

Hearing is set here on waste treatment unit

The Commissioner of Conservation will conduct a hearing at 8 p.m., Wednesday Jan. 14 in the Cameron Parish Police Jury Annex on the application of Environmental Partners, LLC, Lafayette concerning a proposed Cameron Parish project.

The applicant requests approval from the Office of Conservation to temporarily store and treat exploration and production waste (E&P Waste), specifically oil-base drilling waste (E&P Waste Type 02) by means of low temperature thermal desorption separation for oil and/or solids recovery reclamation and reuse. The facility is located at 501 Gulf Beach Road, Cameron.

The application is available for inspection by contacting Ms. Armanda Watson, Office of Conservation, Injection & Mining Division, Room 817 of the LaSalle Building, 617 North 3rd Street, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, or by visiting the Cameron Parish Police Jury in Cameron, or the Cameron Parish Library. Livestock barn to be upgraded, jury told

Plans for upgrading and repairing the parish barn where livestock shows are held were discussed at a meeting of the Cameron Parish Police Jury last week.

The barn is shared with the Mosquito Control Agency in the parish multi-purpose barn built in 1975 just east of the town of Cameron.

Jake Fontenot, parish 4-H agent, said the project will include replacing the sound system, buying tarps, improving lighting and sandblasting some livestock pens.

The entire project will cost

about \$32,000 of which the livestock committee has \$16,000 which it can spend on the project.

Jurors agree to buy tarps to help weatherize some events and to contribute \$5,000 for the upcoming livestock show.

Fontenot said the parish may be able to secure some state and national livestock shows when the improvements are completed.

Jurors also agreed to continue annual funding of Beachfront District 1 and 2 at \$15,000.

Frederick Schmidt was pioneer settler of Johnson Bayou area

Frederick George Schmidt was born in Dresden, Germany on Aug. 22, 1806, and very little is known about his early life. Apparently he became a sailor, probably as an apprentice, sailing out of the port of Bremen. It is believed he was on his 3rd voyage to Galveston, hauling cotton, when he decided to jump ship and become an American. He settled on Johnson's Bayou about 1839, or about the same time as his fellow German immigrant, Dr. Frederick Erbeling, settled there.

Many believe that Schmidt was the pioneer cotton planter and gin on the bayou, since his predecessors - the Griffiths, Johnsons, Barrows, Berwicks - were all cattlemen. Schmidt carried the German spelling of his surname until his death, but his wife and children refused it, anglicizing it to Smith.

Nevertheless his name remains all over the place as Smith Ridge, Smith Ridge Road and Smith Cemetery.

Schmidt chose the Smith Ridge, which it is about 8 miles long and as wide as a half-mile in places, to become the site of his cotton plantation and gin because of its rich alluvial soil. In 1842 he married a 15-year-old young lady, Caroline Matilda Beadle, who was an orphan born in Abbeville. They became the parents of 14 children. Matilda's origin is much disputed, the 1880 census noting that her father was born in Indiana and her

mother in Louisiana. It was not known though whether they were her adoptive parents or biological parents, and one source said she was raised by a lady named Sally Hutchins.

The early years of the Schmidt-Beadle marriage were marked by unbelievable hardships, but the bayou pioneers soon learned to improvise early or do without. They made their own lye soap, using ashes and tallow; tanned hides with tannic acid boiled from oak bark; and spun yarn from cotton and wool with their spinning wheels. None of the Smith children fought in the Confederate Army because the 6 oldest (except a son who died young) were all girls.

The Civil War did bring about many changes. Occasionally a blockade-runner carried cotton from the bayou through the blockade. Confederate cavalry were always nearby, either on patrol or rounding up wild cattle for the Sabine Pass garrison. And the Confederate troops and Union prisoners from the Battle of Calcasieu Pass passed in each direction through Johnson's Bayou. Two small Confederate steamboats, the Ace and Dime, hauled fresh water to Sabine Pass and loaded or unloaded troops. And throughout the war Frederick Schmidt raised and ginned 30 or 40 bales of cotton annually and ginned all the cotton of his neighbors.

The Civil War era residents of the bayou learned to improvise even more. They

Recently Mr. Delmus Hebert passed away. To him the Grand Lake/Sweetlake communities owe a debt of gratitude. Having been first a supervisor at the Cameron Parish School Board, Mr. Hebert then served as Grand Lake School principal for twelve and a half years.

In order to establish discipline and order at Grand Lake School, he had to make unpopular decisions and stand by them firmly-many times alone, but he did it! Because of this he was largely responsible for the fine school it has become.

My greatest admiration, respect, and gratitude came when our community's environmental problems began to surface. Once when he turned on the tap in the teachers' lounge, a yellow blob and then really brown water came out; he immediately ordered

the entire school on bottled water. He wouldn't allow the children to drink water he wouldn't drink himself.

We suspected the problems came from waste pits and injection wells located right next to the school. When it was learned a huge landfarm and injection well facility located right behind the school was only weeks away from completion, Mr. Hebert approved a note to be sent home with each student.

This note, entitled "What Is A Landfarm?" alerted the entire community and was the actual beginning of the Concerned Citizens Committee of Grand Lake/Sweetlake. The CCC was successful in shutting down the dump site and completely stopping the new landfarm facility.

Mr. Hebert is gone now, but his courage and strength have left our part of the world a better place.

Tony Cheramie was presented the Past Grand Knight plaque by Ivy Meaux, district deputy from Lake Charles, and commended for his work as council leader.

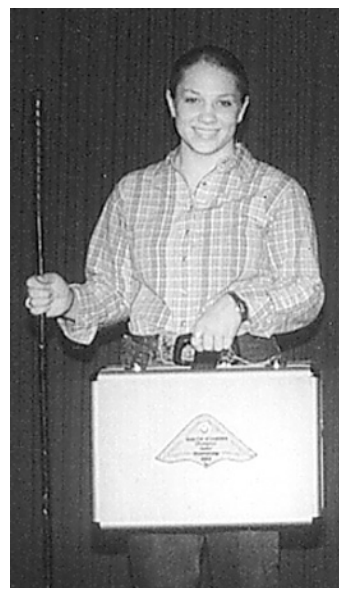
SWEETLAKE HD CLUB

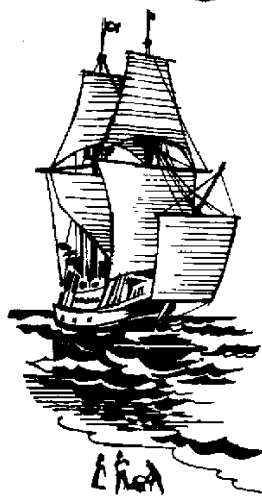

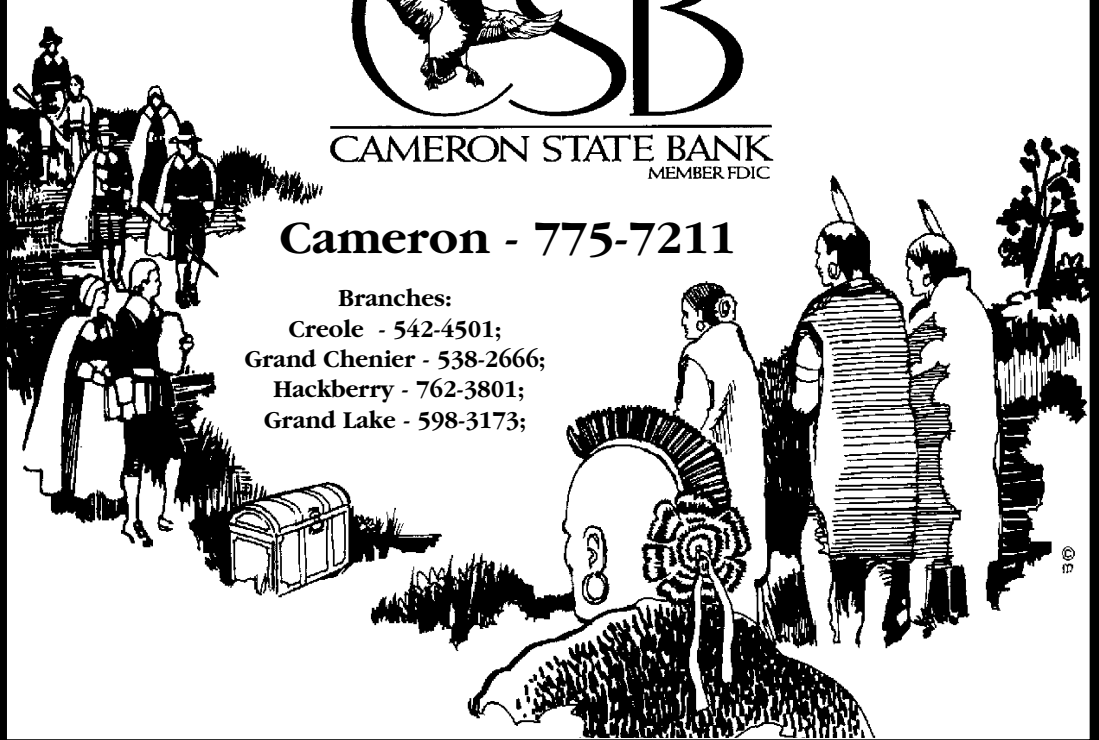

DUCK SPLIT TO END SUNDAY

The first of our duck season will come to an end on Sunday, Nov. 30. Duck hunting so far, has been up and down and I guess this past week was the worst. This colder front should bring more ducks down, if there's any to bring down. I realize we've been hunting with a low of 70 to 72 degrees at 5 a.m. each morning, but maybe this front will bring down a few more birds. The second split will start back December 13 and run through January 18.

I was telling my grandson on a hunt, after he asked me what were all the large birds flying, that it was water-turkeys, but they were not good to eat and illegal to shoot. We decided that if we could kill them, we could have had enough turkey for Thanksgiving to feed all Cameron Parish, as there are thousands that pass over the blinds every morning.

Here are some of the hunting dates to remember for the next few days.

Nov. 30 - Duck, coot, and goose season closes. Blue, snow and ross goose season will reopen from Dec. 1, thru Dec. 12. This is no bag or possession limit, unplugged guns may be used as well as electronic calls. Then all duck, coot, blues, snow and ross geese will reopen Dec. 13 for regular season again. Check your migratory game bird regulation orange pamphlet.

Remember, if you're going to shoot pintails, do it now, as the first 30 days is all you get for pintails. White fronted geese (specklebelly) ends Nov.

30 and starts back up Dec. 13. (All in west zone.)

Dove season closed last Sunday for the second split. It will reopen for the third split on Dec. 20 thru Jan. 5.

Deer season in Area 3 will close Nov 30 for still hunts. Muzzleloader is Dec. 1-5. Bow season runs thru Jan. 15. Either sex days for Cameron Parish is also over on Nov. 30.

There is still plenty of hunting in our area to keep hunters busy, rail, gallinule, rabbit, squirrel, snipe, quail, and nutria.

We as hunters have to keep busy. We can wait on ducks for 3 hours, deer 10 hours, and never look back. But if our wives are cooking our favorite game and we think it's time to eat, we want to know what's taking so long.

NEWS BRIEFS

The 2004 duck stamp will be the drake hooded merganser and female merganser, printed by Jeff Klinefelter.

The commercial fishing season for spotted sea trout in Louisiana waters will remain closed until Jan. 2, 2004, reopens and remain open through official sunset July 31, 2004, or until the quota is reached.

During open season, the commercial harvest is prohibited during the period from official sunset on Friday, through official sunrise on Mondays. No commercial harvest between 10 p.m. and 5 a.m. anytime.

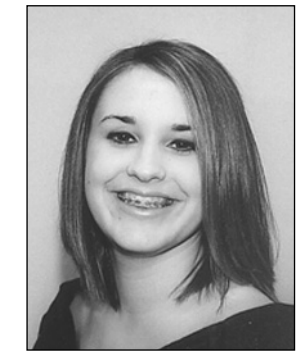

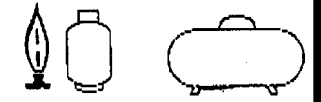

made buttons out of dried gourds or watermelon seeds; shoe soles out of rawhide or wood; needles out of fish bones; and combs sawed out of wood. They wove cloth on handlooms, which they sewed into shirts, dresses, trousers, and coats. Firewood was always in short supply, and settlers retrieved every piece that washed up on the beach; every tree floating through the lake, or brought logs from the burned-out sawmill at Sabine Pass.

The Schmidt-Smith progeny included Louisa, born Feb. 19, 1843; Lorne Jane, b. April 18, 1845; Emaline, b. Feb. 3, 1848; Ursula (the writer's grandmother), b. May 16, 1849; Earnest, died young; Sarah, b. May 18, 1855; Elizabeth, b. 1854; Emory, b. Mar. 11, 1856; Laura, b. Jan. 6, 1857; August, b. 1859; William, b. Jan. 18, 1861; Albert, b. Dec. 8, 1862; Otis, b. 1865; and Alonzo, b. Feb. 21, 1867.

Between Sept. 13, 1865 and Aug. 22, 1879, a series of hurricanes hit Johnson's Bayou in every odd year, although some were side effects of major storms that struck the Texas coast. Yet none compared to the worst of

Elizabeth married Jack Simon in Orange; Emory "Bud" Smith married Laura Peveto and died at Nederland, Texas in 1929; Laura married D. W. Sampson and died in Houston in 1931; August "Gus" Smith married Tassie Peveto and died on Cow Bayou, Orange Co., in 1928.

William married Caroline Labeth and died at Johnson's Bayou in 1904; Albert married Mattie Erbeling and died at Port Neches in 1931; Otis married Louella Peveto and died at Johnson's Bayou in 1893; and Alonzo married Sarah Rogers and died at Johnson's Bayou in 1894.

An unusual phenomenon occurred to Laura and Tassie Peveto Smith while they were still alive in 1936. Their half-brother, Michael Peveto, had fought at the Battle of San Jacinto, which freed Texas from Mexico, a century earlier in 1836. There was also an old saying on the bayou: "Don't talk about the Smiths to the Pevetos and Erbelings because they are all kin to each other."

There was also a giant Smith-Block reunion at Port Neches in June 1907, to honor Grandma Matilda Smith on her 80th birthday. There were present 186 people who were her direct descendants, and 4 steamboats had brought them to Block's Bayou from Orange, Sabine Pass, Johnson's Bayou, and Beaumont. Many photographs survive that were taken at that reunion. Caroline Matilda Smith died on Feb. 19, 1915, and she is buried beside her husband in Smith Cemetery on Smith Ridge Road.

In 1992 a 223-page, hard-back book, covering 8 generations of Smith family descendants, was published by Mrs. Ruth McKinley of Beaumont.
