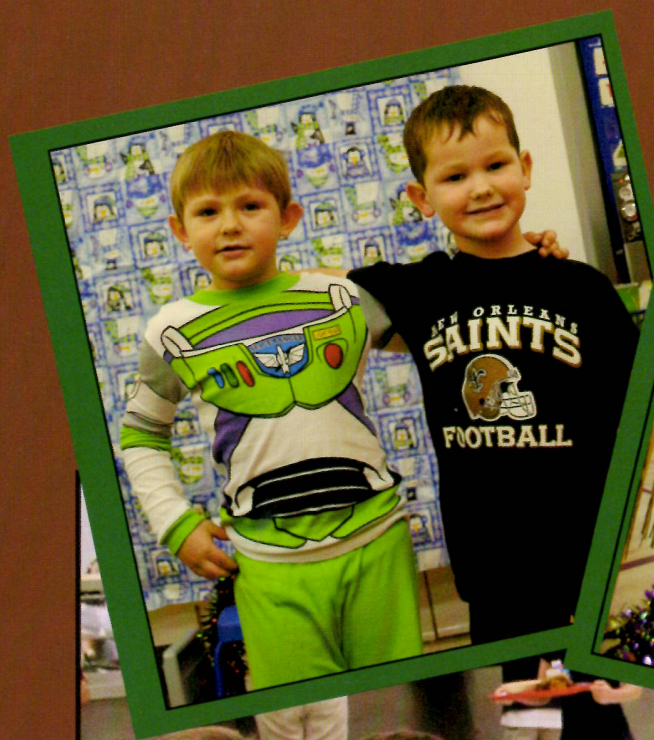

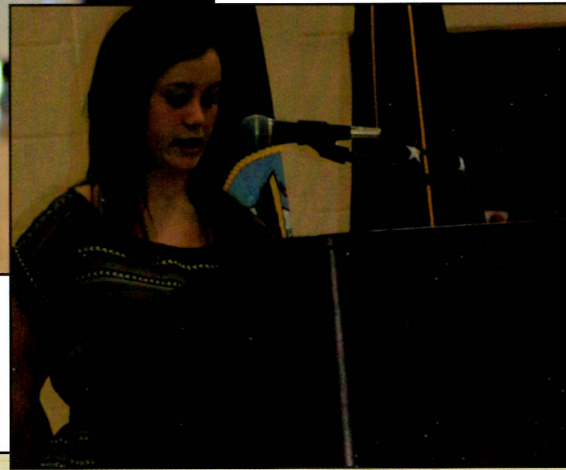
VETERANS' DAY

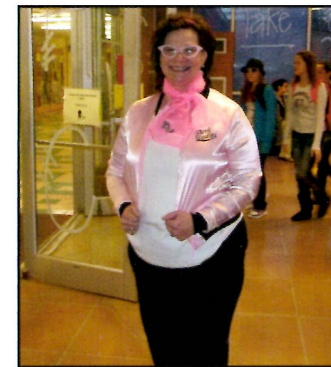

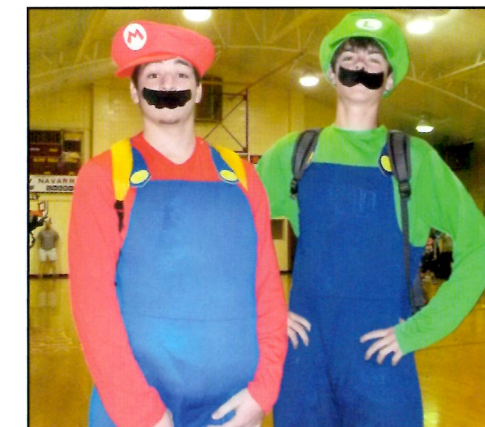

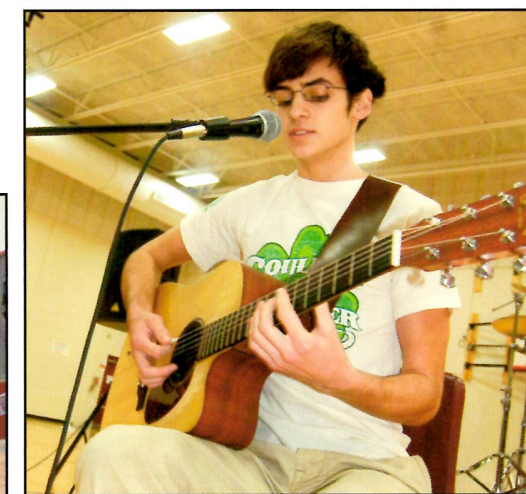

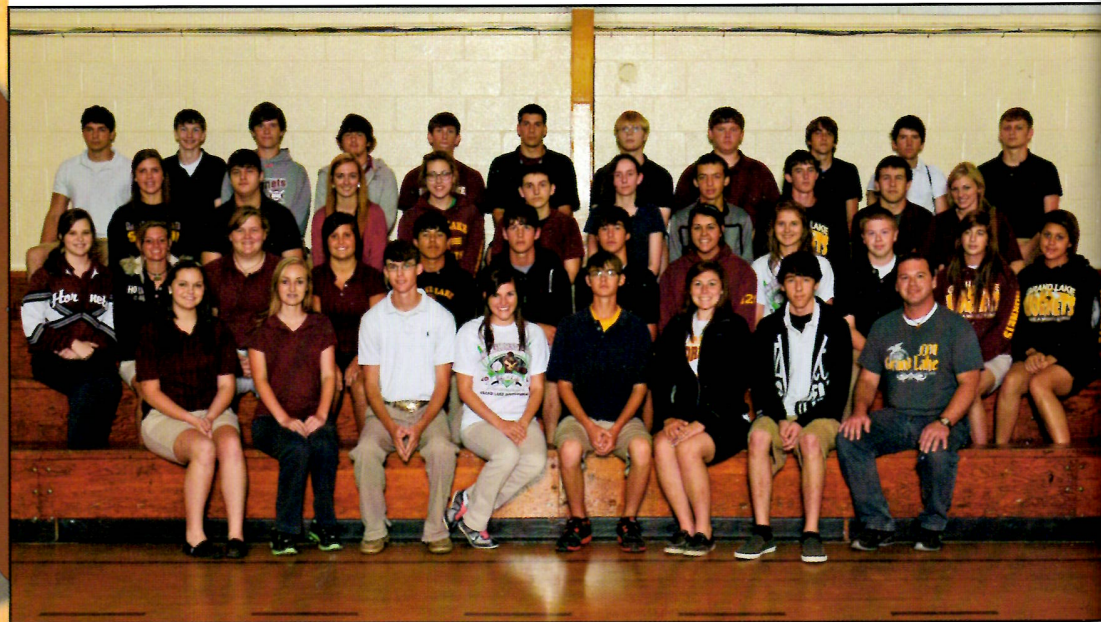

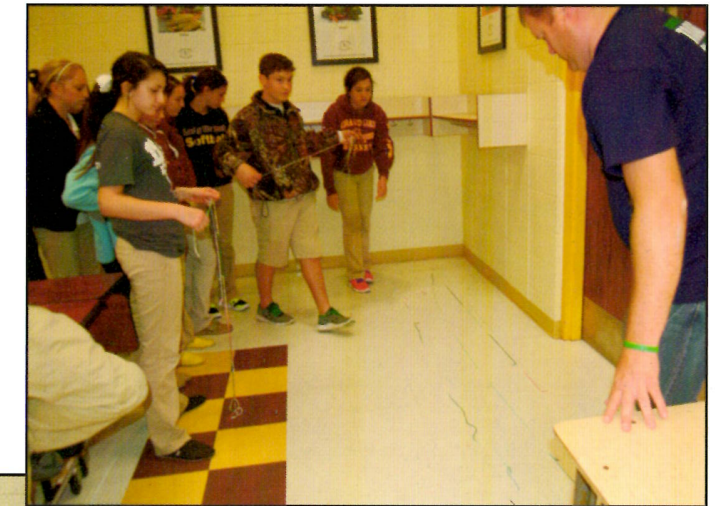

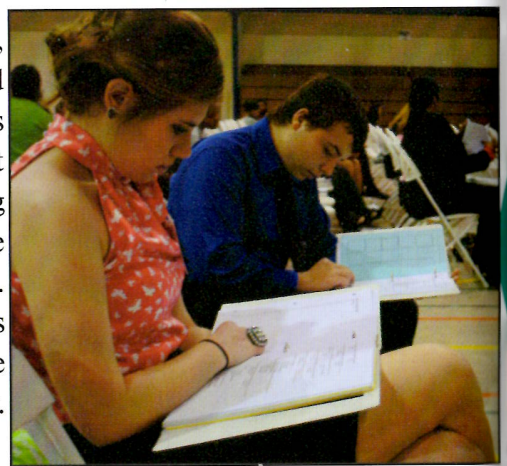

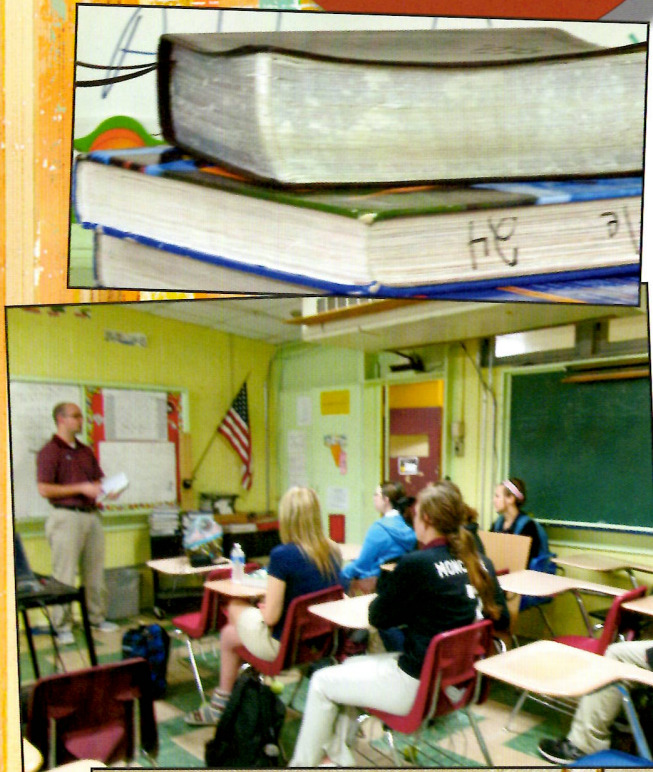

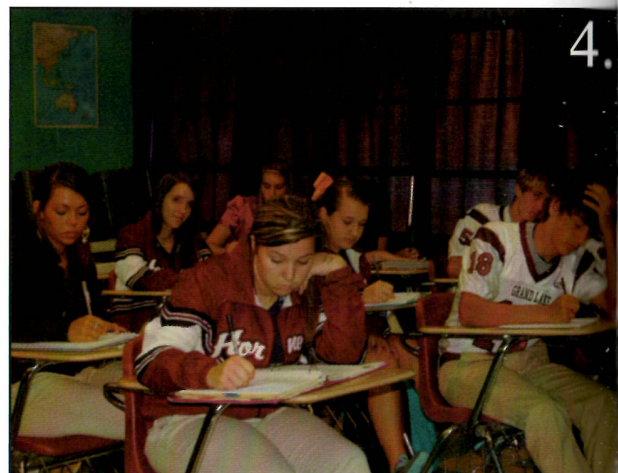

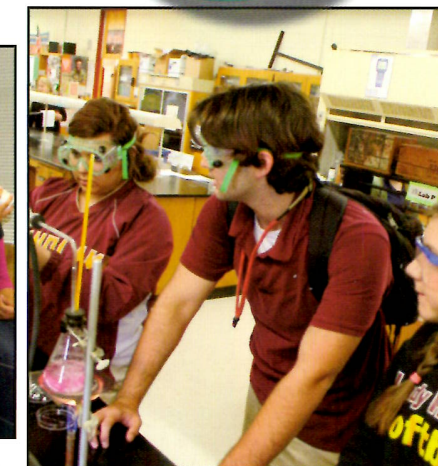

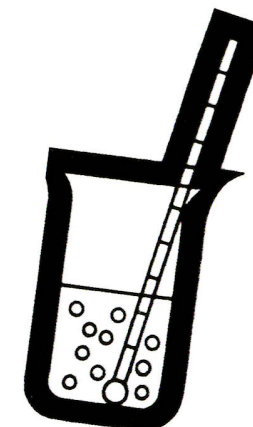

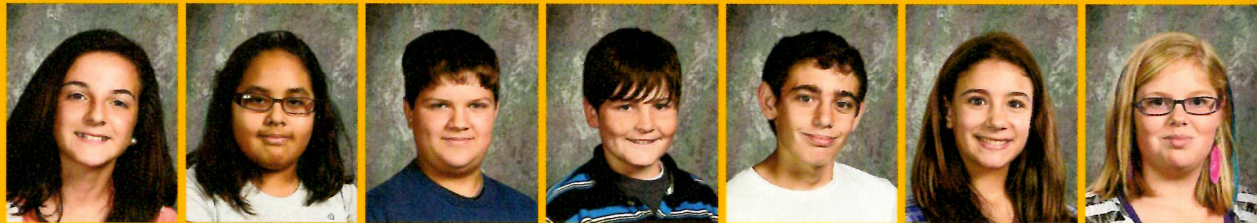

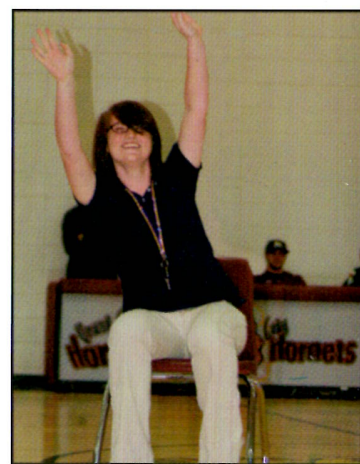

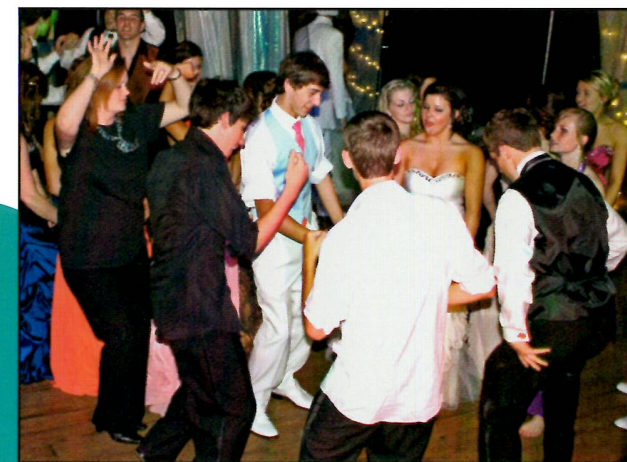

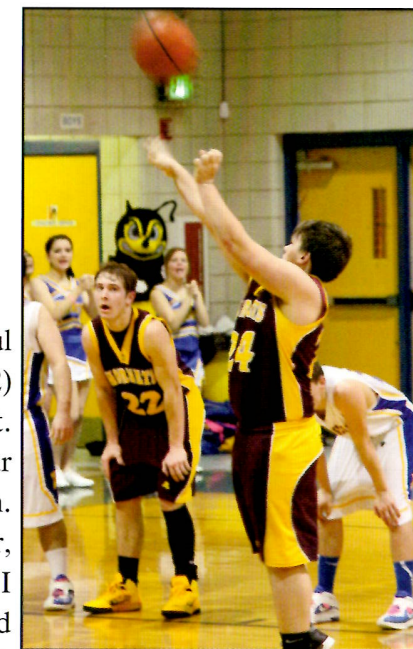

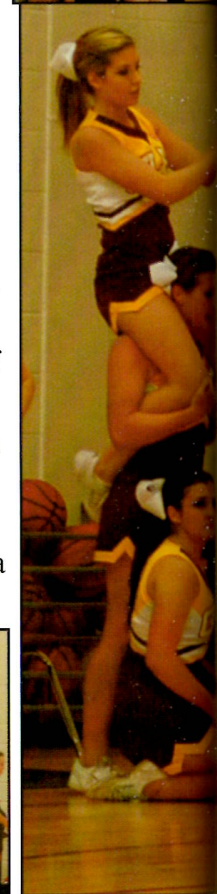

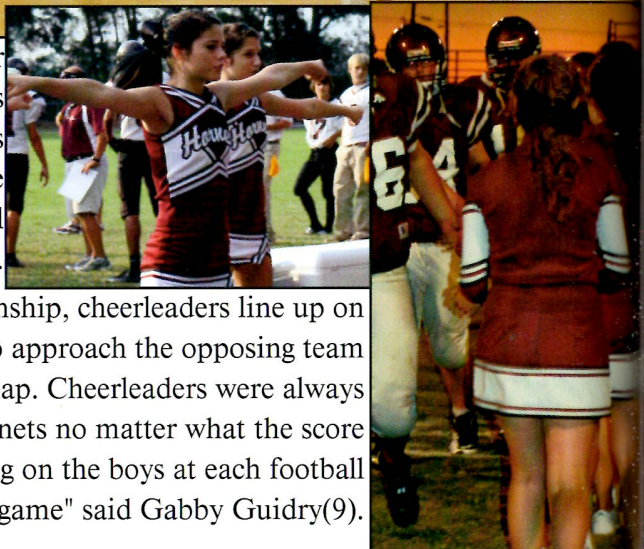

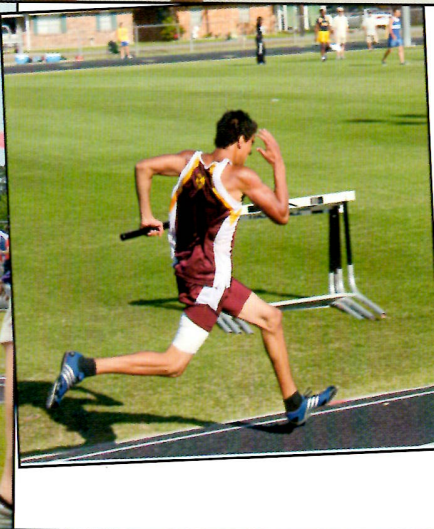

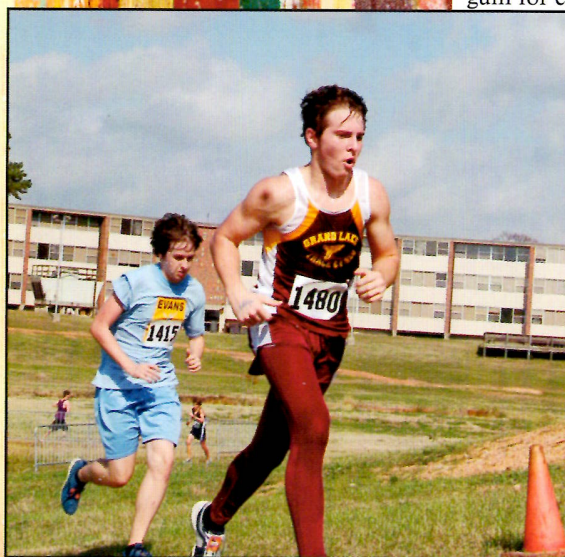

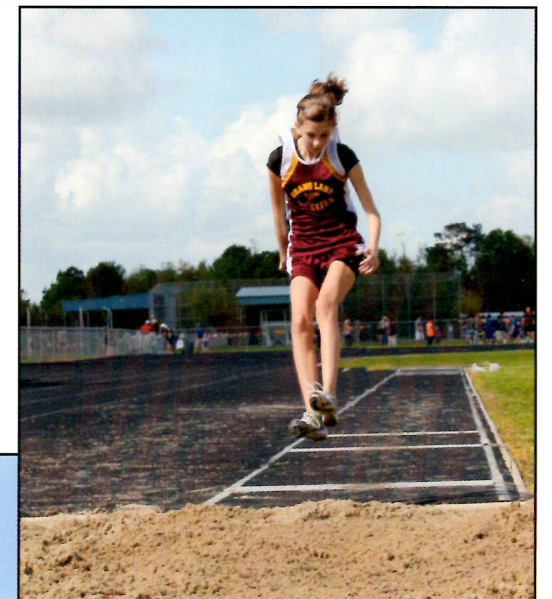

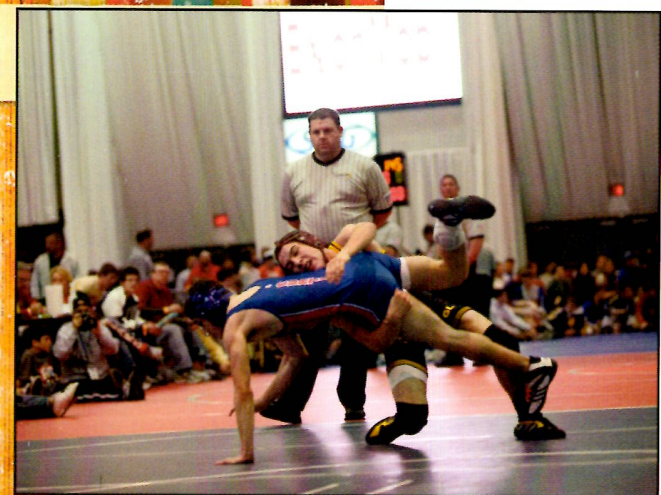

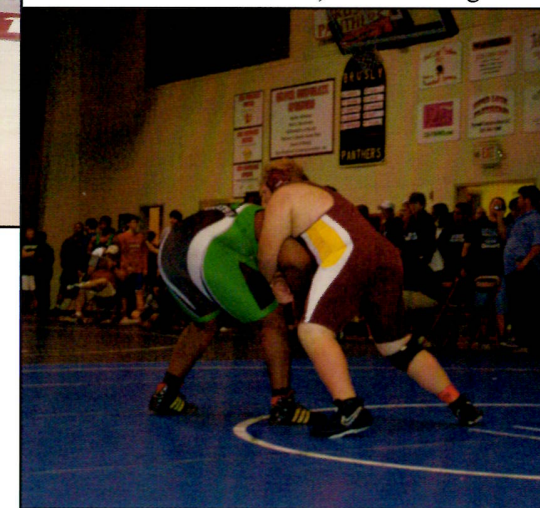

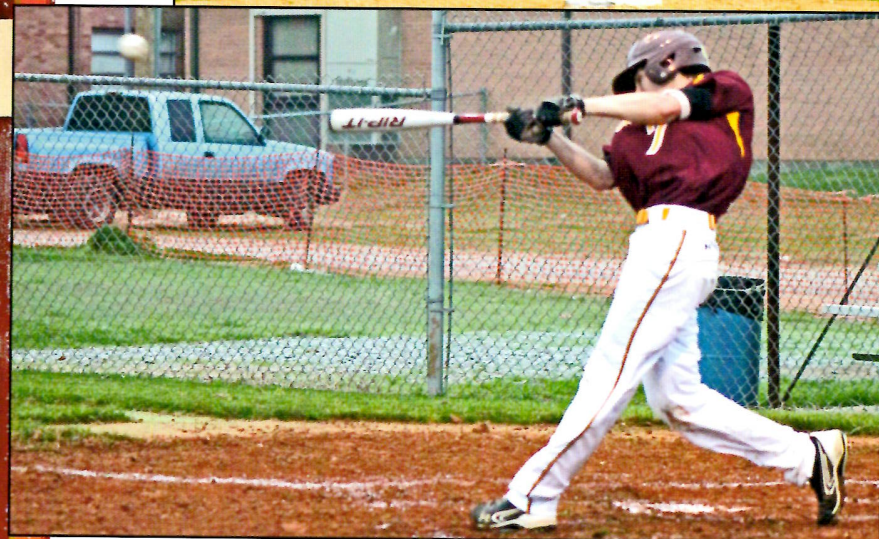

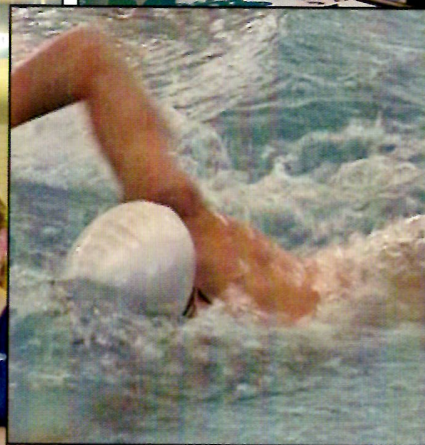

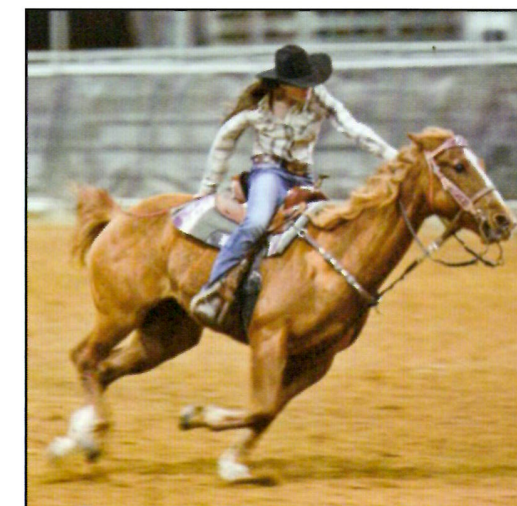
