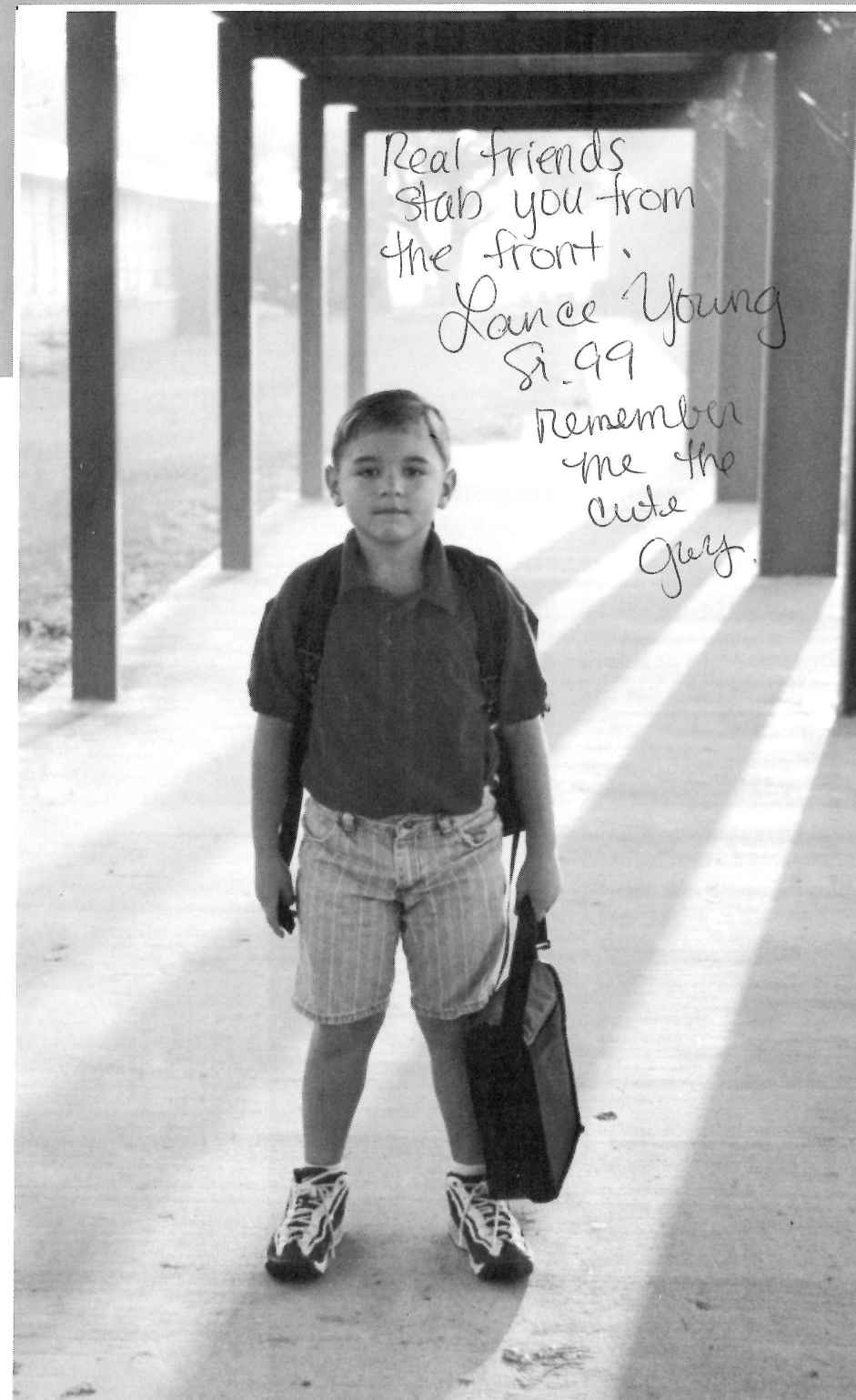

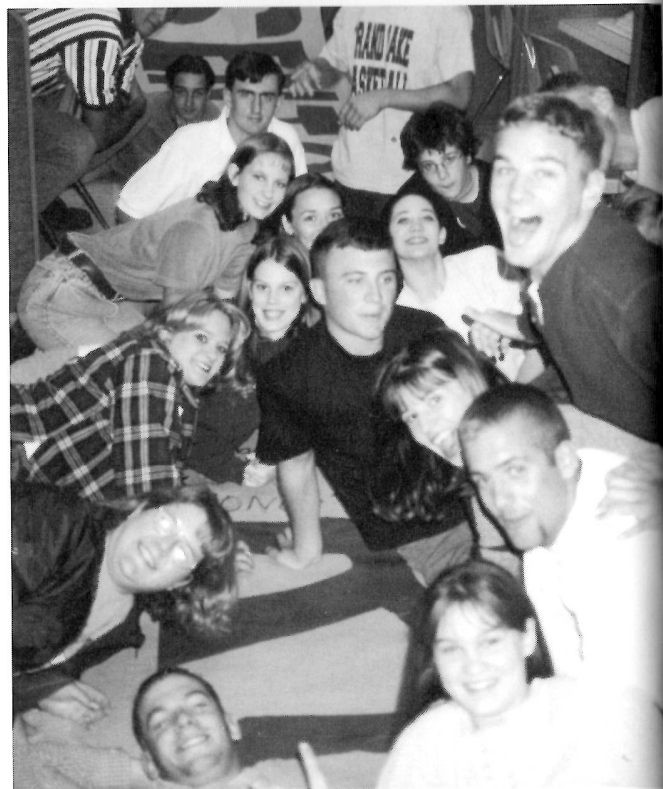
SENIORS VS. JUNIORS

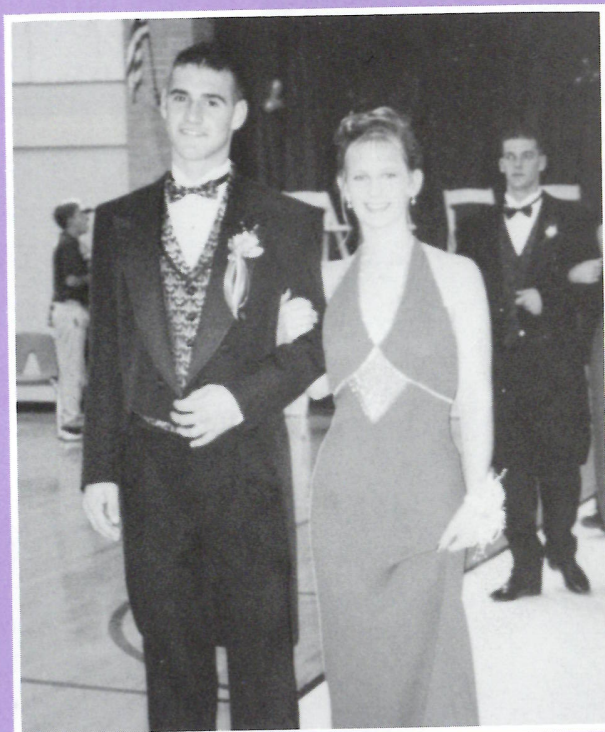

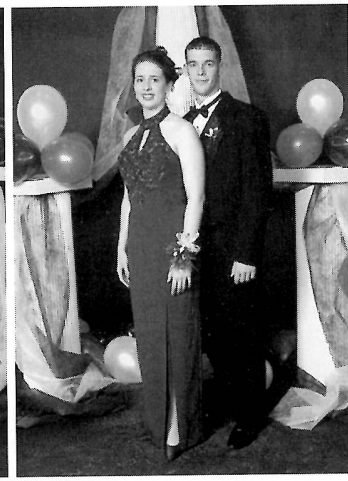

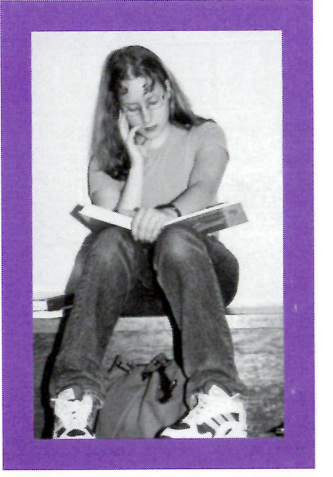

Two Points Away From Victory

The 1997 season for the McNeese football team was its greatest ever, as the Cowboys reached the national championship game for the first time.

The playoffs energized the fans of Southwest Louisiana. More than 7,000 of them, many from Grand Lake, made the trip to Chattanooga for the title game.

The Cowboys rebounded from a 3-8 season last year to capture a share of the Southland Football League title and earn a playoff birth after breezing through a 10-1 record in the regular season.

The first round match up was against Montana, who defeated the Cowboys in the 1994 playoffs. The Cowboys did

their job this time and won 19-14 on a last minute touchdown.

The Cowboys faced second-ranked Western Illinois in round two, where they pulled out a 14-12 victory.

McNeese faced the Delaware Blue Hens in the semifinals. The final score for that game was 23-12, and was won by a Shonz LaFrenz field goal

with 5 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter.

The Cowboys' Cinderella season ended 1 point too early as they fell 10-9 to Youngstown State in the National Finals.

The 1997 McNeese Cowboys restored a new pride in Southwest Louisiana that will for sure remain for many years to come.

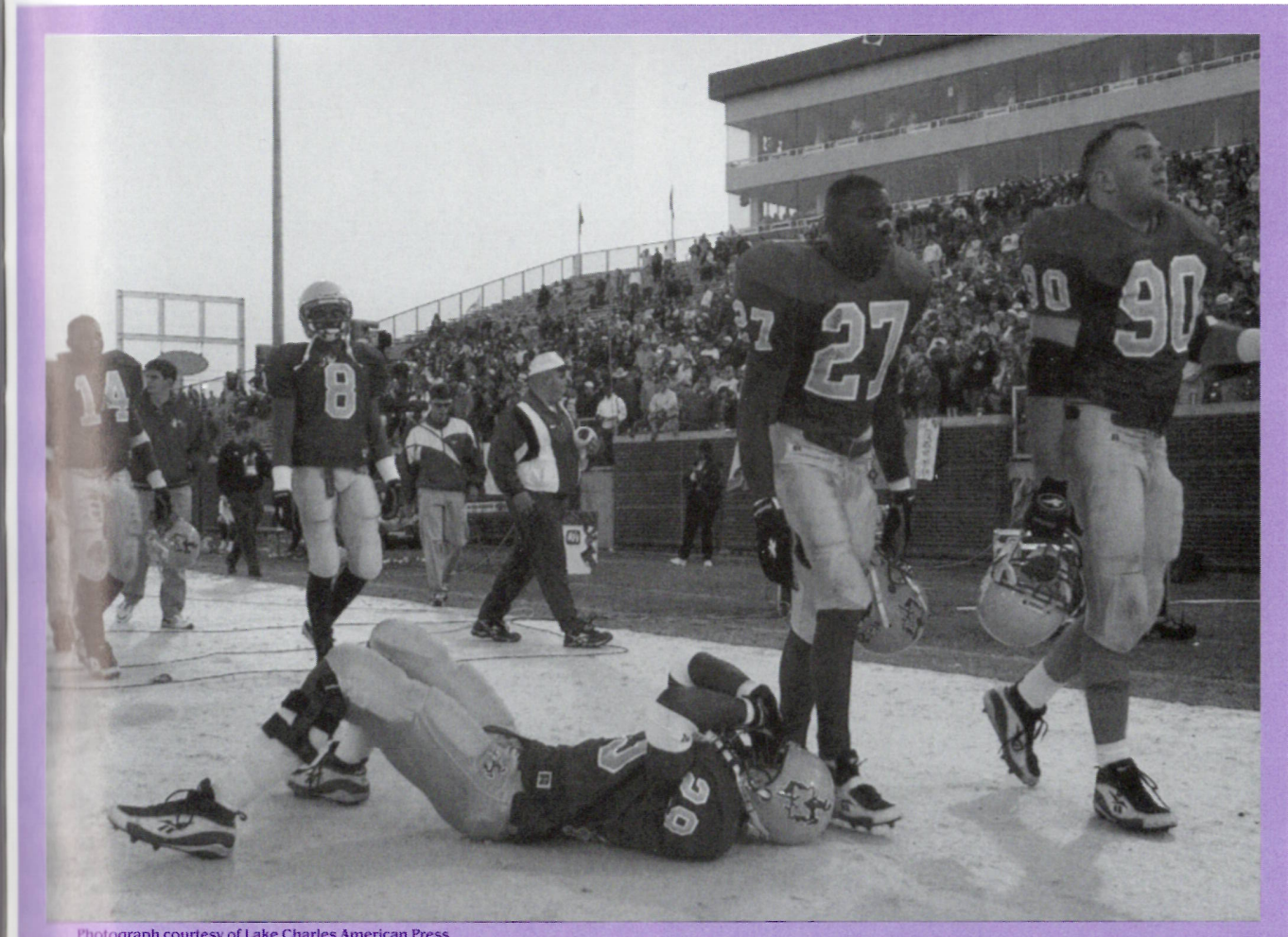

ELEMENTARY

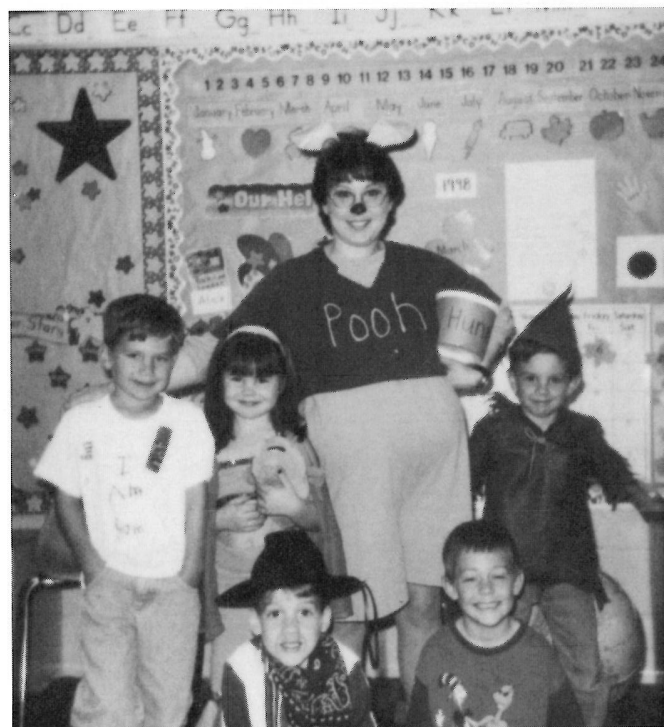
DAYS

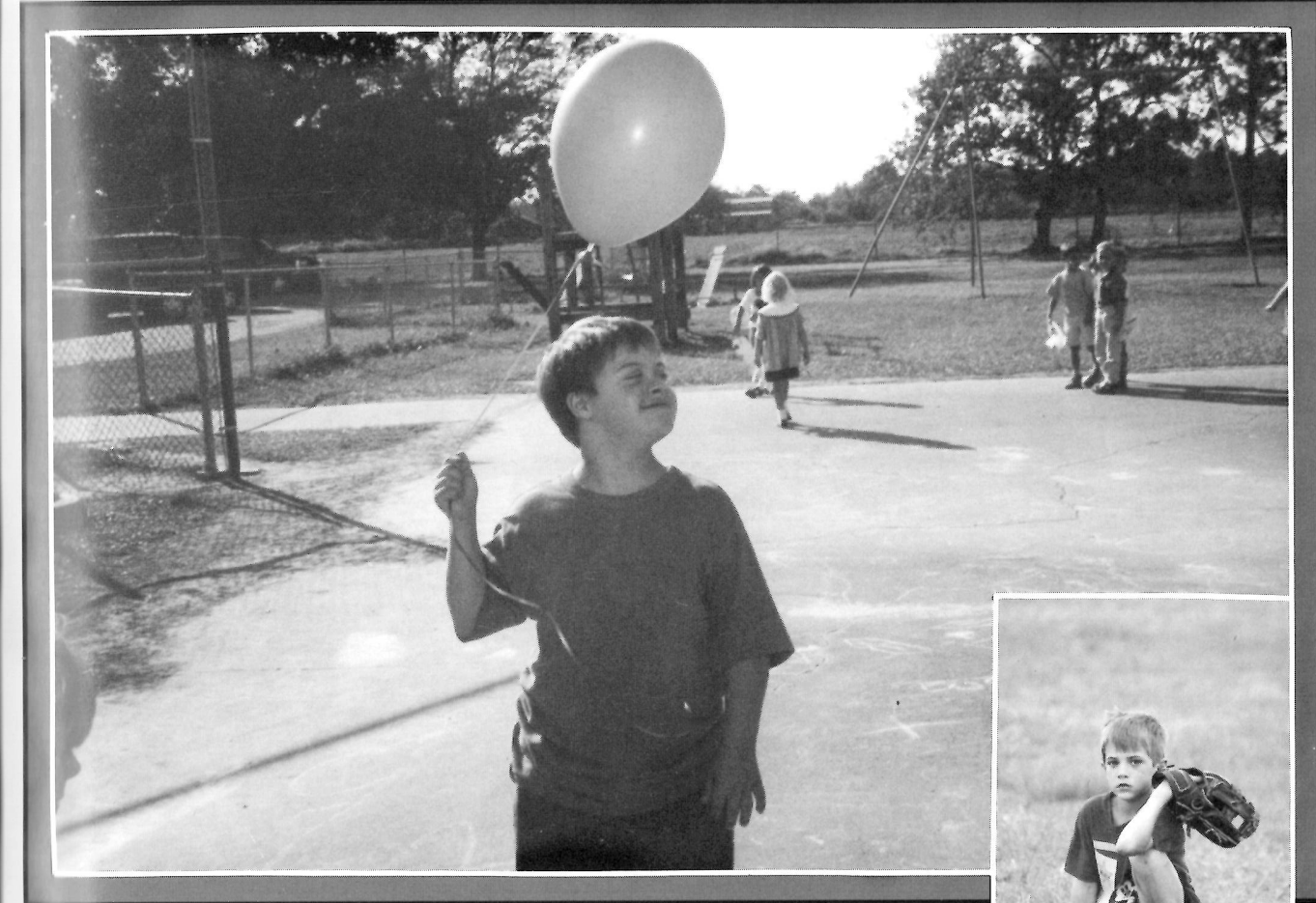

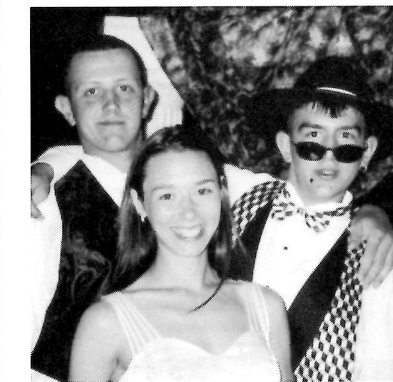

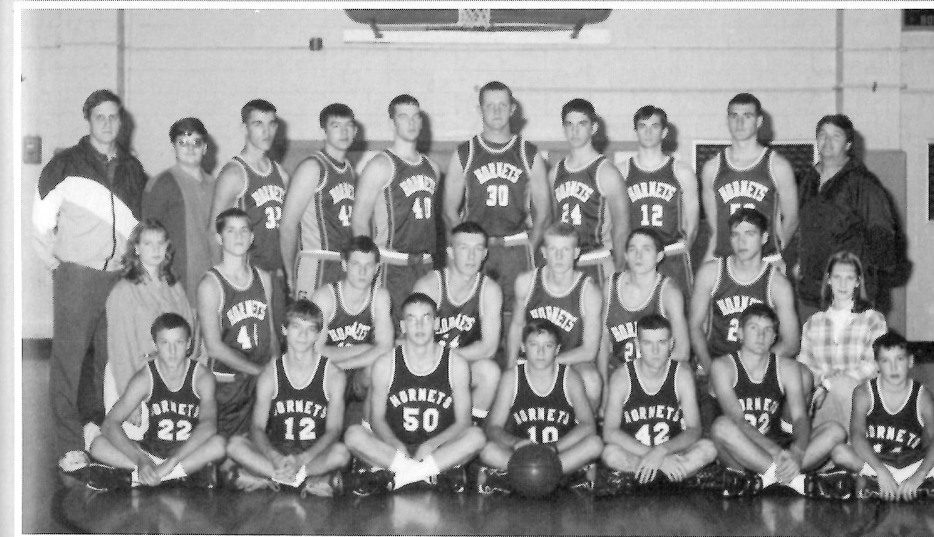
With lots of chanting and excitement, the Hornets earned a second place finish in the district playoffs

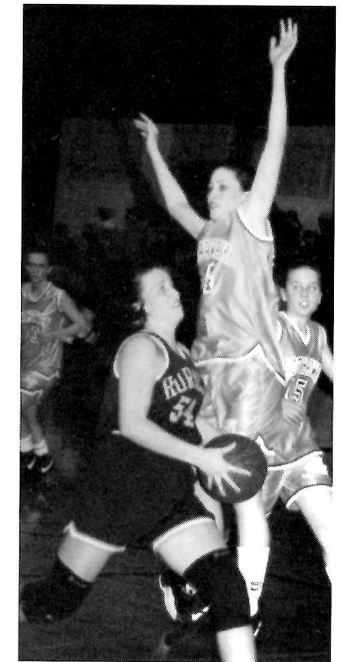


GET IN THE GAME

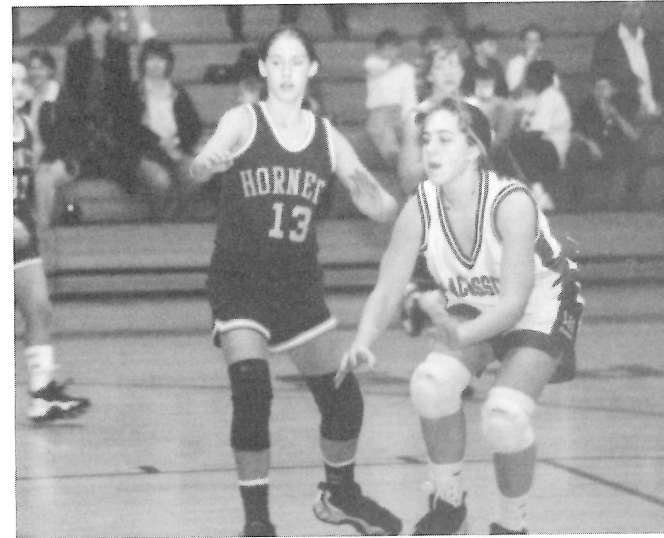

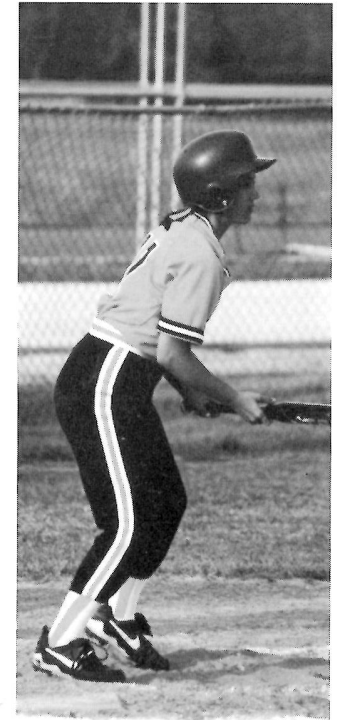

During Homecoming week, the squad attended Pep Rally practices, held a Pep Rally, decorated for the dance, and still arrived on time for the Homecoming game.

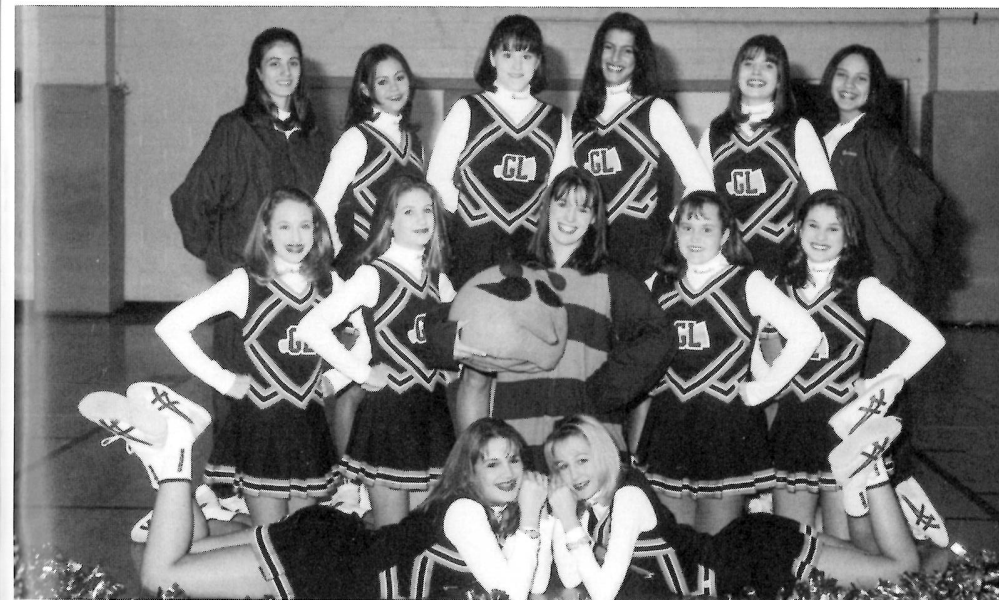
