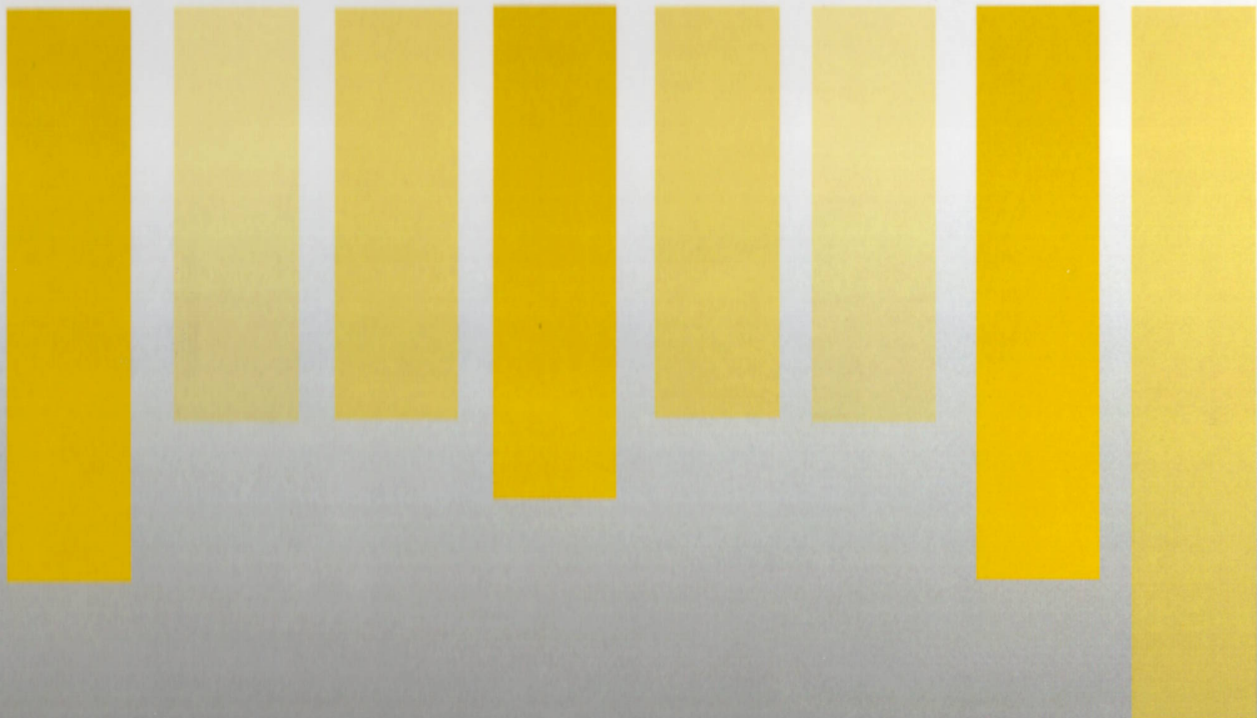

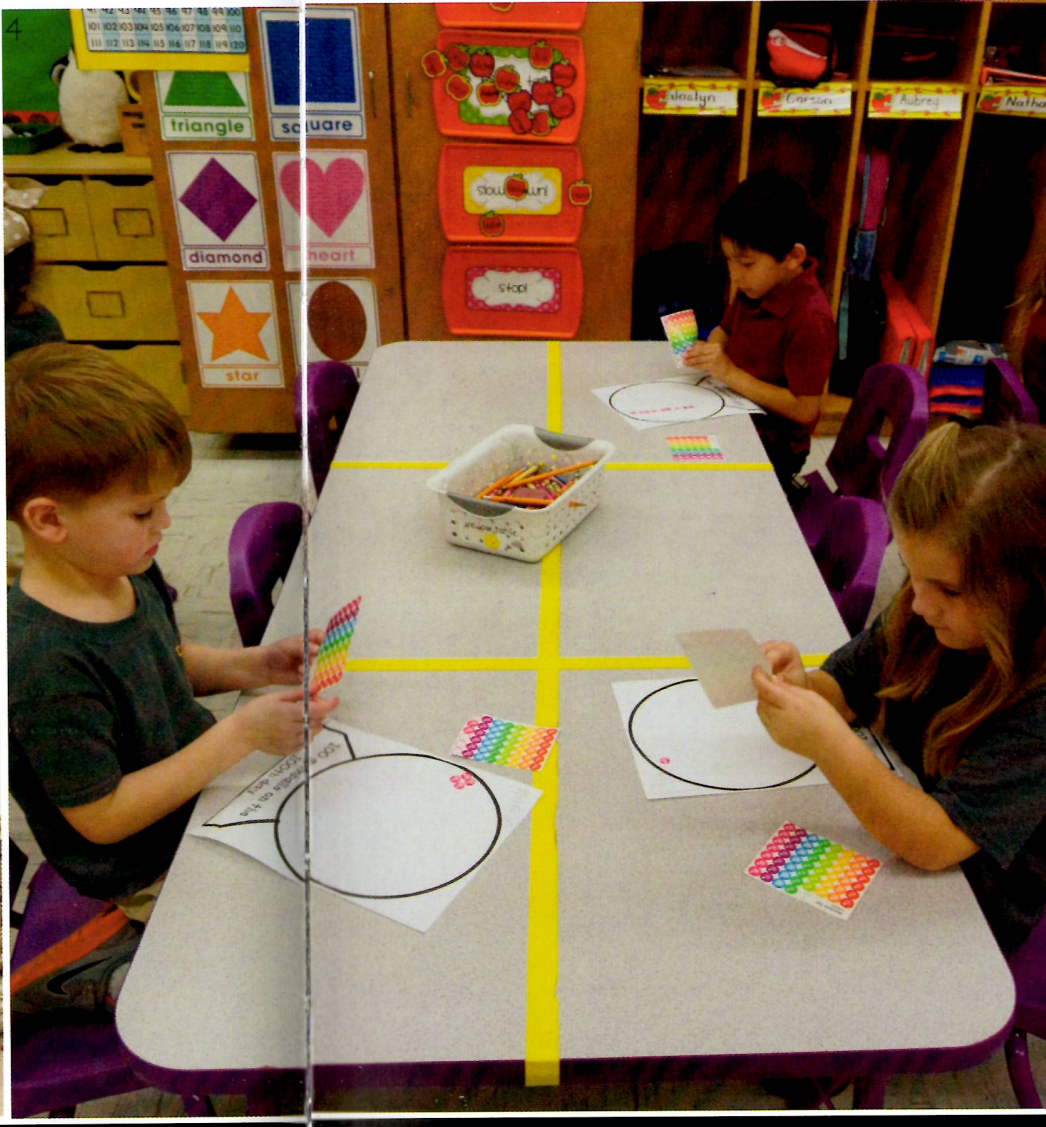

# All in a School Day

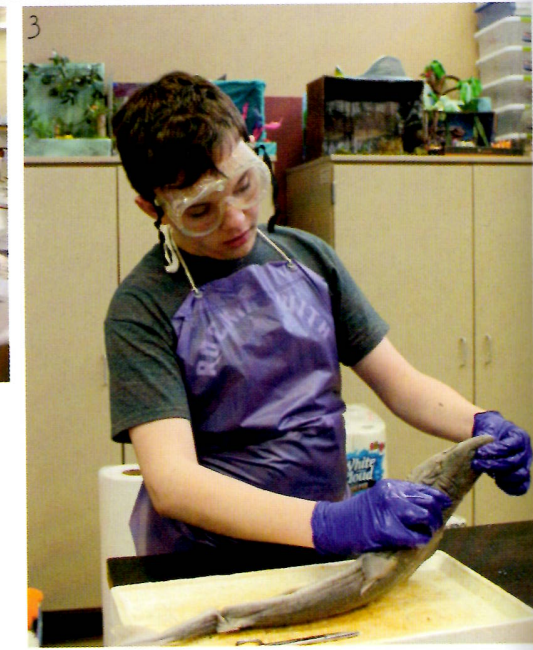

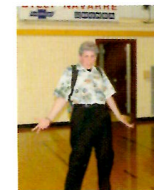

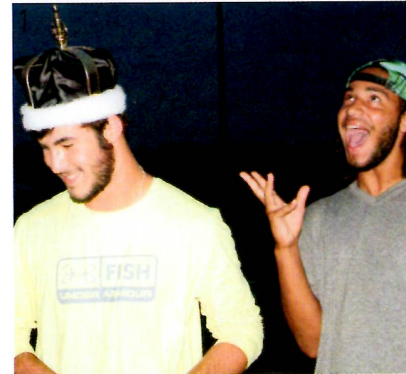
# Homecoming Parade

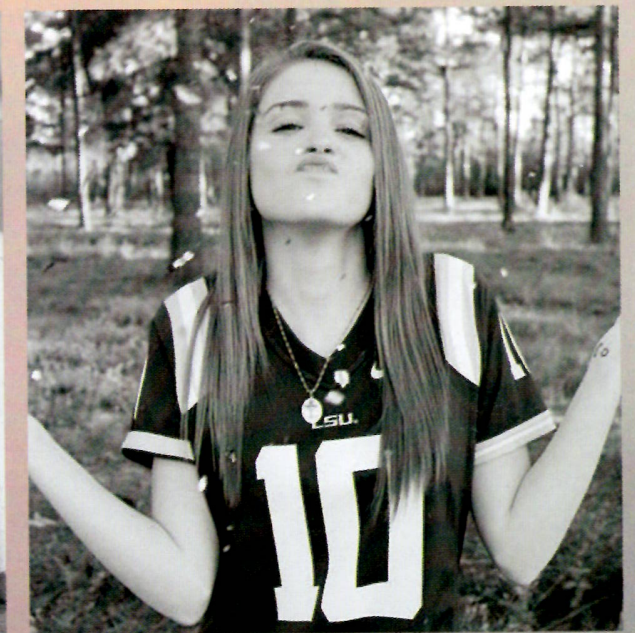
# Mr. Grand Lake Brycen Savoie

Q: What is your favorite subject?

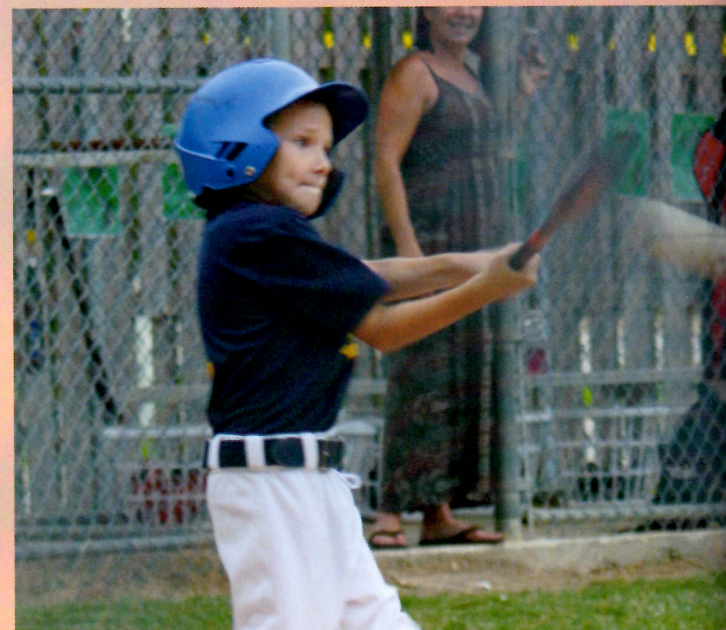
A: My favorite subject is reading because I do a lot of writing and get to express myself through my writings.

Q: If you could gain any trait or quality, what would it be?

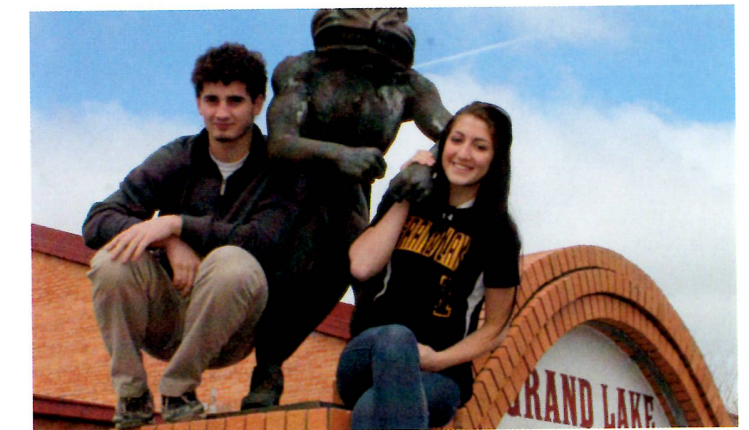

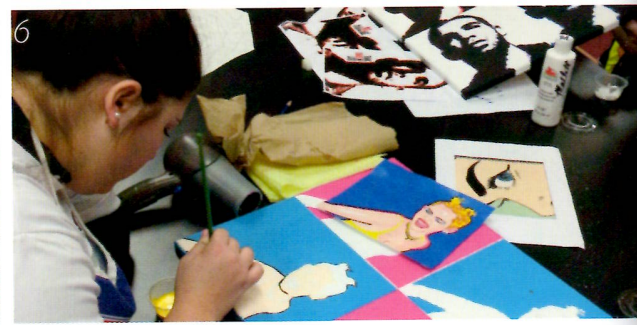

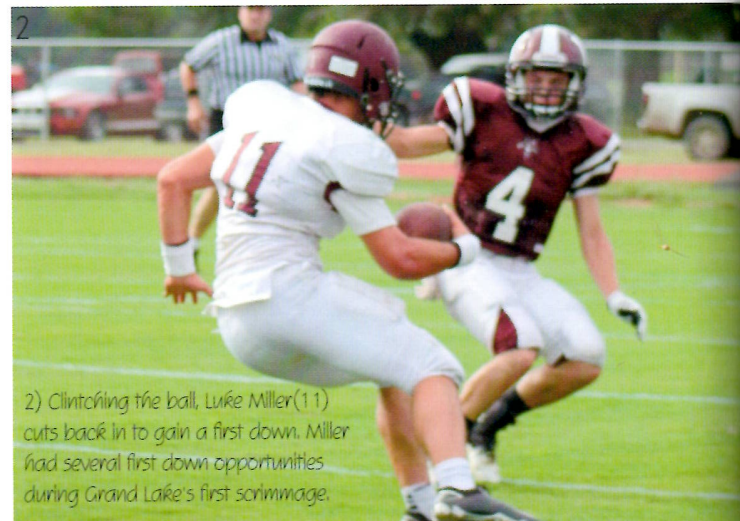

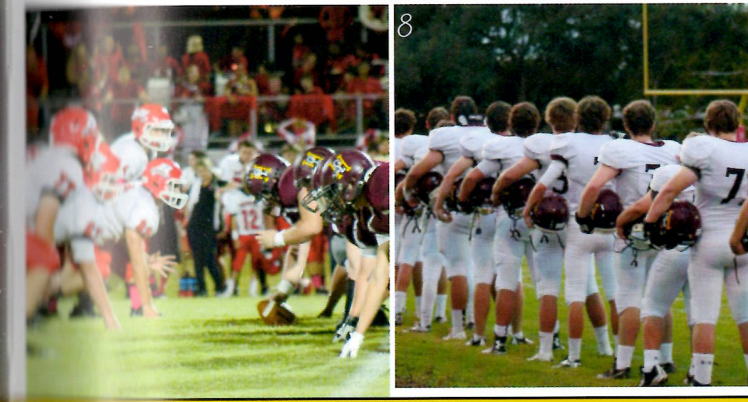

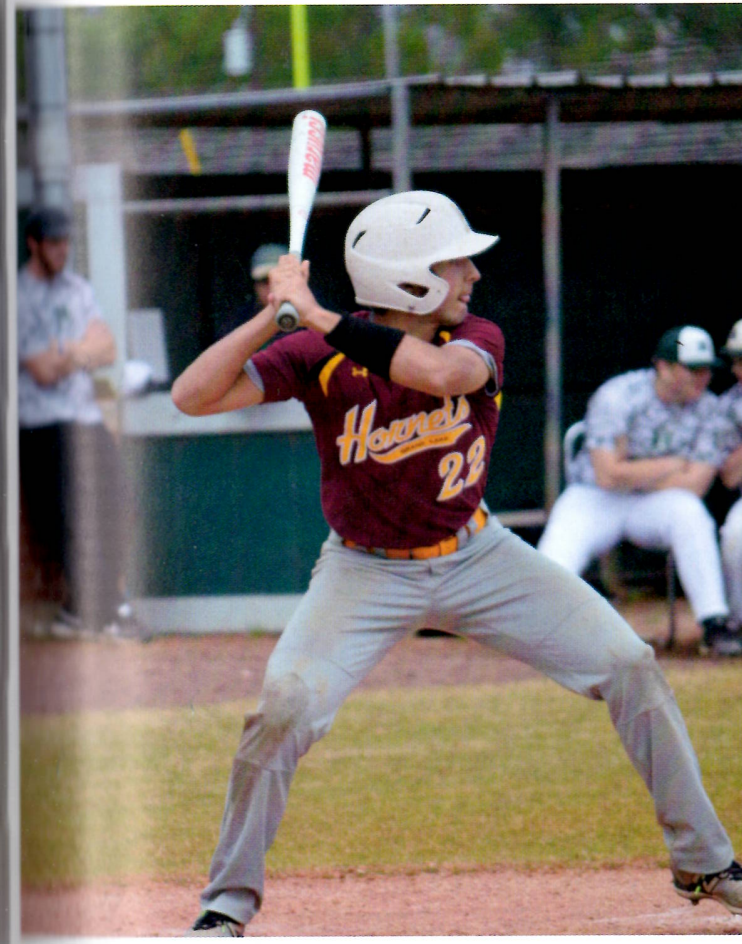

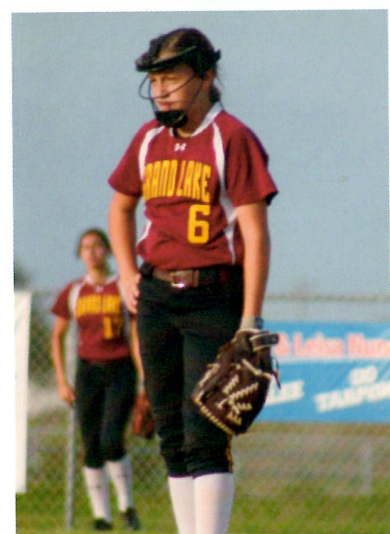

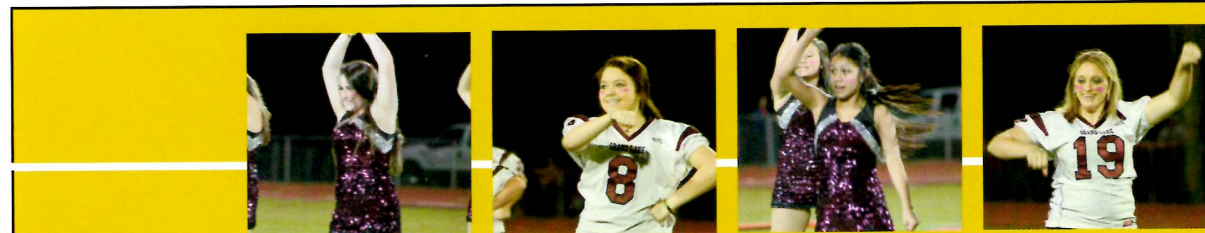

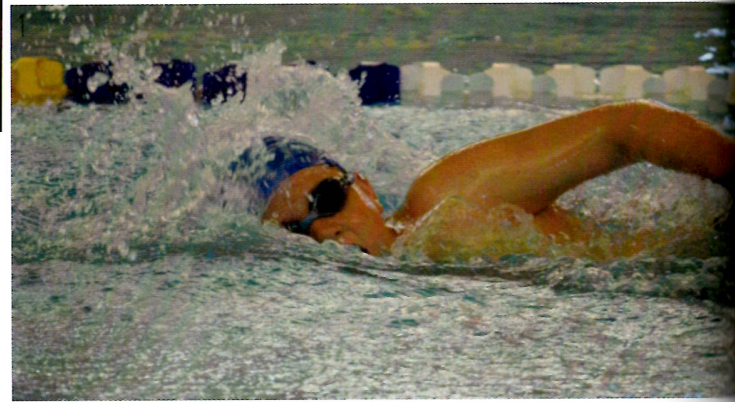

# Christmas Program



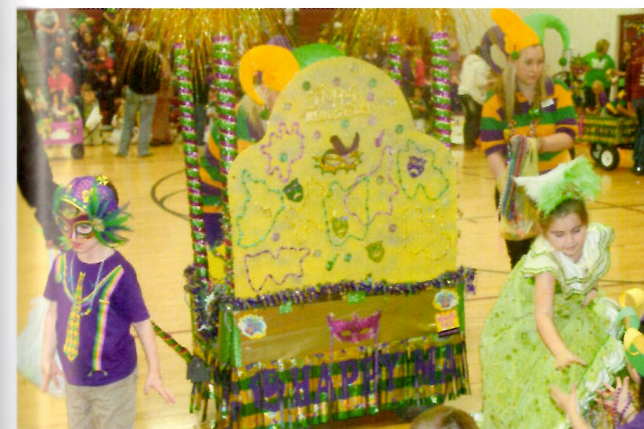
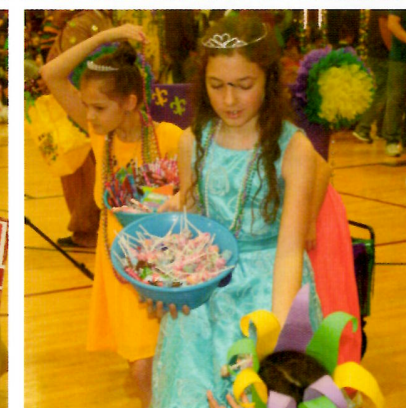

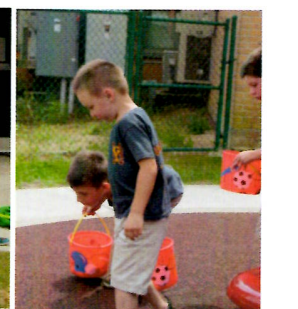
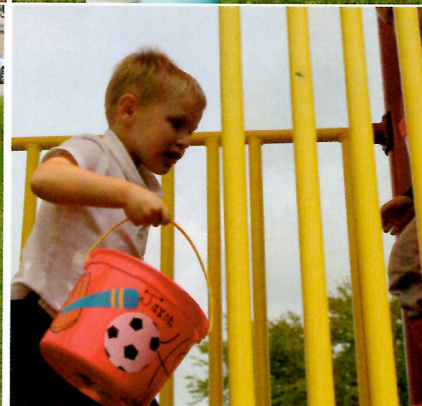
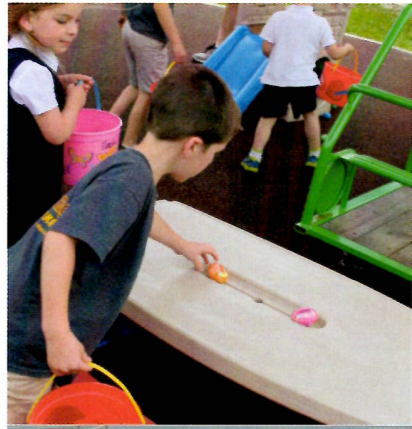
# Mardi Gras

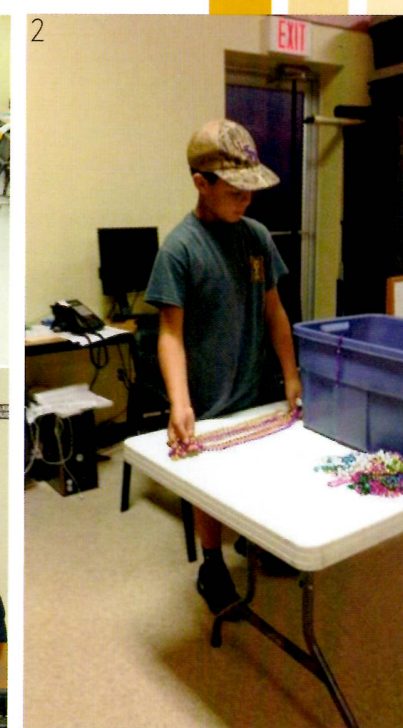

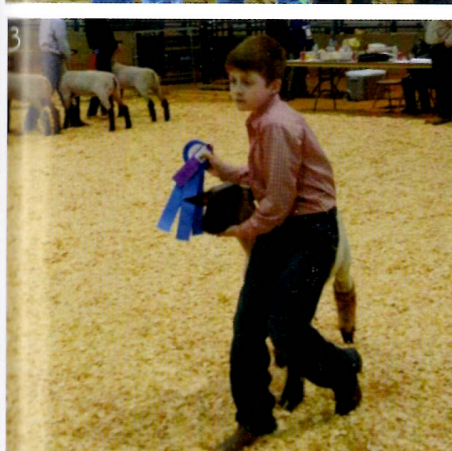
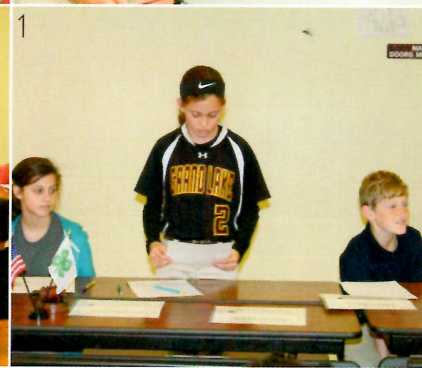

3) Despite the rainy weather, the first grade classes enjoyed a field trip to the Zoo of Acadiana. Students were able to see many species of animals, reptiles, and birds. They were even able to feed animals such as llamas, goats, and chickens.



4) Picking out a pumpkin is a tradition of the fall season. The pre-K students got the chance to do just that when they went to the Pumpkin Patch. They played several fall season themed games and listened to a story about a ghost.

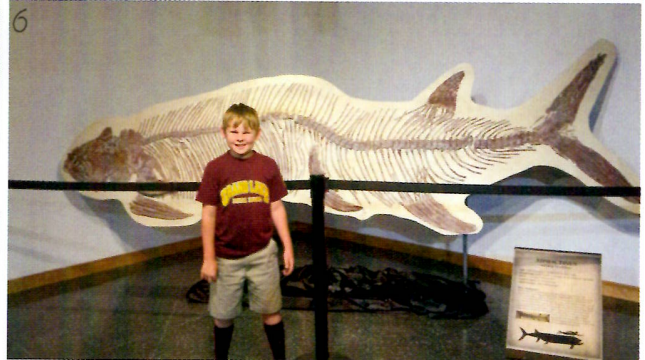
5) Packed up and ready to go, the Rindergarten classes traveled to Grant, Louisiana to Grant Christmas Tree Farm & Syrup Mill where they learned about how seedlings grow into trees and how syrup is made. They also took a trail ride around the farm and fed the donkey and goats. Before they left, Mrs. Cherie's class chose a Christmas tree for their classroom.



7) Early in the year, 6th grade students went to the Science Expo held at the Civic Center in Lake Charles. Students were encouraged to participate in several experiments that provided them with a hands-on experience of how chemistry affects their lives.



6) As Earth slowly orbits the sun, the 4th grade students take a field trip to the Lafayette Science Museum and Planetarium. Students learned about the position of the sun, moon, planets, and stars throughout the seasons.



8) The fifth grade class also attended the magic show at the Civic Center and enjoyed time together at Millennium Park. They climbed the ropes as a class to pose for a picture. Wondering through the maze of the fort and playing chase were also activities they enjoyed during their time at the park.

# PBIS

The PBIS (Positive Behavior Incentive Program) awards students for good behavior. The elementary PBIS program awarded students each nine weeks with activities ranging from outdoor activities such as tug-a-war and parachute runs to indoor activities such as hot chocolate and a movie to carnival type games in the gym. The final activities included a snocone from Kona Ice. Elementary students earned hornet bucks that allowed them to wear free dress, sunglasses, and hats during the PBIS activities. The middle and high school PBIS program awarded student at mid-term and at the end of school. Middle and high school students enjoyed 4-square volleyball as their mid-term award. The final party included a twenty-four foot rock wall, baseball and kickball games, and BBQ burgers. These students also earned hornet bucks for each week of perfect attendance. These bucks could be placed in a jar for a reserved parking spot at the front of the school. The array of activities offered entices students to follow school expectations to receive these awards.



# Elementary Sports

The elementary students take advantage of several athletic opportunities throughout the school year. The aspiring Hornet football players play Lil All-Stars football where they learn techniques for both offensive and defensive positions. Several play basketball for the Grand Lake Little Dribblers teams. Little Dribblers teaches players the fundamentals of basketball to prepare players for Junior High and High School play. Grand Lake students also enjoy playing baseball and softball in the spring as they join either Grand Lake Little League or one of the several other leagues. Players build skills as they transition from tee-ball to kid pitch teams. Among other students, soccer has become a popular recreational sport. Shooting sports and rodeo are also popular with our outdoor enthusiasts. The elementary girls enjoy a cheer camp and a danceline camp each year. The girls learn cheers and dances from the varsity teams and perform at halftime during varsity games. The elementary students are growing and learning to become competitive Junior and High School players.

The Grand Lake Class of 1991 recently realized the death of a beloved classmate. Suzana Fadlil Murni graced the halls of Grand Lake School for two years of her life as an exchange student from Jakarta, Indonesia, first, as a freshman in 1987-1988 and then as a senior in 1990-1991. In that short time span, Suzana blessed her classmates with a radiant smile, carefree laughter, artistic talent, and simple brilliance. Anytime there was art work to be designed, Suzana was the go-to person! She was active in FBLA, Beta, SADD, and Yearbook Staff. Although our lives would never cross paths after walking the halls of Grand Lake, Suzana's amazing accomplishments in her short life continued to have an effect in the lives of many and her memory will live on through the class of 1991.

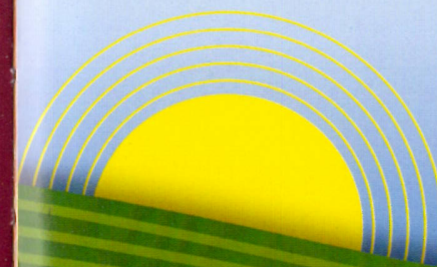

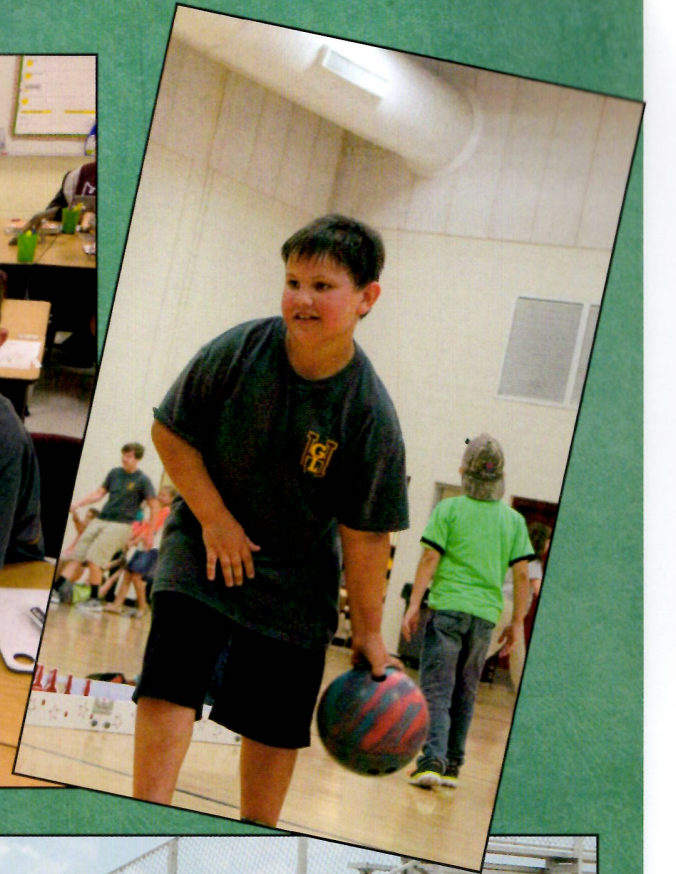
