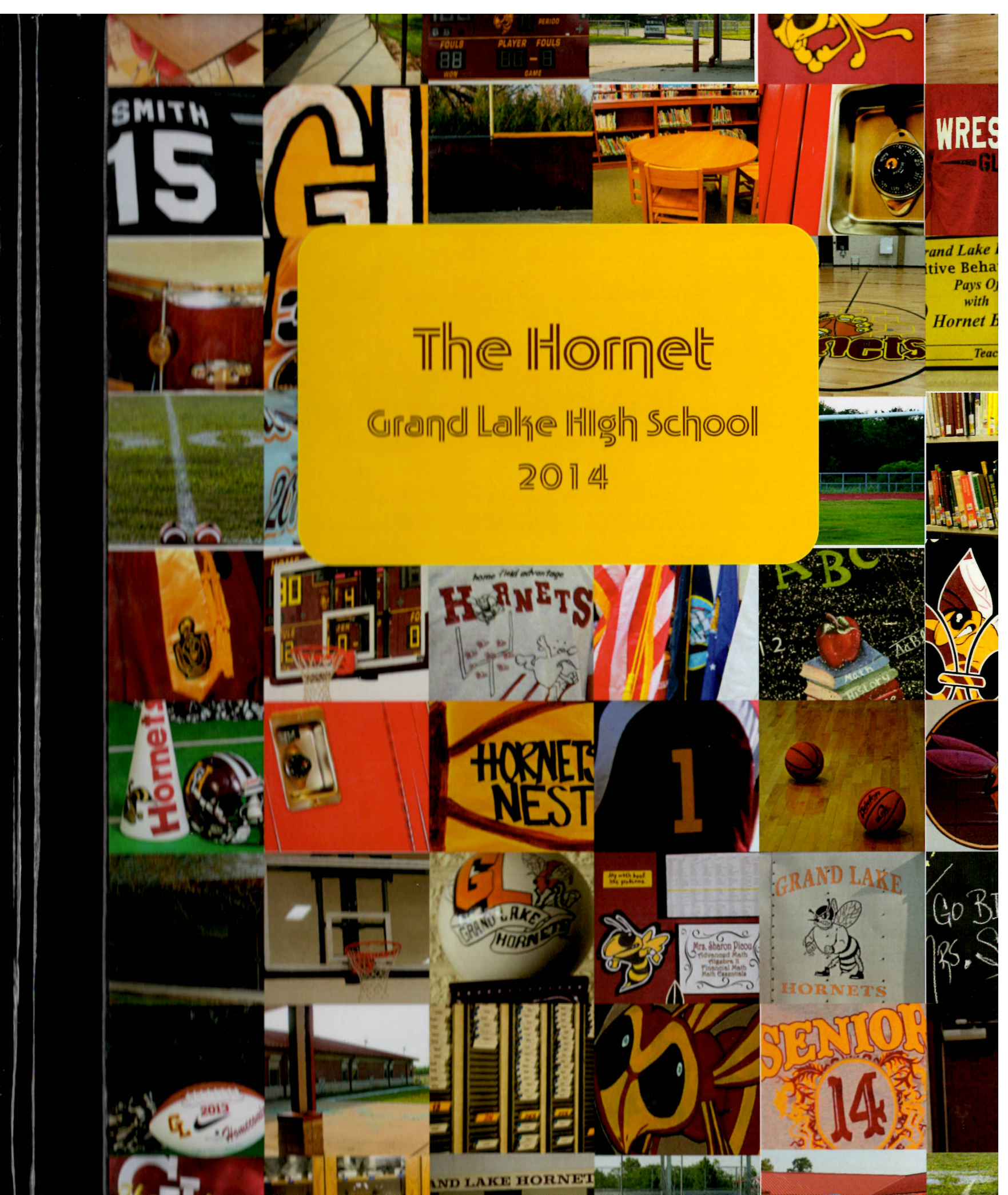

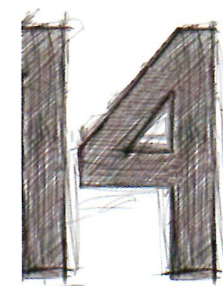

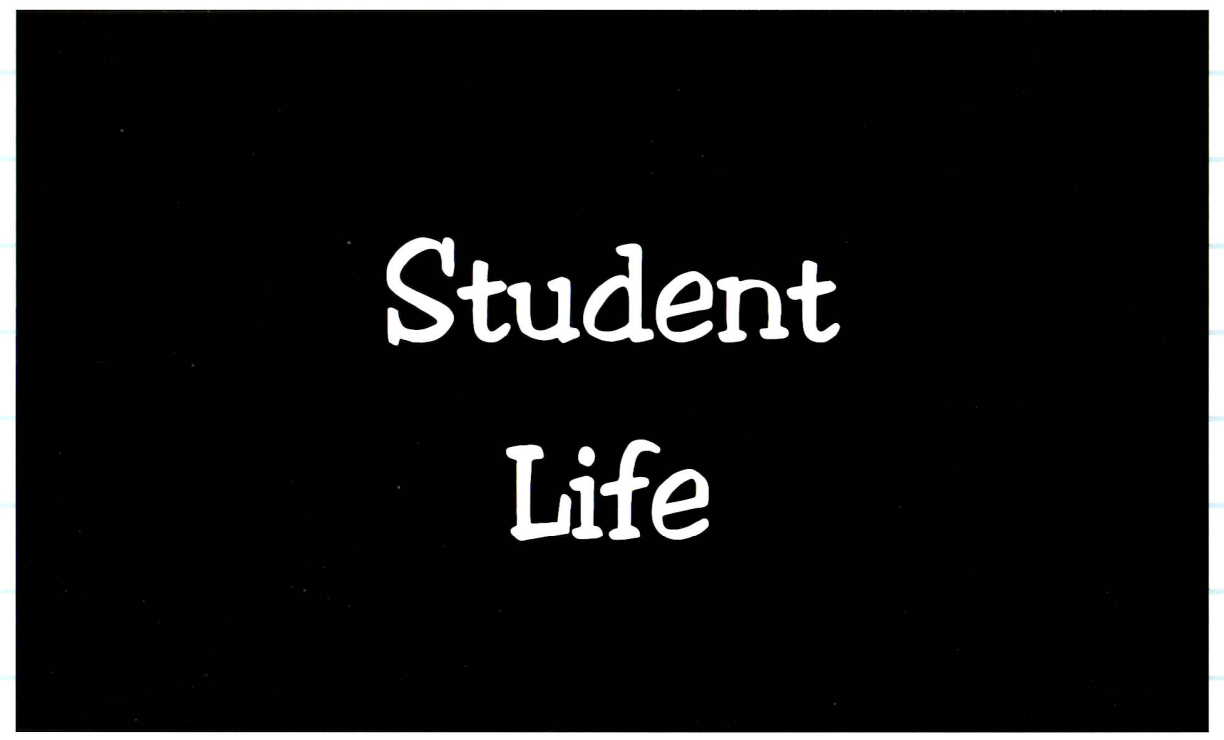

We've Made Some Changes

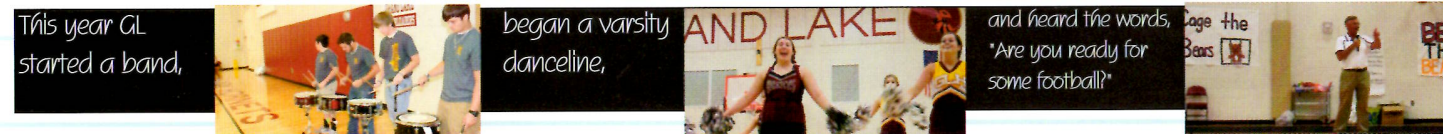

In addition to the new stadium, the renovations to the school have left us with new halls, classrooms, restrooms, and lockers. RTI allows students to make up missed work or receive extra help in any subject. The renovations and improvements are the first in many improvements to continue at Grand Lake High School.

5) Making a lot of noise, Casey Dupre(12) cheers with his class at their last homecoming pep rally. The seniors went on to win the spirit stick.

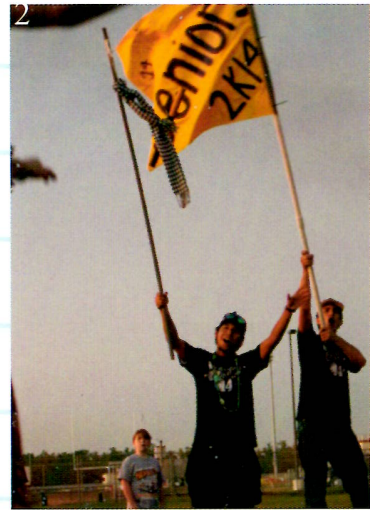

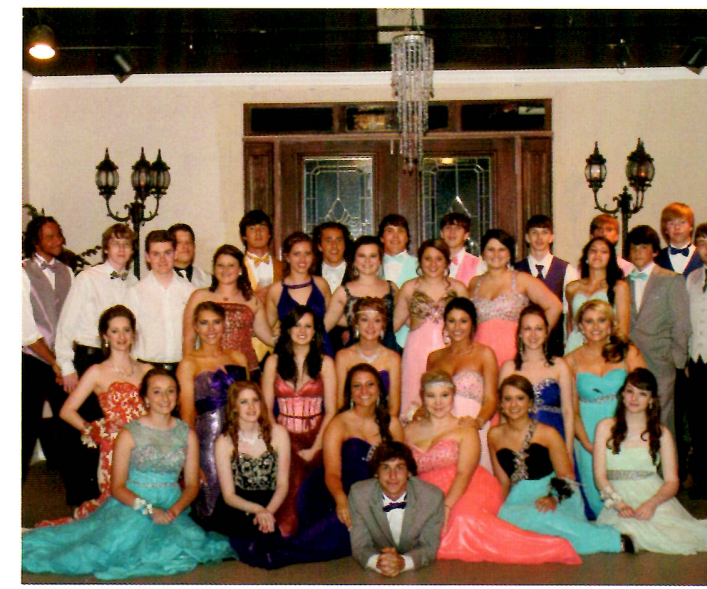


3) As couples enjoy slow dancing to the music, Sheridan Smith(11) and Bailey Lognon(11) pose as the camera focuses on them.

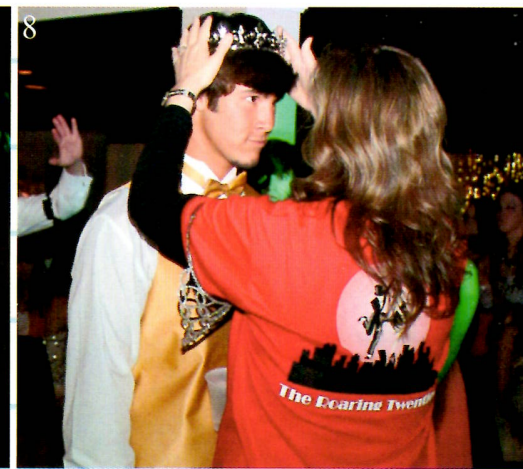
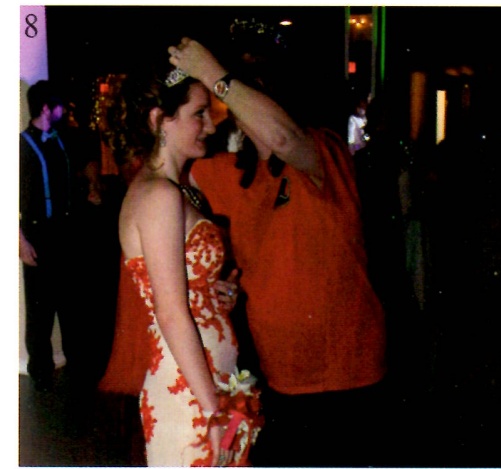
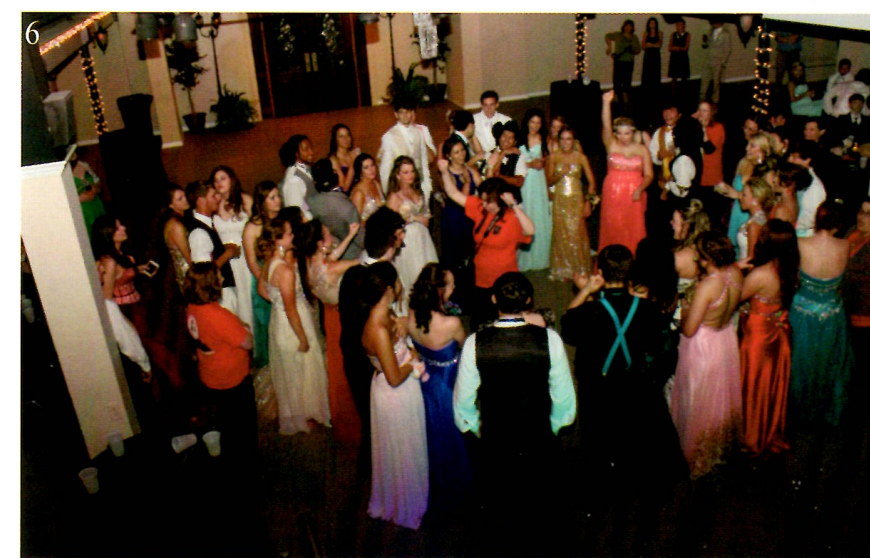

4) The varsity baseball team and softball team were both awarded trophies as District Champions. Both teams went undefeated in district.

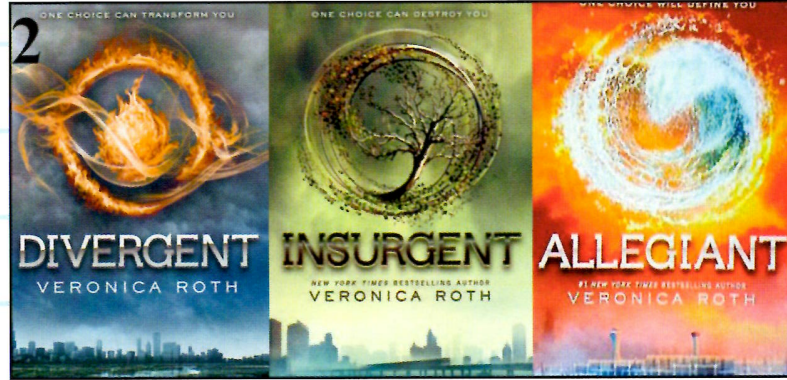

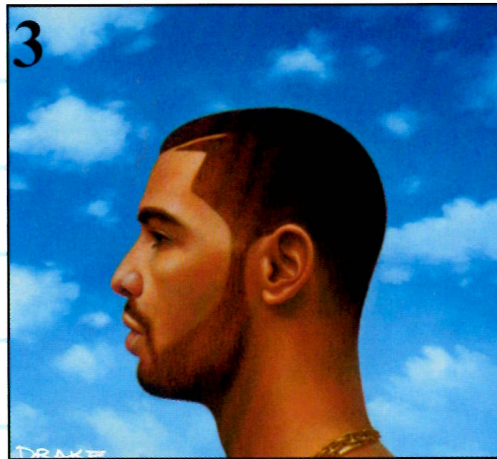
6) Hailey Boudreaux(10) was awarded First Team All-District Outfield in softball. She has been playing softball for six years.

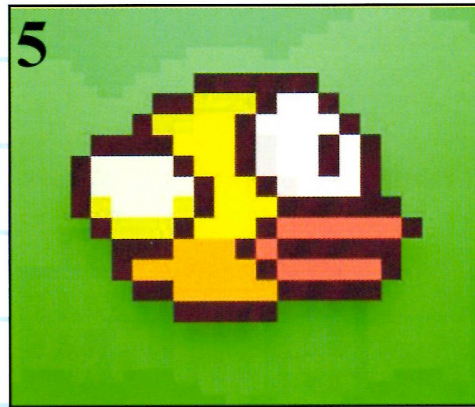

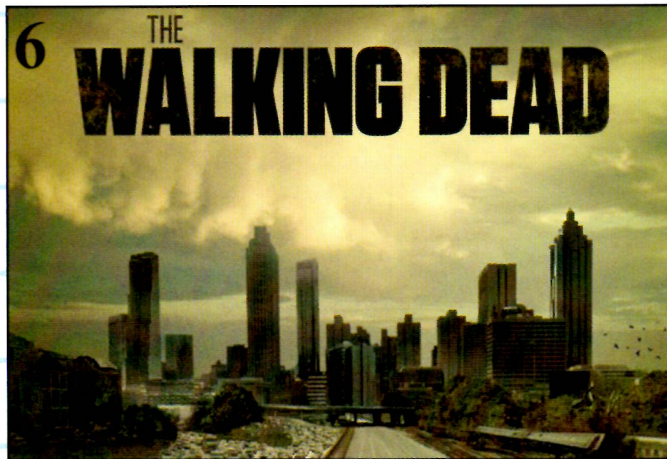

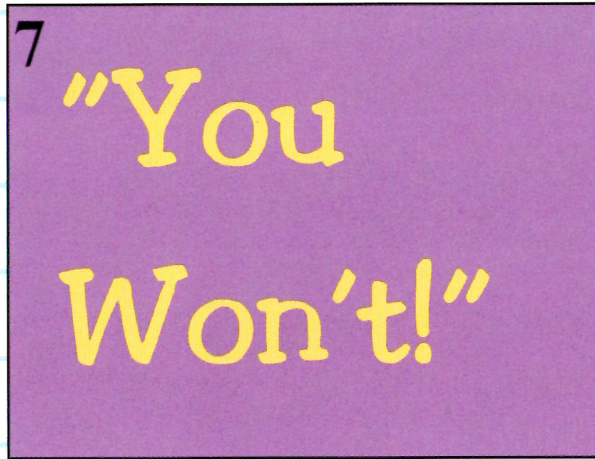

Q: What is your favorite subject and why?

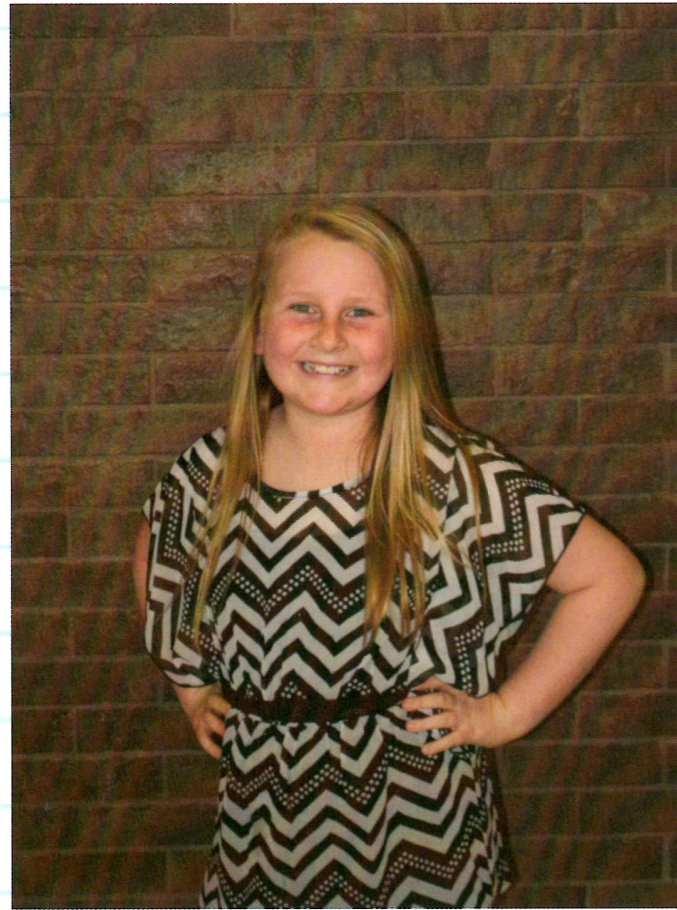

Brynlee Boudreaux(5) is this year's fifth grade student of the year. Boudreaux also went on to win Cameron Parish Student of the Year.

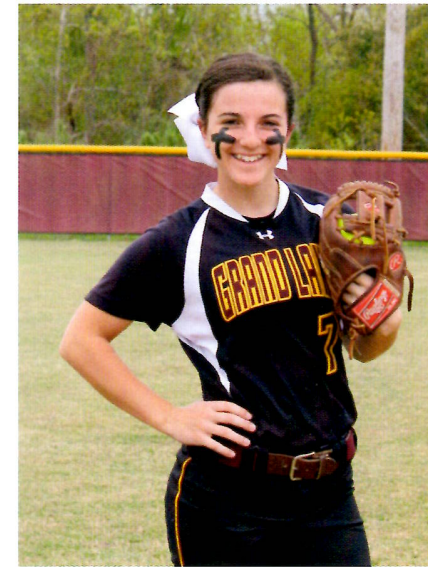


8th Grade Student of the Year

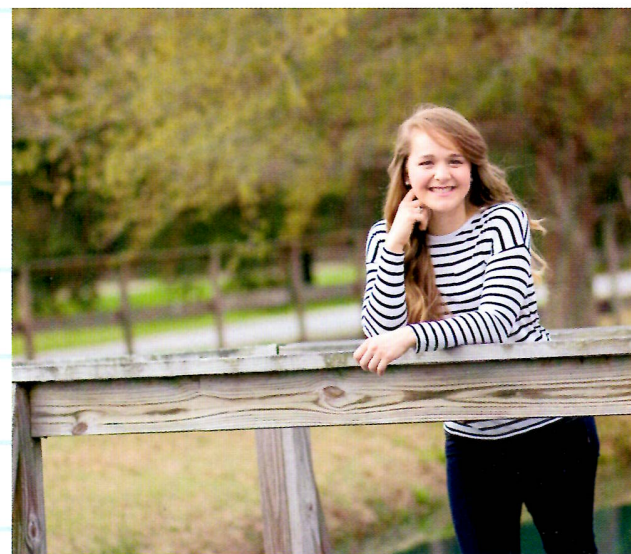

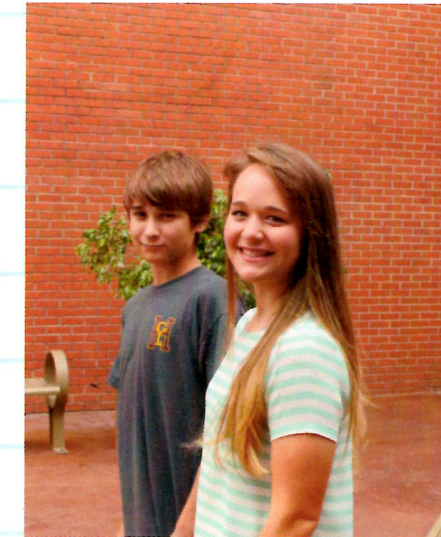
Q: What will you miss most about high school?

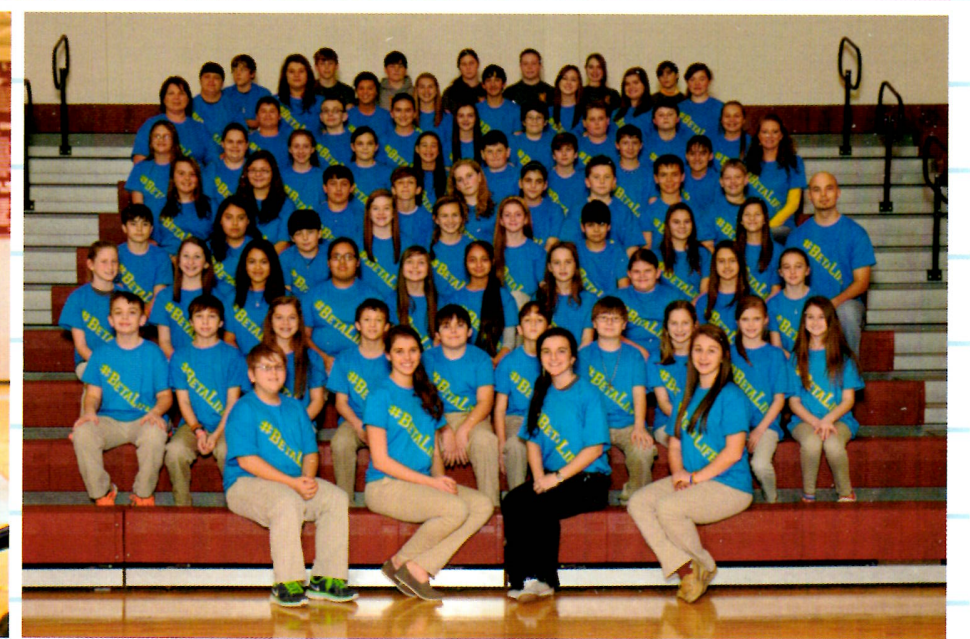

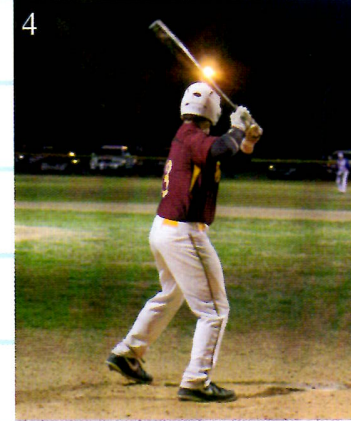

This year the school entered a new classification of 1A. The softball team stepped up to the challenge of facing larger schools and never missed a beat. The team still had high expectations of their team and was looking forward to reaching state. The girls finished their regular season as district champs (10-0). They ended the season at the Regional Round with a record of 18-4, which is the best record the Grand Lake Softball team has had yet. Their winning percentage of the year was .818. The team's combined batting average was 365 with five girls having a batting average above 300. Four of the five averaged above 400. The girls also scored 195 runs, only allowed 68 runs in 22 games, and totaled 123 RBI's.

The cheerleaders also had the benefit of being able to cheer on the new varsity football team on the new football

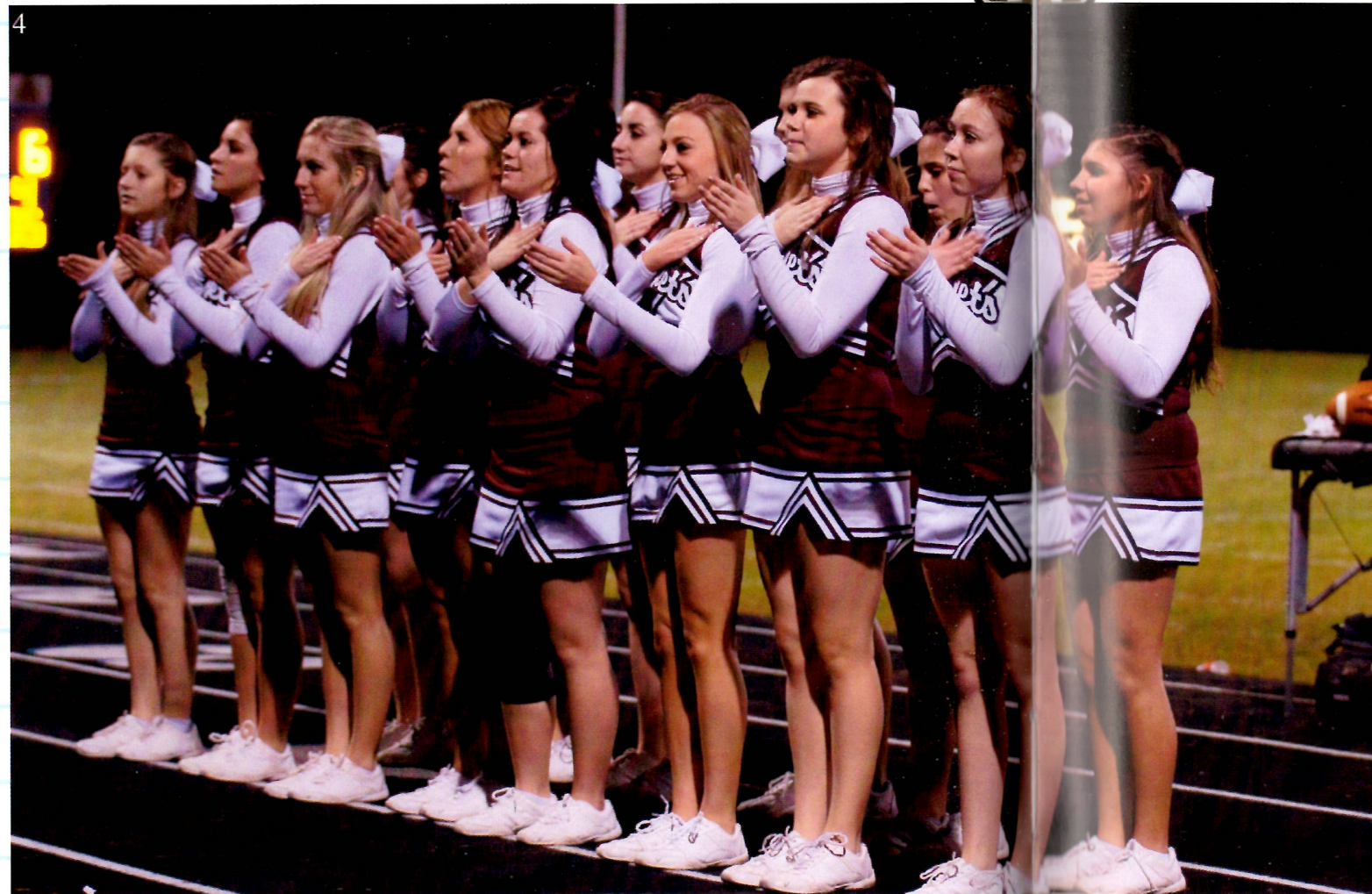

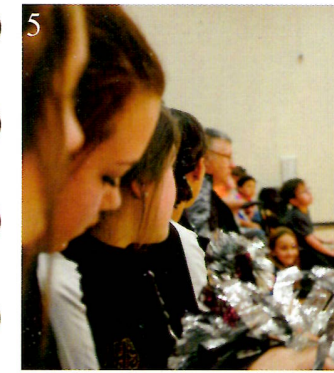
Danceline

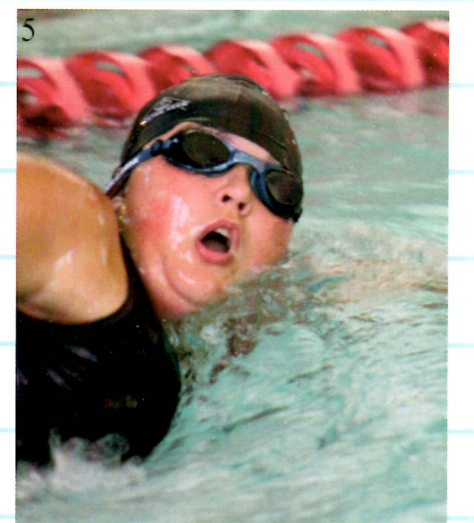

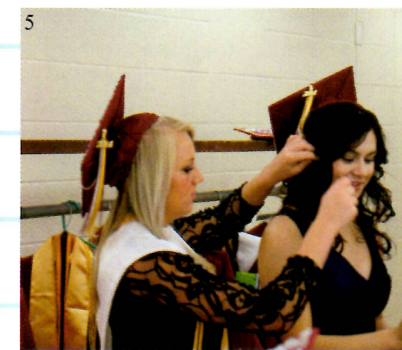

2) Christmas cheer fills the room as students in first grade sing "Away in a Manger" and "Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer."



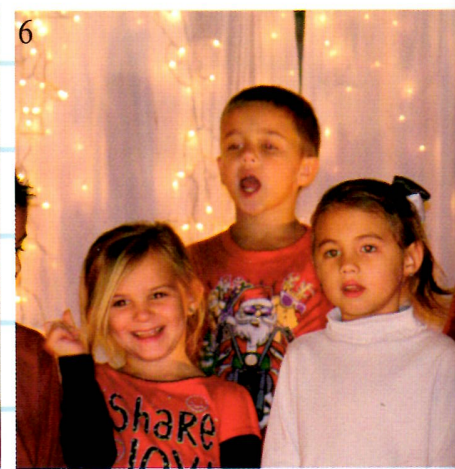
3) Tinsel and bells... Mrs. Rlenike and Yanaira Contreras decorate the props for the annual Christmas program. The props were used by many families to take pictures.
