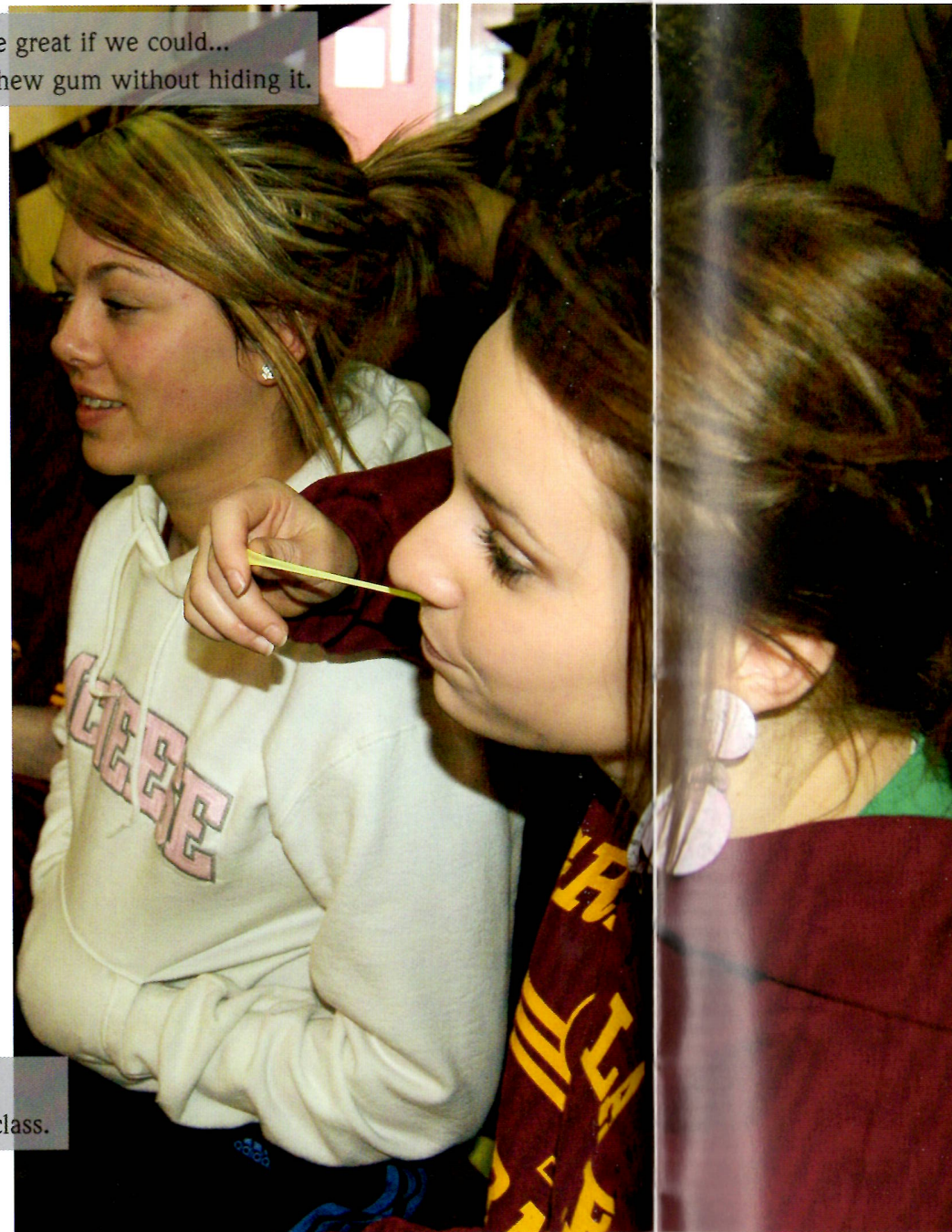

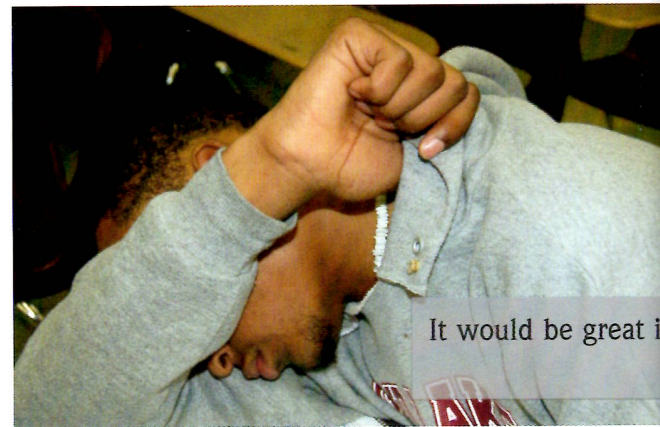

Students share the stories behind their scars

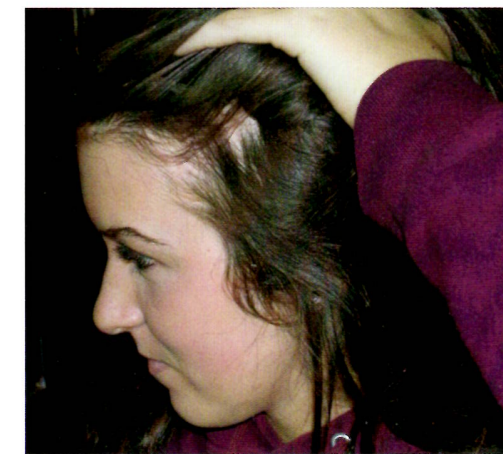

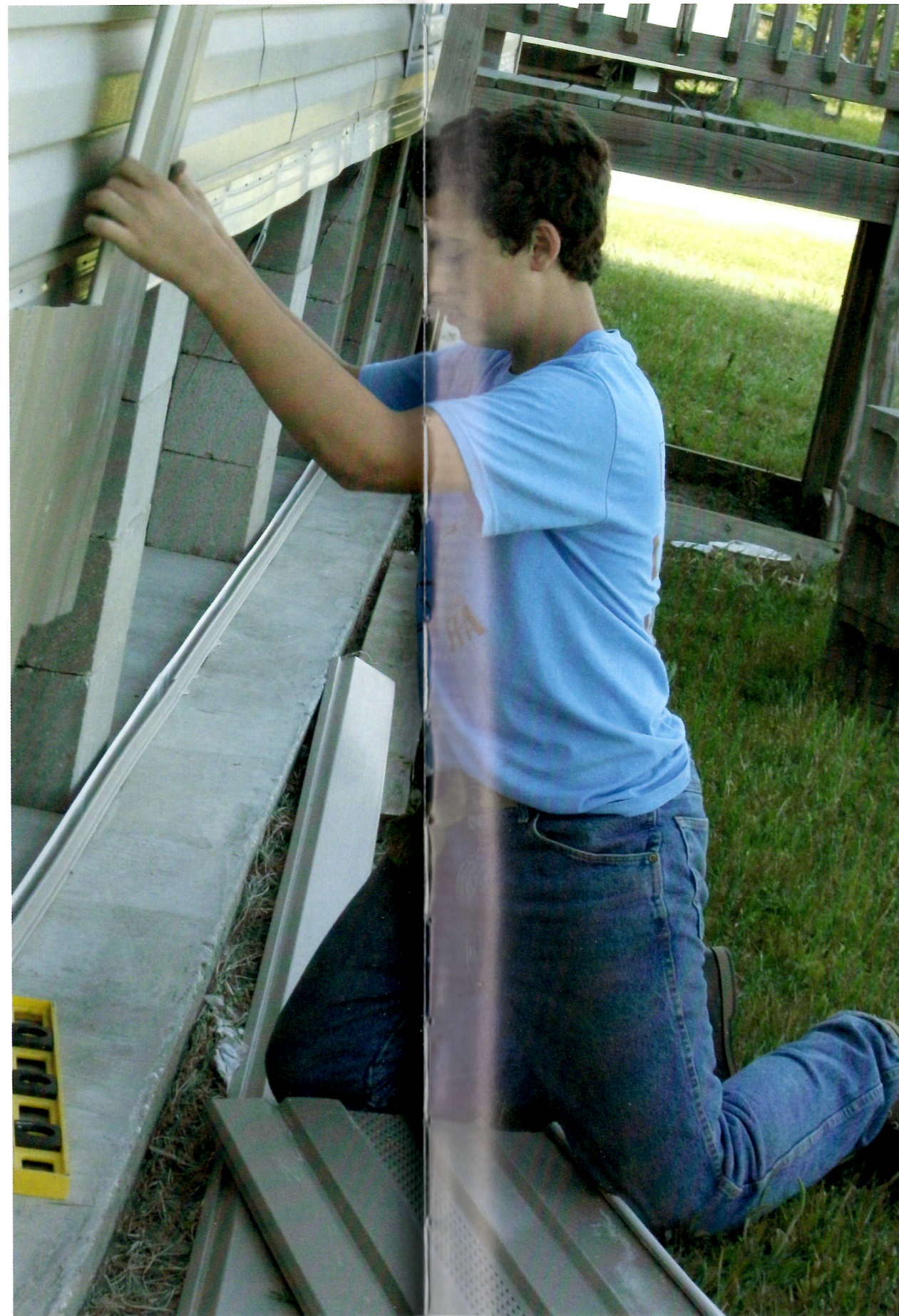

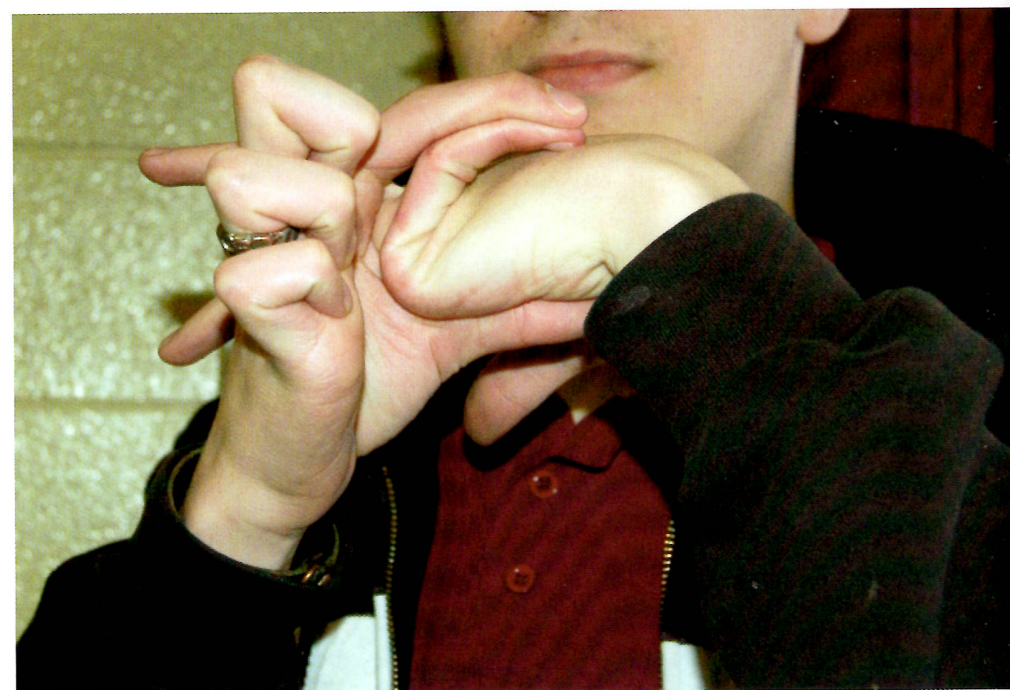

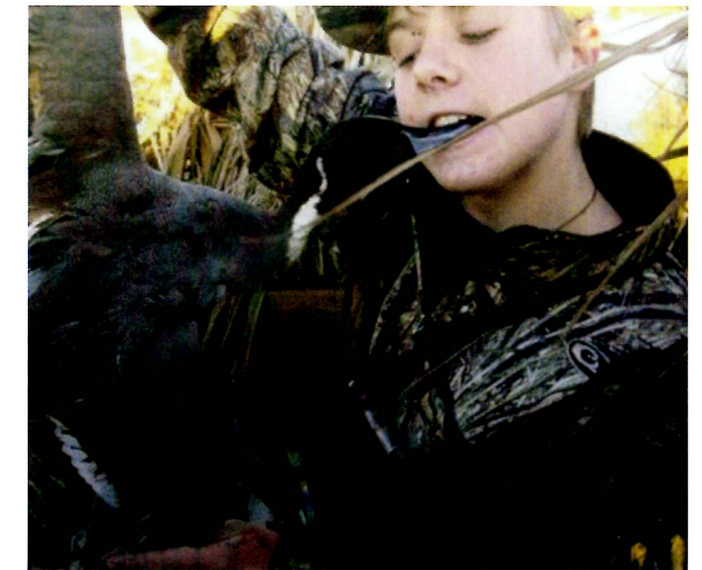

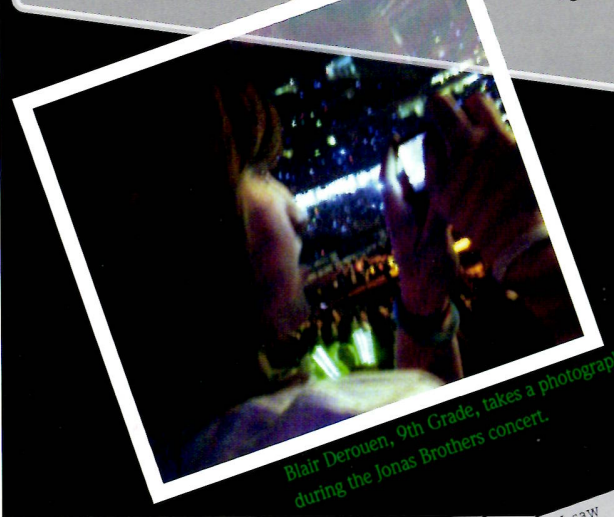

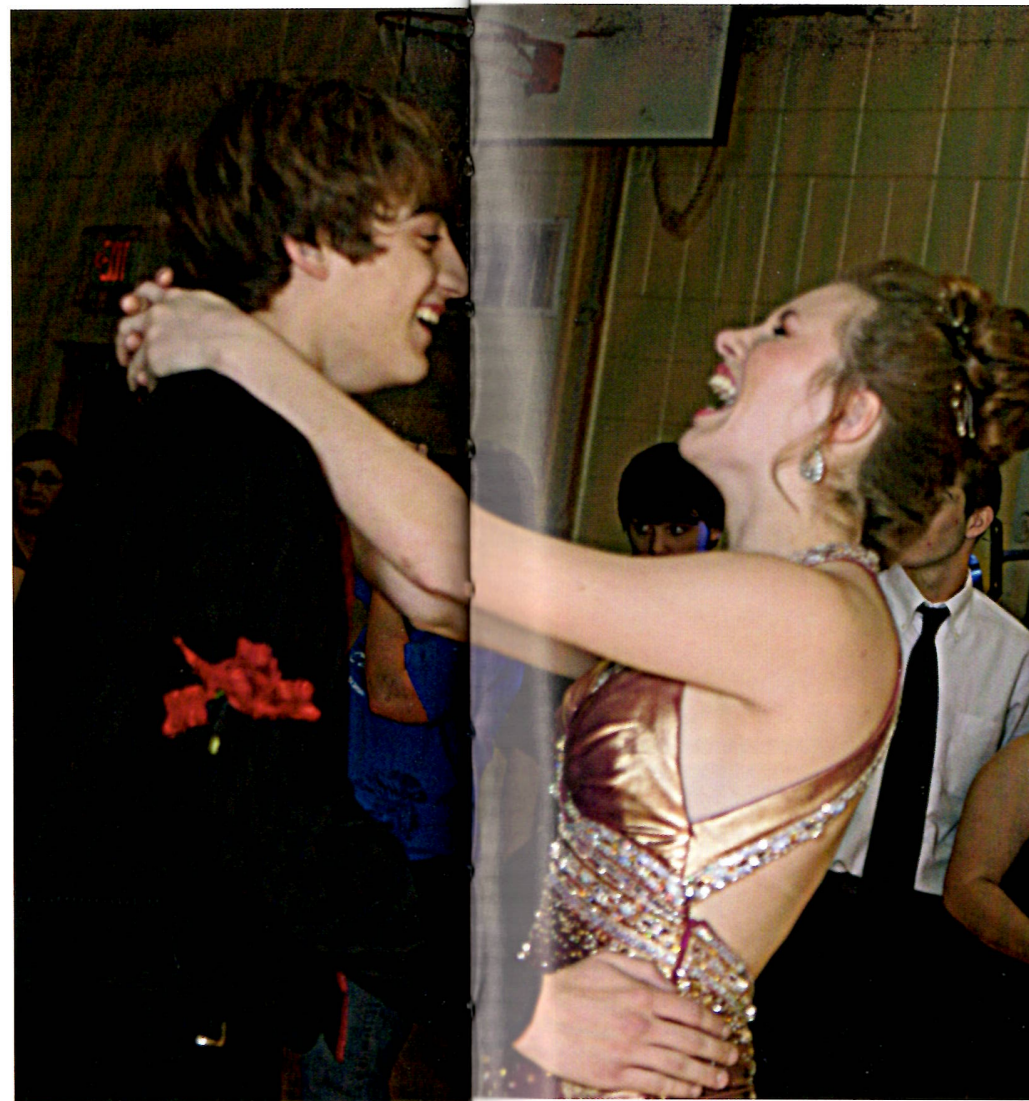

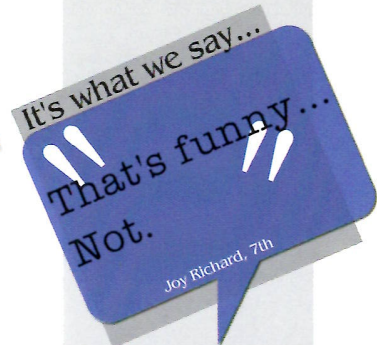

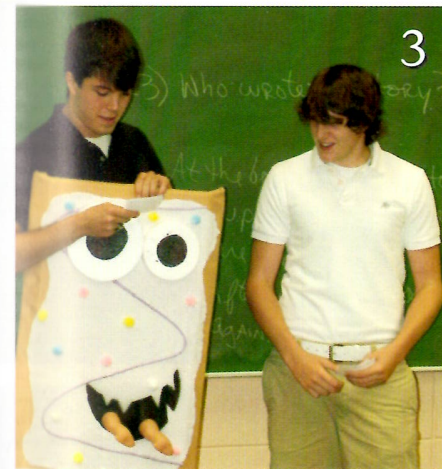

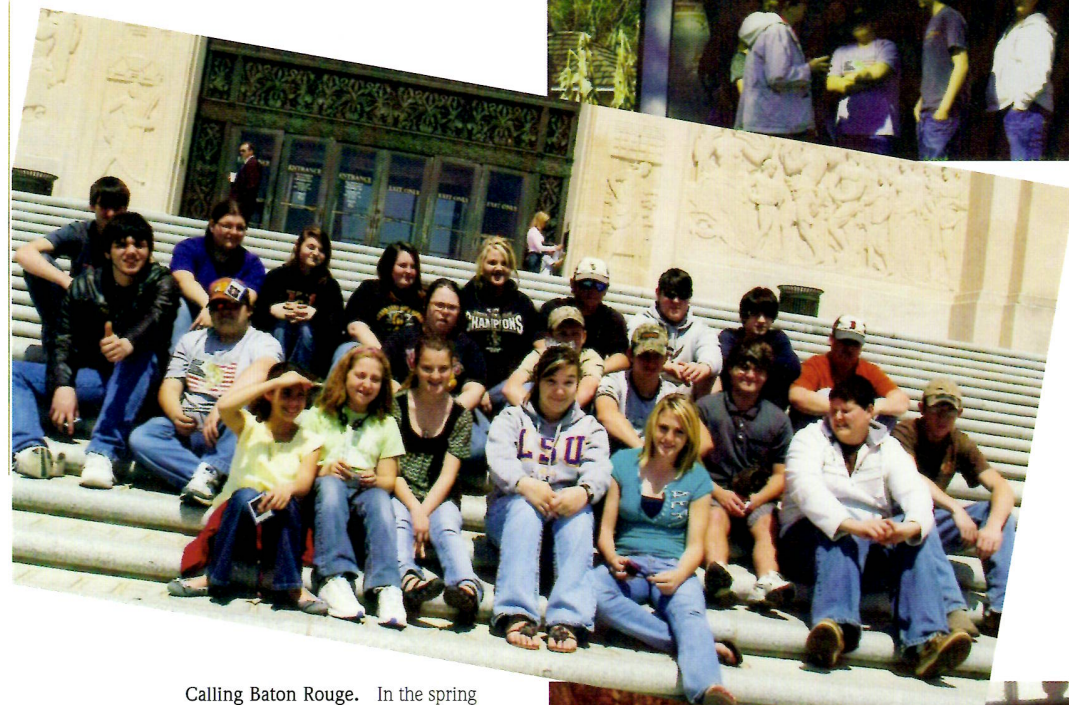

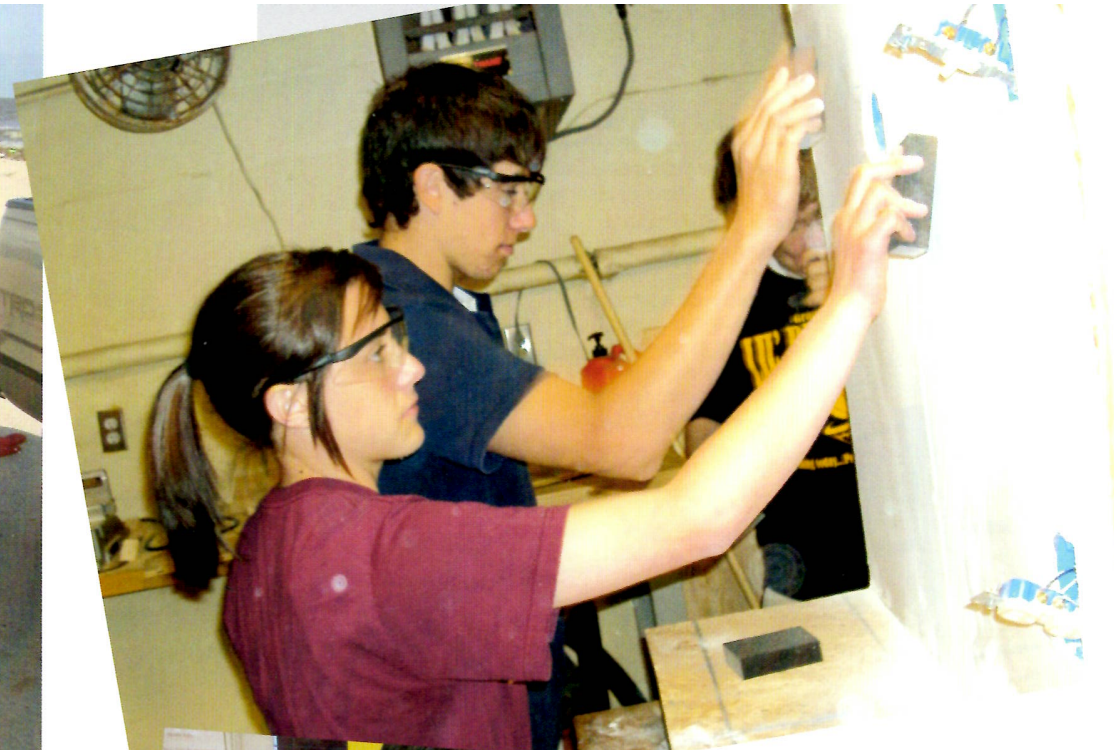

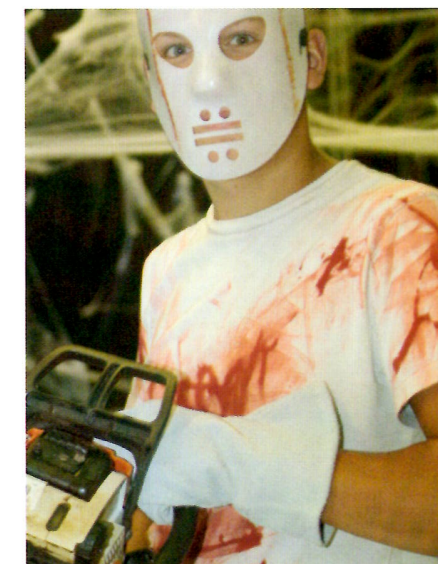

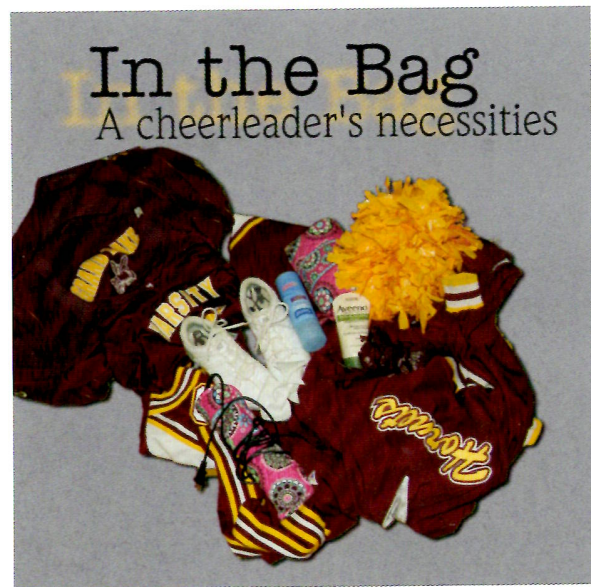

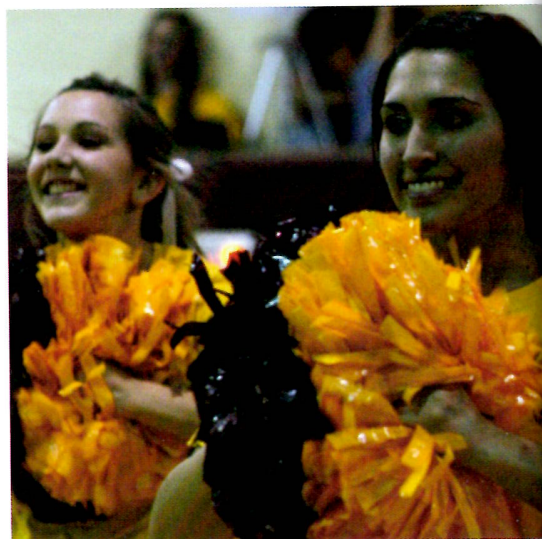

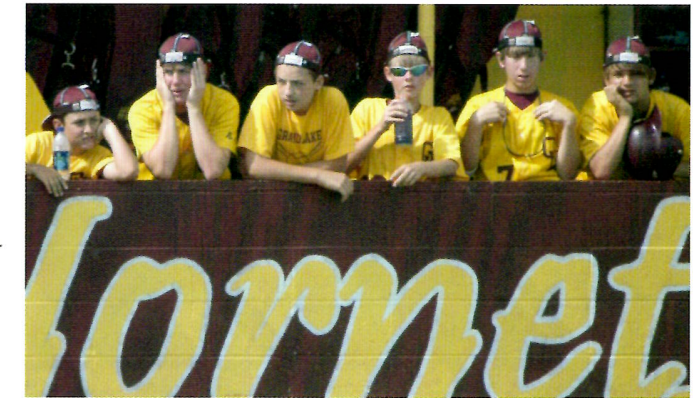

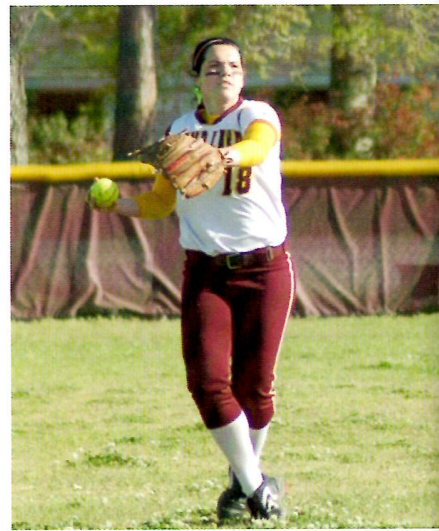

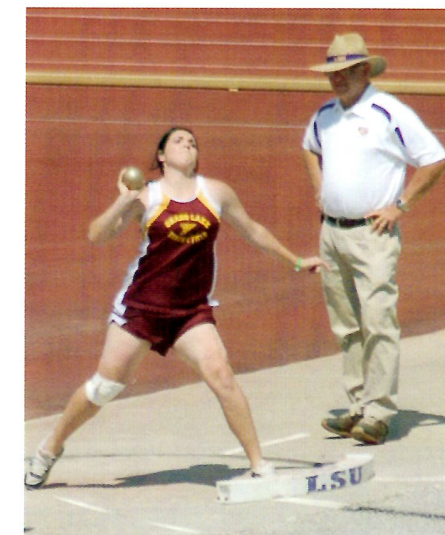

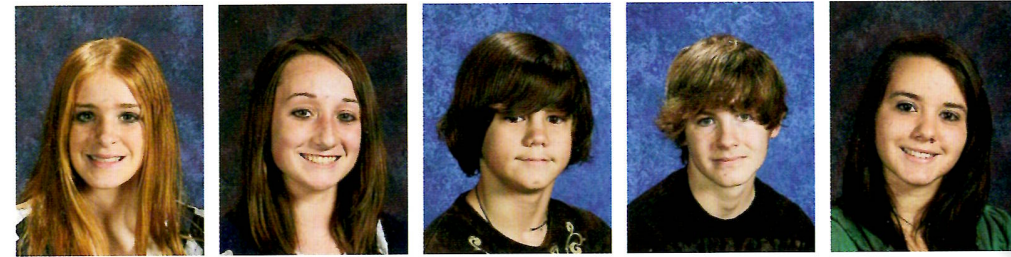

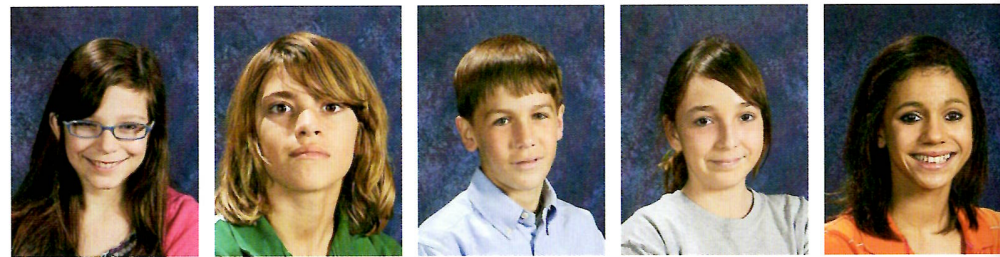

Colophon

The 2010 Hornet yearbook was produced by students of Grand Lake High's yearbook staff under the advisement of Miss Lindsay Smythe. The staff began planning the yearbook theme during the month of August, and the theme "That's What We Said" was finalized during the first nine weeks of the school year. All yearbook stories were written by staff members, and photographs were taken by staff members, volunteer student photographers, or Miss Smythe. In addition, some photographs were submitted by outside individuals, such as parents or community members.

The cover is a four-color matte Lithocote, and all colors are standard colors available through Taylor Publishing's StudioWorks program. The theme colors were Silver #81, Black #1, All American Red #31, Super Blue #11, Kelly Green #21, Yellow Ochre #49, and White. The dominant colors for the divider pages and subsequent sections are as follows: All American Red #31 for "You Would"/Student Life, Yellow Ochre #49 for "In Your Face"/Sports, Super Blue #11 for "Really?"/People, and Kelly Green #21 for "Owned"/Ads. Headline type was Typewriter, and subheadline type was Genesis. Body copy was Bern 9 point, and captions were Bern 8 point. Inside pages have a trim size of 7 3/4 by 10 1/2 inches with a Smyth binding type printed on 100# enamel.

Book purchases were managed through Sum It 3.0 software, and students purchased the yearbook via order forms. Book sales were \$35 during the week of the sale or \$50 after the deadline. Name stamps could be purchased for \$5.

The book had a press run of 150 copies and was printed at Taylor Publishing Company in Dallas, Texas. The staff's yearbook representatives were Clint Sanford, Chris Sanford, and Charlie Phillips (all of Graduate Sales in Sulphur, LA). The account executive at Taylor Publishing in Dallas was Angela Holt.

Grade-level, faculty, and group photographs were taken by photographers with Gerry Gibson's Lifetouch Photography. Photos were submitted digitally and taken with a Nikon D50. Pages were produced on 4 Dell laptops using StudioWorks yearbook software and Photoshop Elements 4.0.
