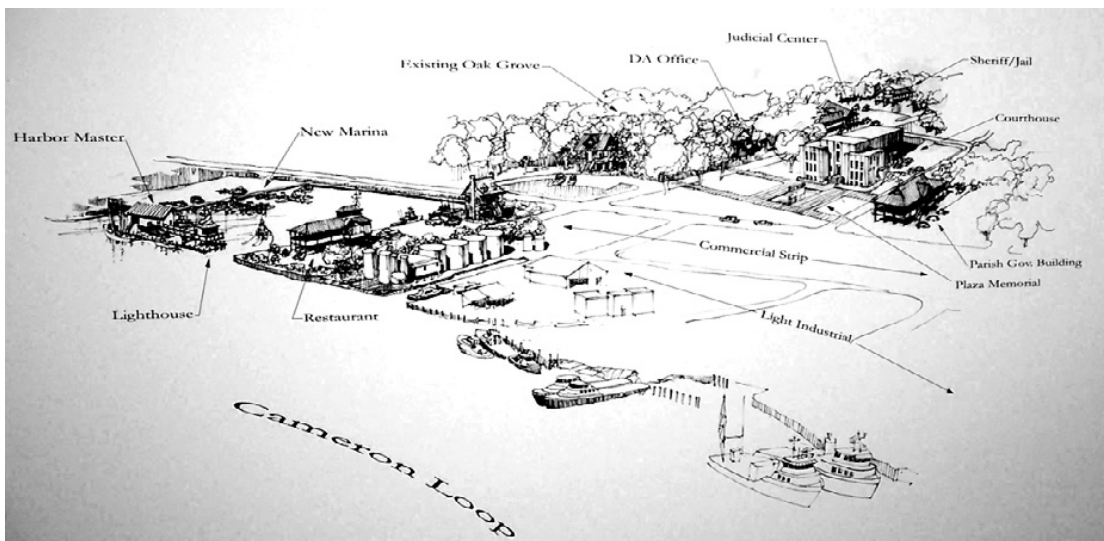

Texan dies in accident Parish elections to be held Sept. 30

A Hampshire, Texas man died in a one-vehicle accident last week on Highway 27, between Cameron and Creole. Sometime after midnight on the July 13, 40 year old Robert M. Perry, Jr.'s 1996 Ford Escort left the eastbound lane of the highway, hitting the gravel shoulder. He apparently tried to correct and went into a slide, then flipped several times. He was ejected into the westbound lane.

Perry was declared dead at the scene and transported to the Calcasieu Parish Coroner's office.

Parish elections to be held Sept. 30

The first Cameron parish-wide election since Hurricane Rita will be held Saturday, Sept. 30 and the Parish Registrar of Voters is getting ready.

Despite the devastation of lower Cameron Parish by the storm, Suzanne Sturlese, registrar, says she expects all of the parish precincts to be in operation, many in temporary buildings.

Elections set for Sept. 30 include a Lower Cameron Hospital maintenance tax and a vote on the Ward 2 Justice of the Peace post. Sally Domingue has resigned from that post causing a special election. The district includes portions of the Creole and Grand Chenier areas.

There will also be a special statewide election to fill a vacancy for the Louisiana Commissioner of Insurance.

Anyone registered in Cameron parish who was displaced by Hurricane Rita is still eligible to vote in the parish if they have not registered to vote in another parish or state.

These persons may vote in three ways:

*Absentee by mail ballot request.

*Early voting to be done the week before the election.

*In person at their polling place the day of the election.

To check your current registration status and to find out what is needed for a ballot request, please contact the Registrar's office 905-1167.

To vote by mail, it is

important to send a written request for a ballot. This can be done now and should be done as early as possible to make sure the ballot is received.

The mailing address is: Registrar of Voters, P. O. Box 1, Cameron, La. 70631.

The Registrar's office is located in a temporary building 1.5 miles north of Boone's Corner at Grand Lake. It is located next to the Police Jury's temporary office.

Mrs. Sturlese said she cannot move back to the Cameron Courthouse until repairs are made to her office which was in the basement of the courthouse and was flooded.

Some of the other parish offices which were located on the first and second floors of the courthouse have been able to move back as their offices were not damaged.

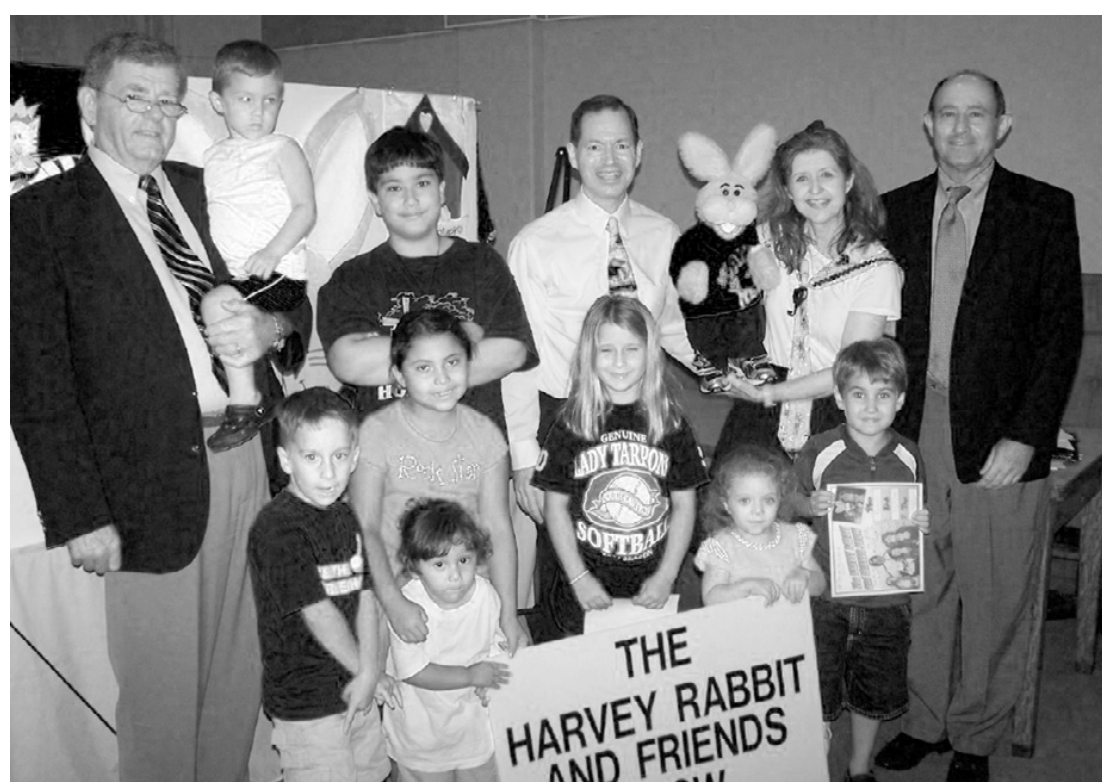

Hazardous waste collection

Officials from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency urge residents in Cameron Parish to bring their flood-damaged household hazardous wastes to the collection center in Cameron Parish during its final week of operation.

If Hurricane Rita storm victims cannot take their items to the collection center, they are encouraged to place household hazardous materials on their curbside by Thursday, July 20.

Since the collection center was established in October 2005, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) and parish officials have collected over two million pounds of household hazardous waste in the west branch area. DEQ will still be available, if needed, to help the parishes with hazardous materials collection after the center closes.

Household hazardous waste approved items are:

- Automotive Products

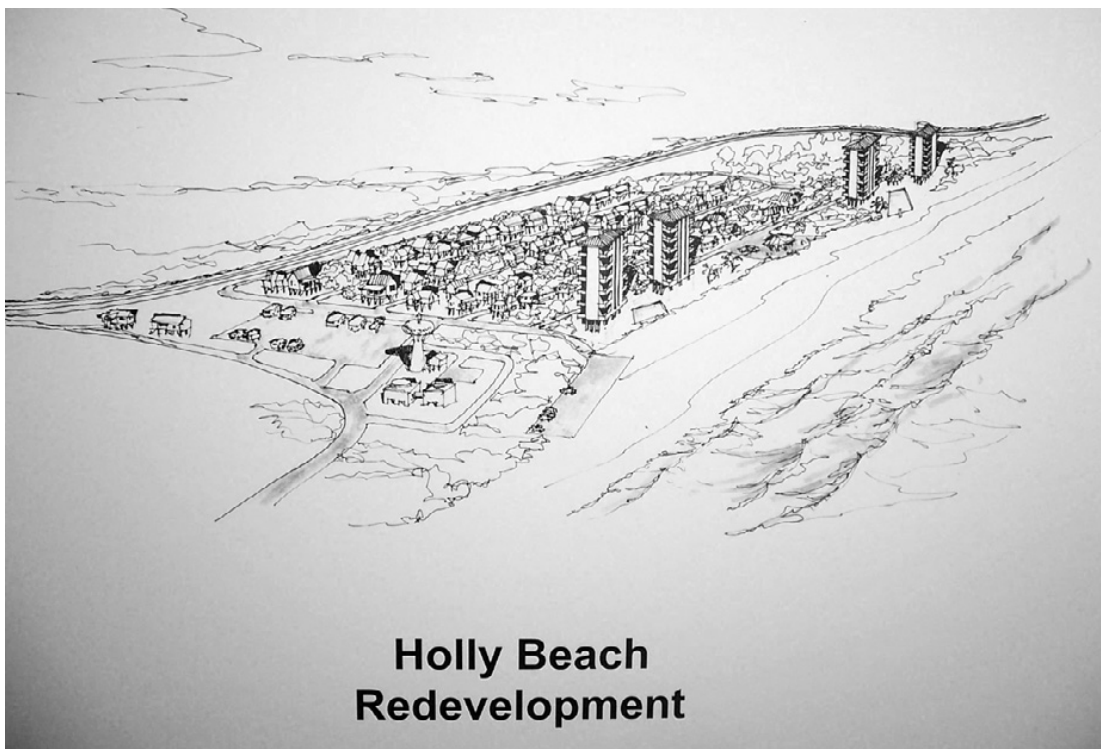

Broussard outlined six projects being given highest priority by the Cameron recovery office. They are:

- Cameron Square Judicial Center
- Chenier House model home demonstration
- Ice House Project - Cameron Loop
- EOC Command Centers - Hackberry and Grand Lake
- Cameron Loop Dredging
- Holly Beach Re-development Plan

Broussard called the Cameron Loop and Monkey Island some of the parish's biggest assets. The 860 acres on the island cannot be utilized without the dredging of the loop to allow deeper draft vessels to operate. Local taxes paid to have the loop dredged recently to a depth of 25 feet, but silt from Rita's storm surge have reduced clearance to 12-18 feet, preventing many offshore oil service vessels from docking.

Vermillion Parish LRA member Tim Creswell pointed out that there are only two deep water oil ports on the Louisiana Coast - Cameron and Fourchon. He said it is essential that Cameron get its capacity back, since operators are looking to have a backup location for future storms.

As Broussard presented a design for Monkey Island that included two bridges re-routing Hwy 27/82 across the island and a deep water port equal in size of the Lake Charles Port, he acknowledged the "we have to resolve our family discussion between the Lake Charles and West Cameron Ports." He expressed confidence that "as families do, at the end of the day they will do the right thing."

Holly Beach and tourism will be another factor in Cameron's recovery, said Broussard. Before the storm, 300 thousand people visited Cameron Parish each year. Rebuilding Holly Beach and the rest of the Creole Nature Trail will bring them back to "visit, spend money, buy a t-shirt and maybe shoot something (in season)," he said.

Other features of the Cameron recovery still to be addressed are coastal restoration, wildlife management, housing and land use controls.

A series of studies will be done for Cameron, Creole, Hackberry, Johnson Bayou, and Grand Lake to plan future recovery and growth. Broussard said zoning is a bad word in Cameron, but some form of land use con-

Housing will be addressed through a variety of means, including the LRA's Road Home plan.

Lake Charles Mayor Randy Roach used one of Broussard's satellite maps to show that "God doesn't see the line between Calcasieu and Cameron. He sees a community that historically has lived and worked together." Roach said that Calcasieu's recovery is linked to the recovery in Cameron and asked, "How on earth can the federal government deny Cameron Parish's request for 100% (on debris removal) and make the state dip into its pockets?"

Dr. Paul Coreil, of the LSU Ag Service and formerly of Cameron Parish, pointed out to the committee that Shrimpers in south Louisiana will not be able to come back without assistance. He said the US already imports 85% of its shrimp, and the other 15% could go overseas also without help. Debbie Alexander told the group that the culture and the industry does not have all the documentation that others do, and adjustments would have to be made.

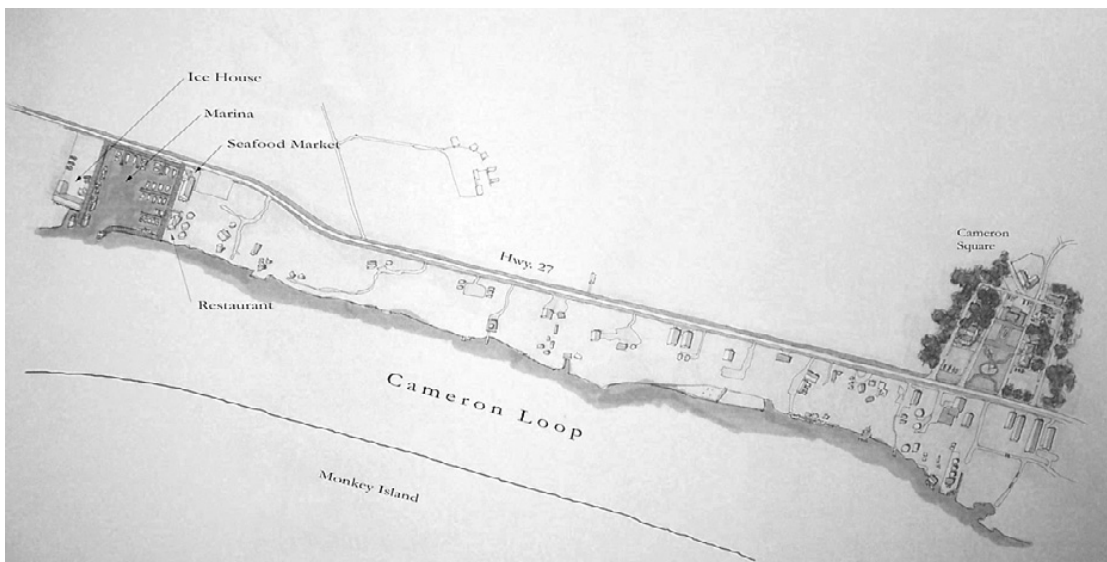

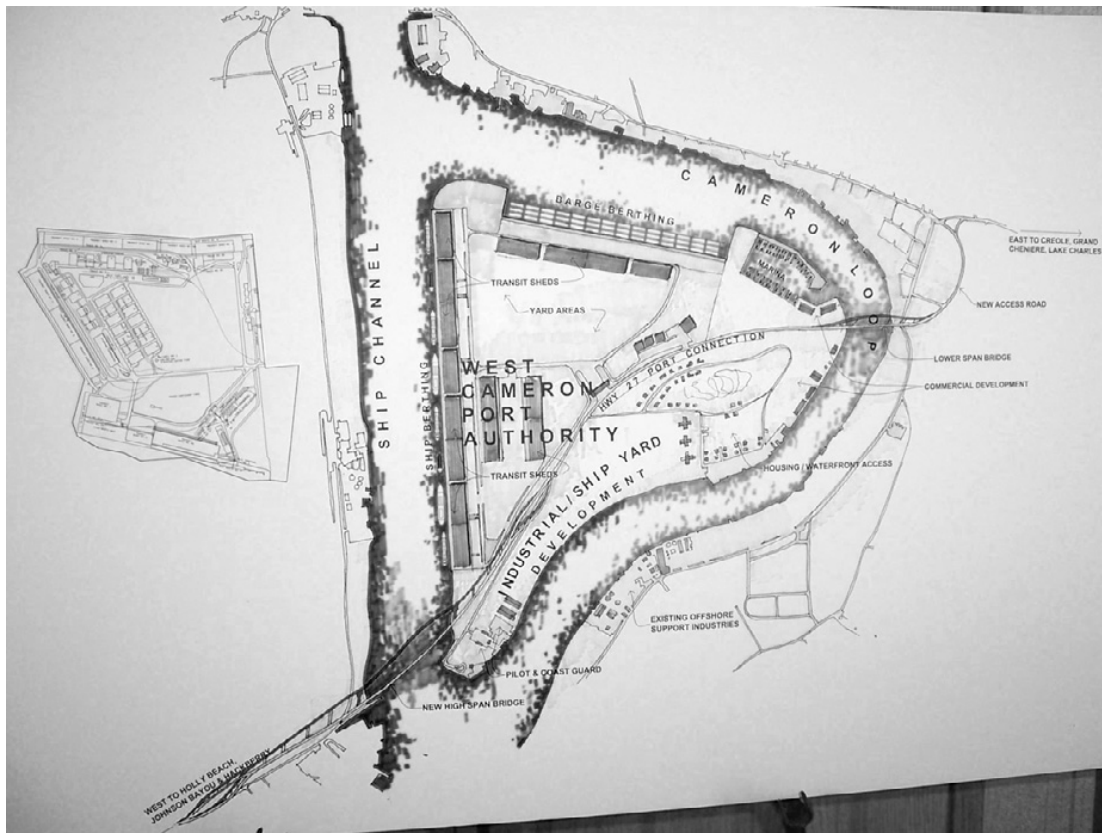

Road Home program to help homeowners rebuild

At last week's LRA meeting in Cameron, staff member Miles Bruder gave a report on the progress of The Road Home, the LRA's ambitious plan to spend up to \$9.25 million in reinvestment in housing in Louisiana.

To date more than 70,000 people have signed up for the plan state-wide, but another 20,000 potentially eligible homeowners have not contacted the LRA. Contact is easy, Bruder said. All you have to do is call 1-888-ROAD2LA or log on to www.louisianarebuilds.info.

Bruder said many people

have become so disillusioned by the recovery process that they don't want to get into another program, but he hopes the establishment of local offices by the end of August will make it easier for homeowners to sign up.

The Road Home is set up to provide up to \$150,000 (less insurance and FEMA payments) for homeowners to rebuild, repair, or relocate. When the offices are opened in Cameron Parish, appointments will be set up for those who have registered. Homeowners will need to bring documentation with them, including current contact information, photo ID and Social Security number, the deed to the house, FEMA payment letter, costs already incurred, insurance policies, claims, and payments, litigation information, mortgage and lien information, and any SBA loan information. The local offices will be able to help with collecting some of these items.

Help for renters is still being planned. It will likely take the form of incentives to developers to rebuild destroyed rental units.

DHH eases verification of citizenship

Officials with the Department of Health and Hospitals announced they have developed a process where Medicaid caseworkers will have direct access to the Vital Records Registry system to verify citizenship for Medicaid applicants and enrollees.

Upon request, Medicaid eligibility workers will be able to access the Vital Records database, maintained by the DHH Office of Public Health, to confirm that the enrollee or applicant indeed has a valid Louisiana birth certificate. Persons without a U.S. Passport or original Louisiana birth certificate should call their local Medicaid office, not Vital Records, to use the process.

 ment.

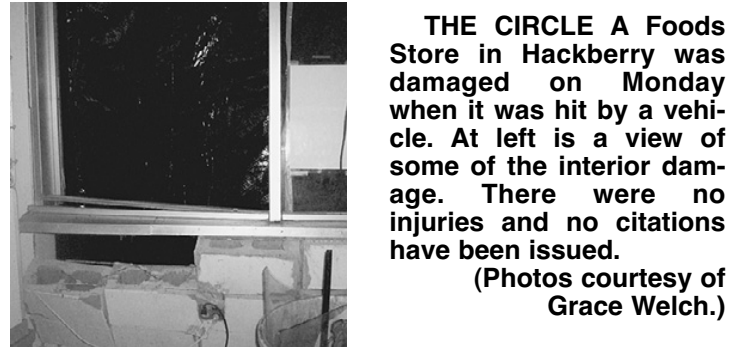
