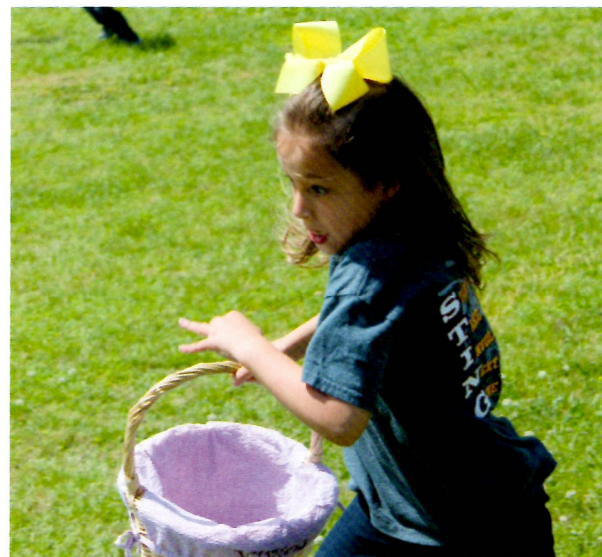
Elementary Danceline

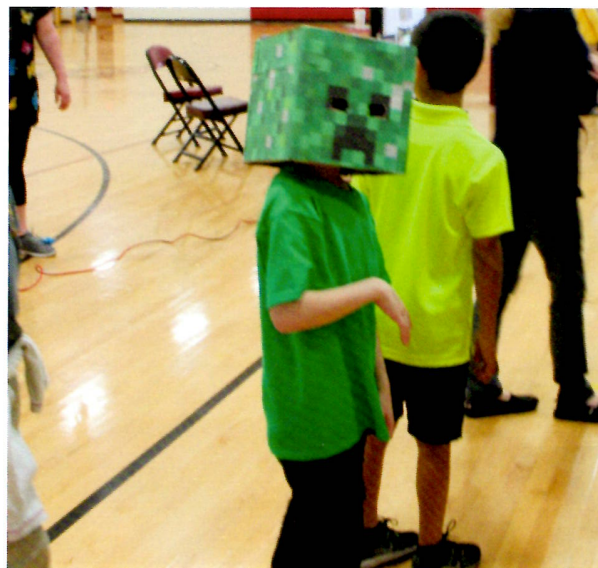
Read Across America

Mardi Gras

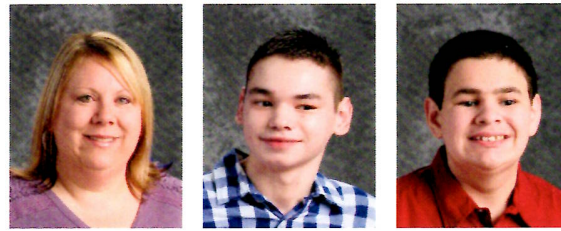

Graduation

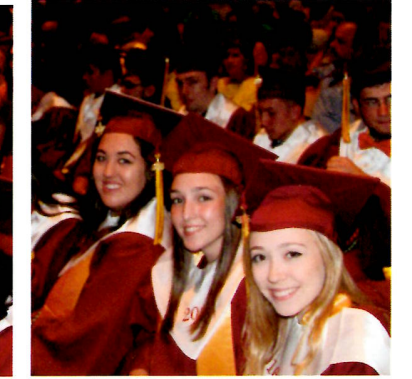

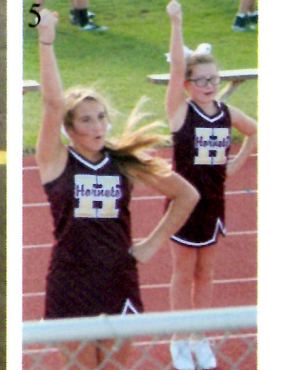

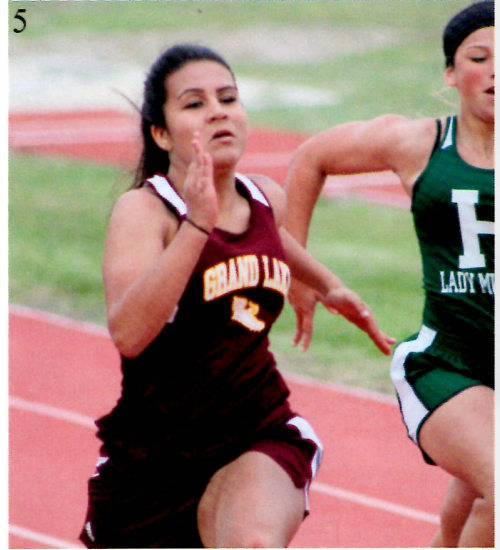

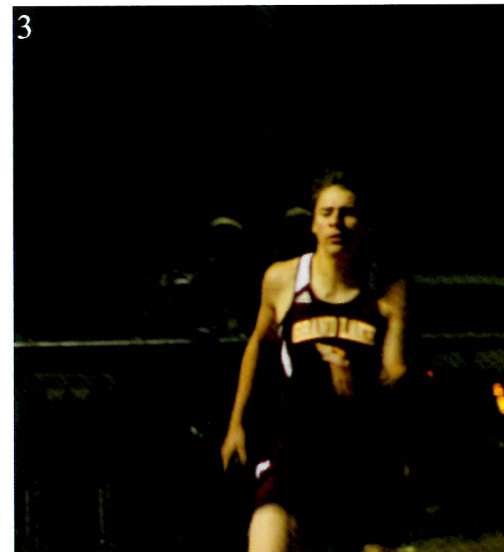

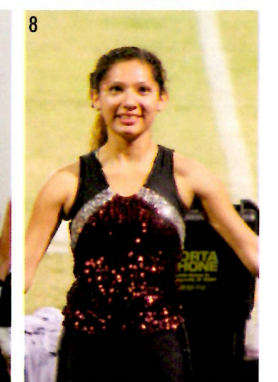

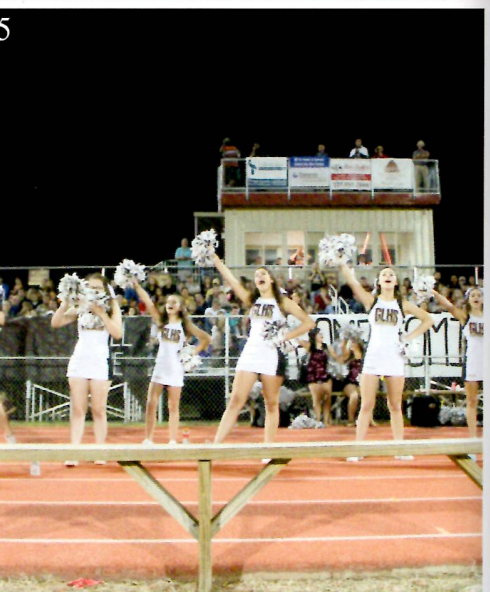

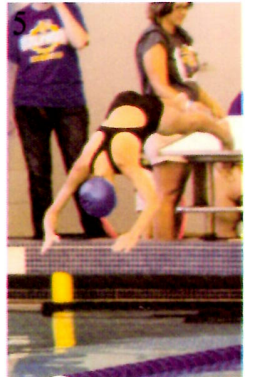

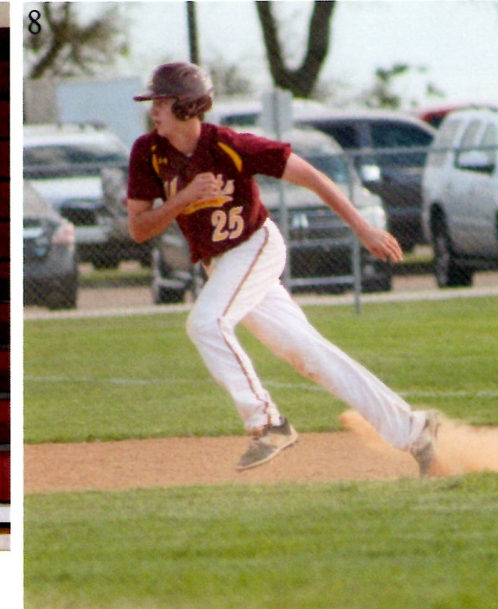

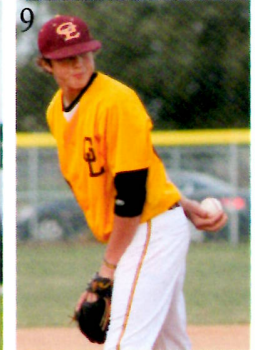

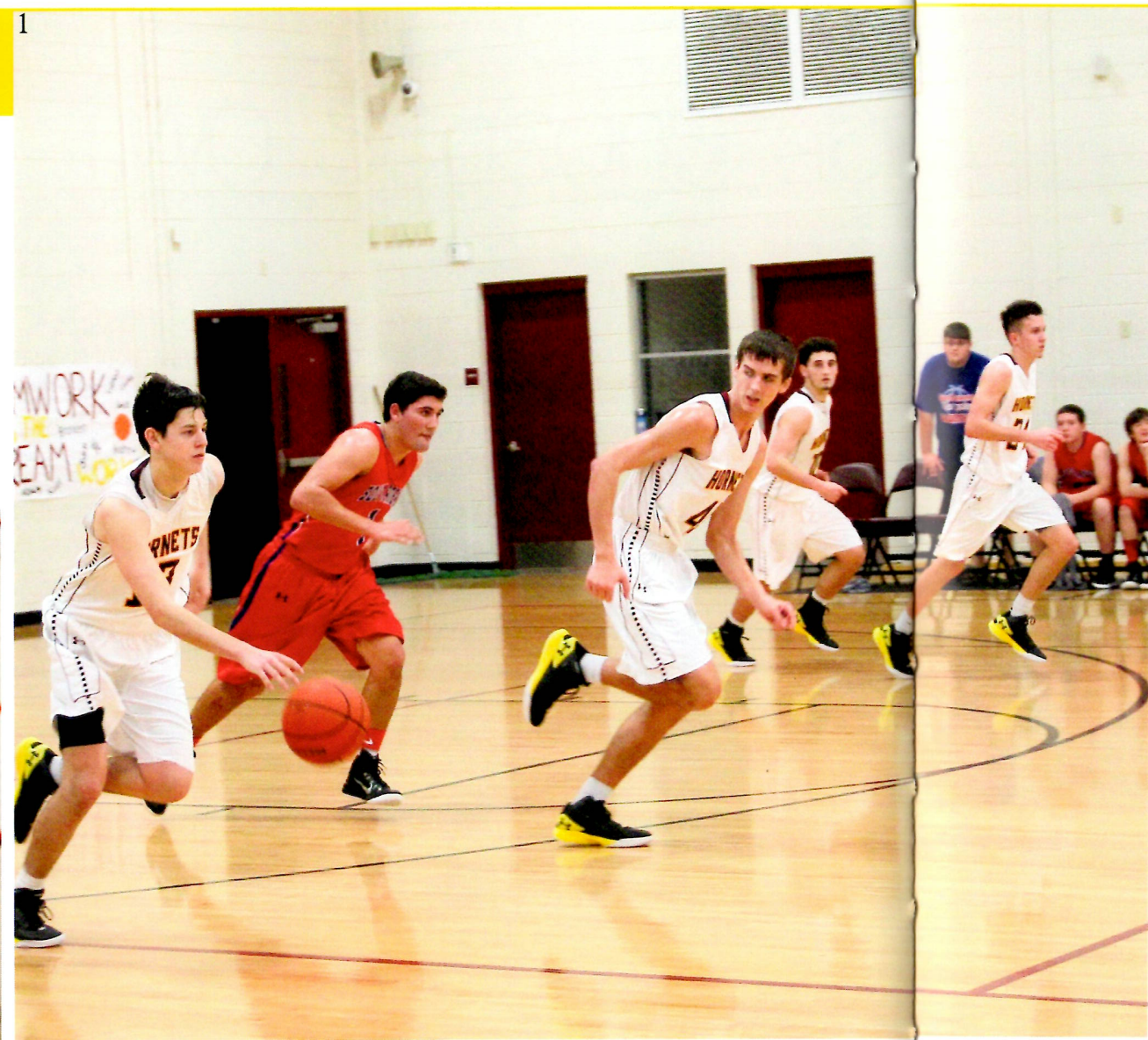

4) During the second semester, middle school students attend their first FCS lunch. This year was the first year FCS hosted lunches for middle school students. There was a total of eighty students that attended.

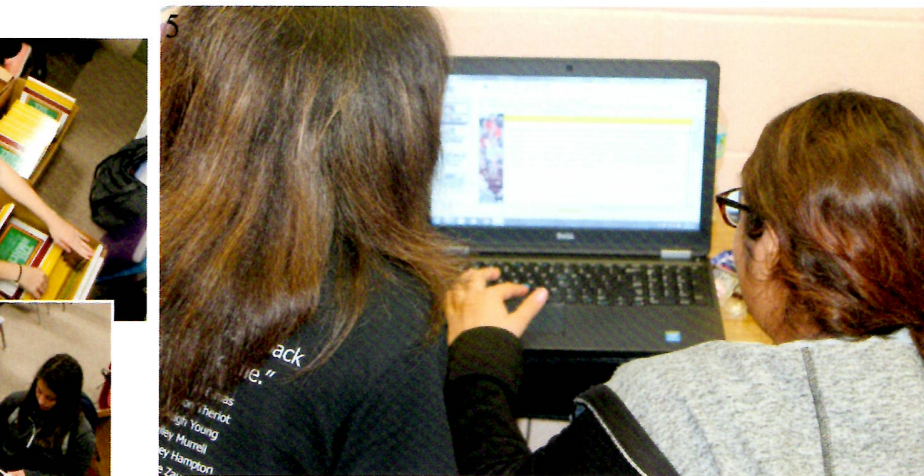


Throughout the year, many students attended monthly FCS meetings hosted by high school students.

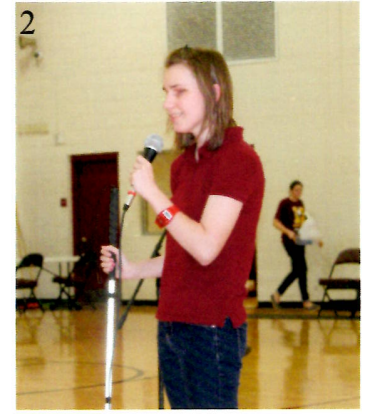


Talent Show

Fall Festival

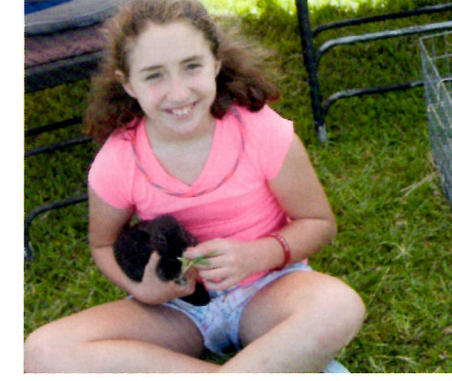

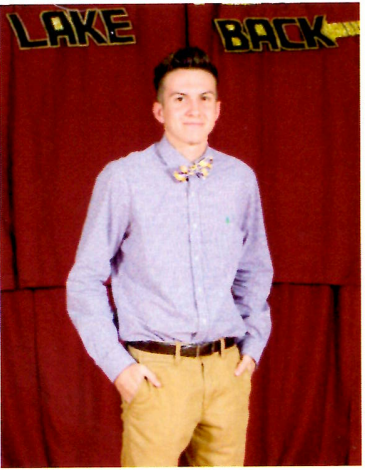

1) Parade-goers line the route to catch candy and trinkets being thrown by participants. The homecoming maids and king nominees were among those riding in the parade.

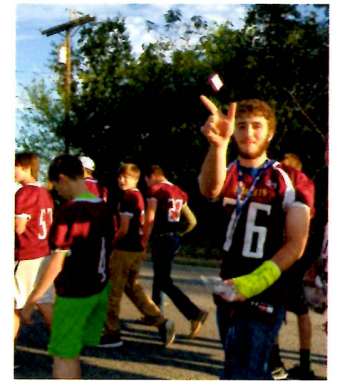

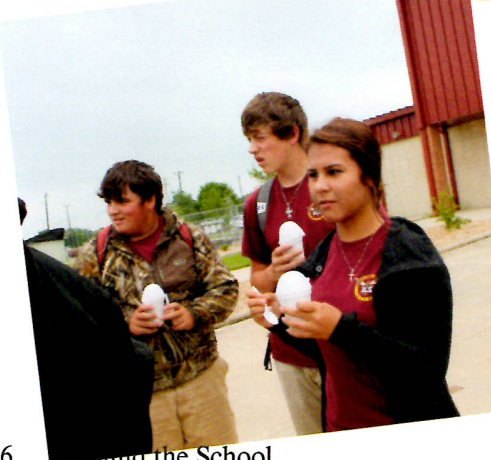
