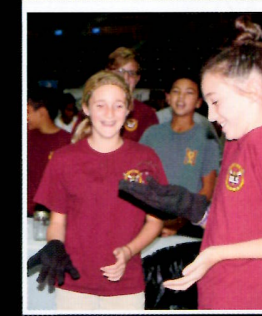
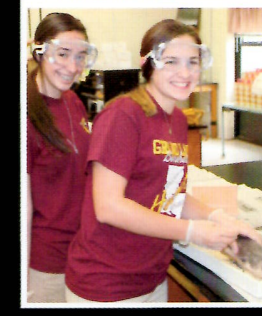
2017 Grand Lake Lil' Dribblers Junior Boys STATE CHAMPIONS Congratulations



Through hard work and dedication, the junior division boys' team captured the state championship title. After an early loss, they fought back winning a total of five games to earn the title.

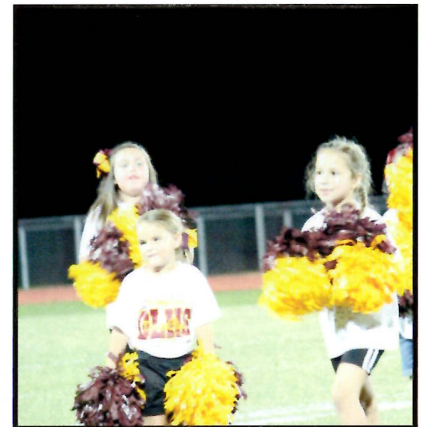
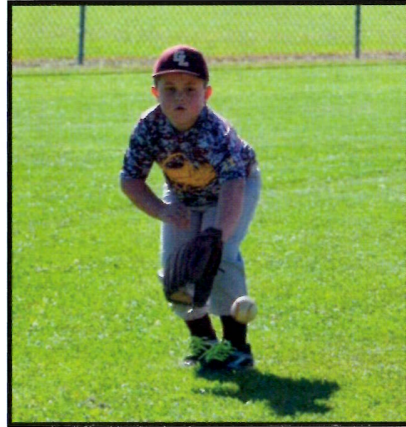

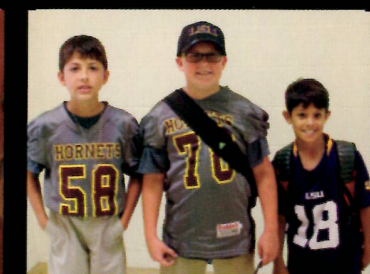
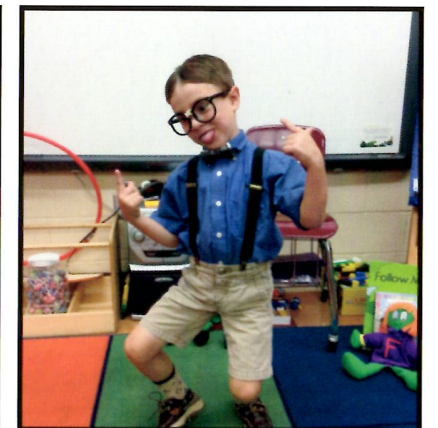
Elementary Sports

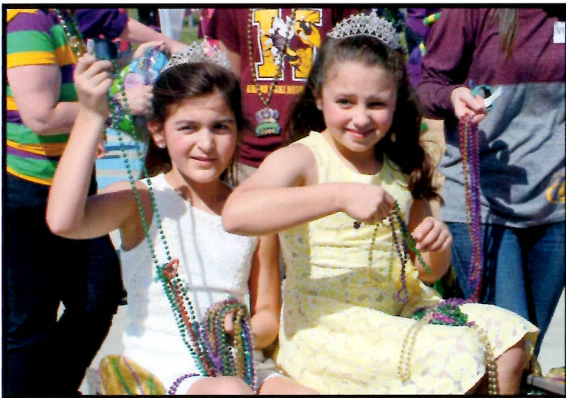
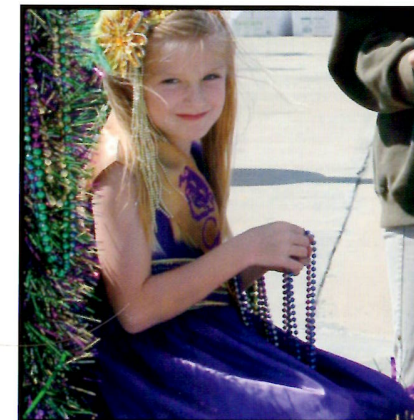
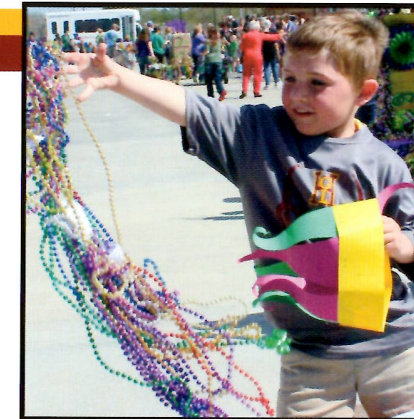
Easter

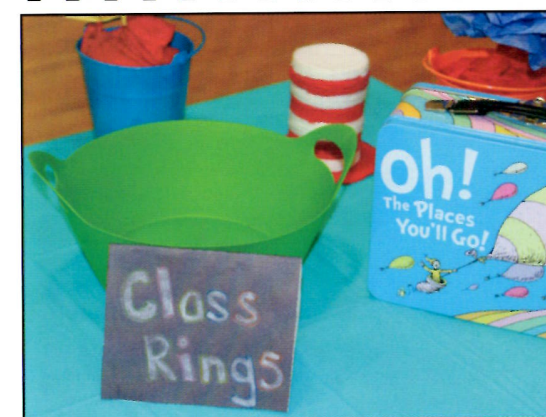
Christmas Program

2) Before the graduation ceremony begins, the seniors sit in the front row to watch the senior slideshow. The slideshow includes baby and senior pictures from each graduate.

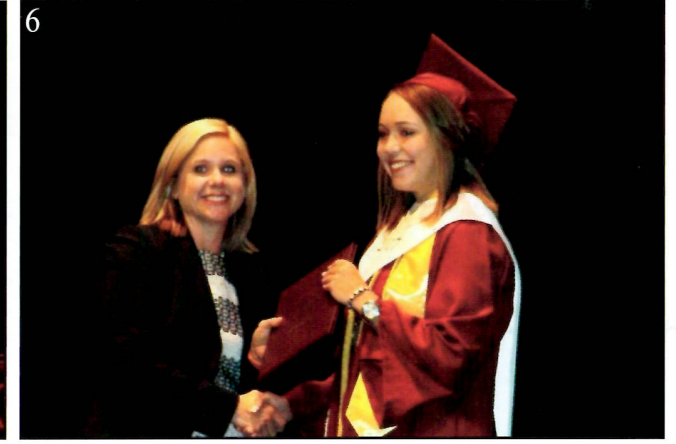

2) At the Cameron Parish Livestock Show, Tony LeDoux(4) placed with his Grand Champion commercial heifer. LeDoux has been showing for two years.



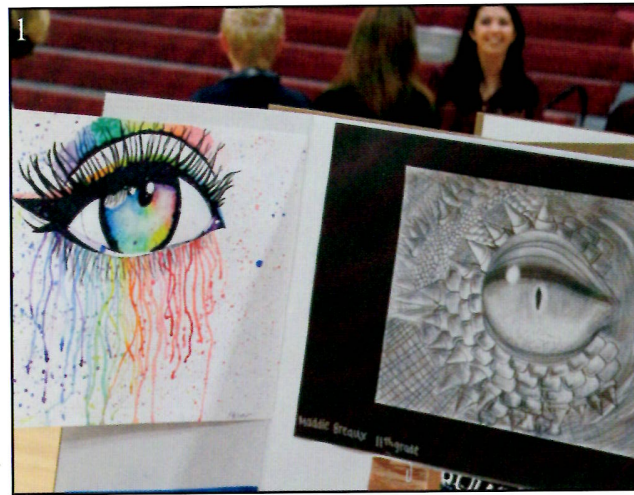

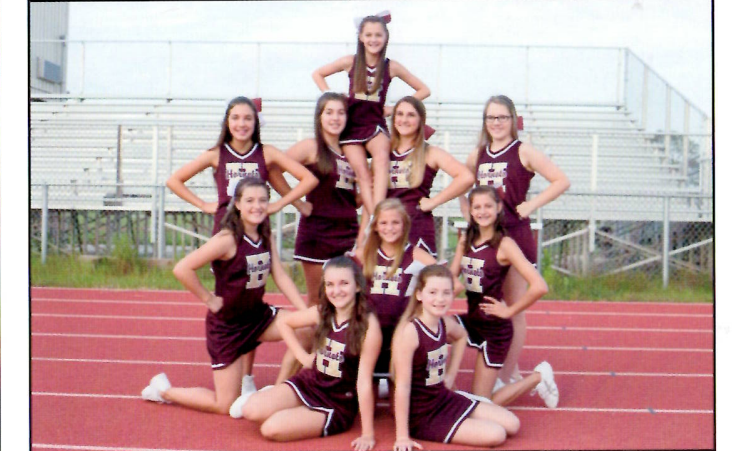
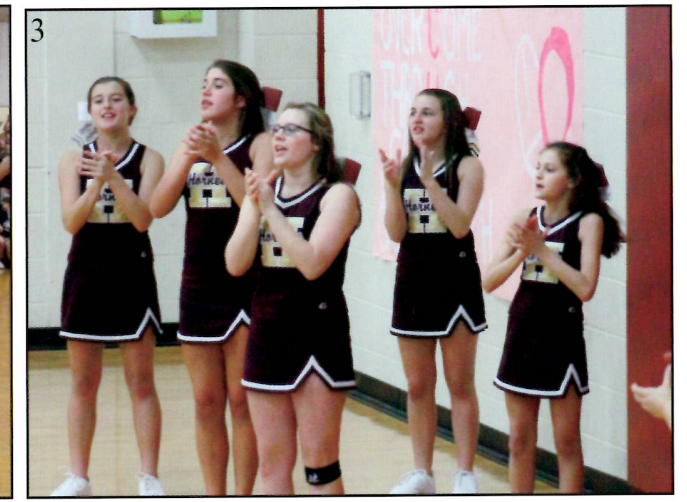


Jr. High Cheer

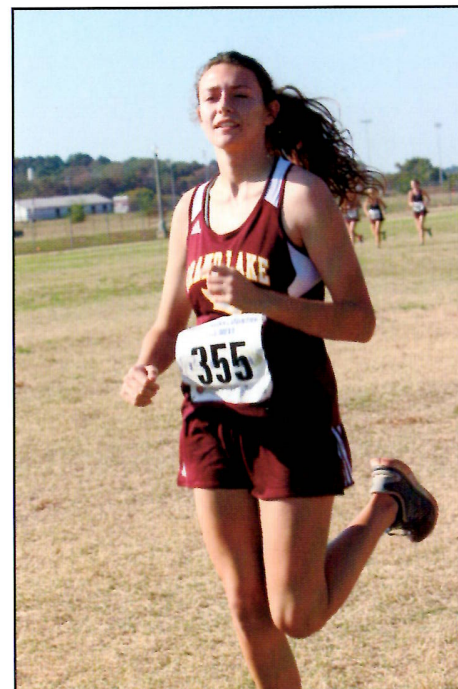

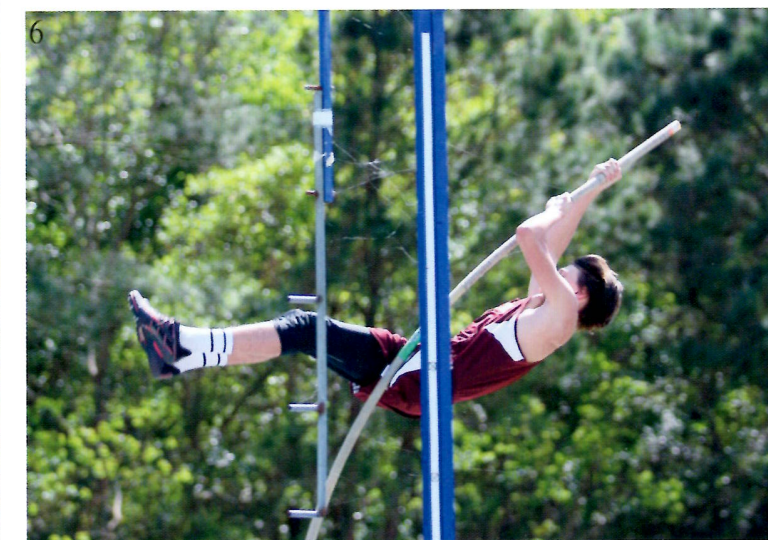

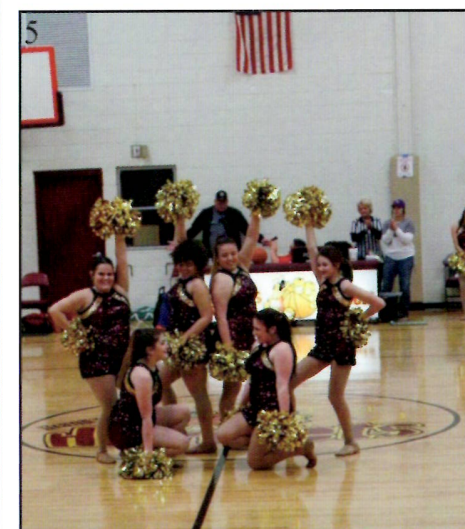

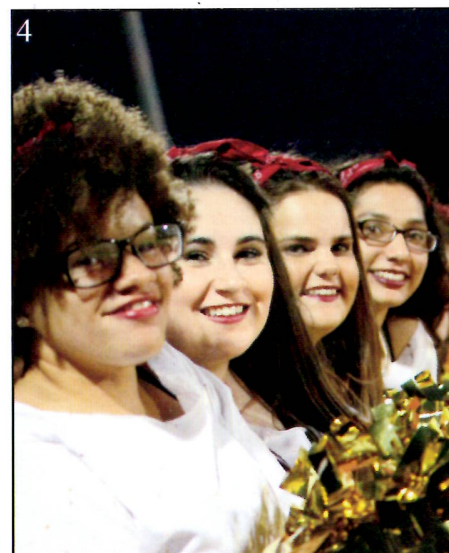

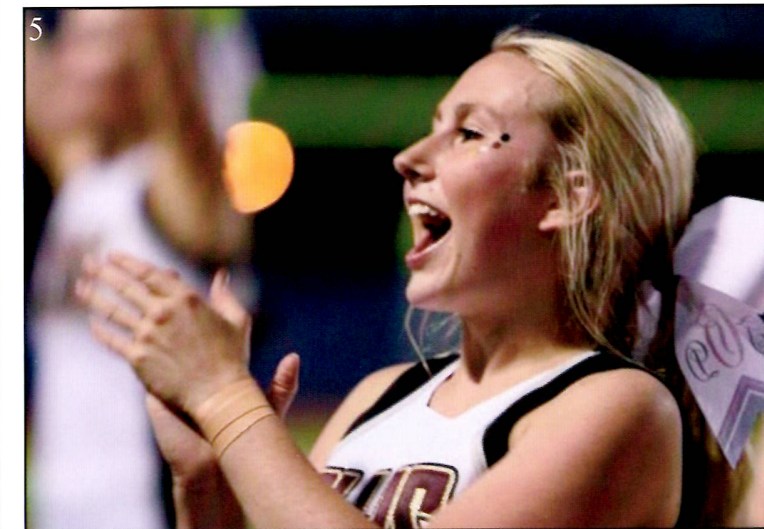

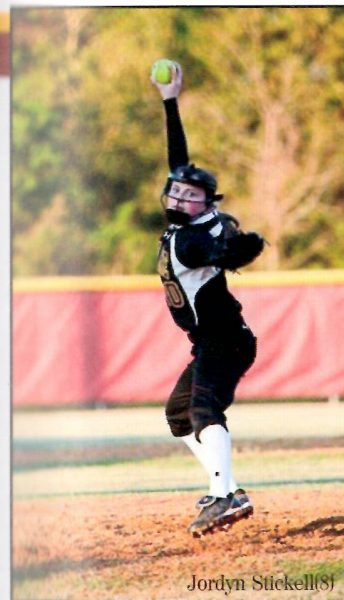

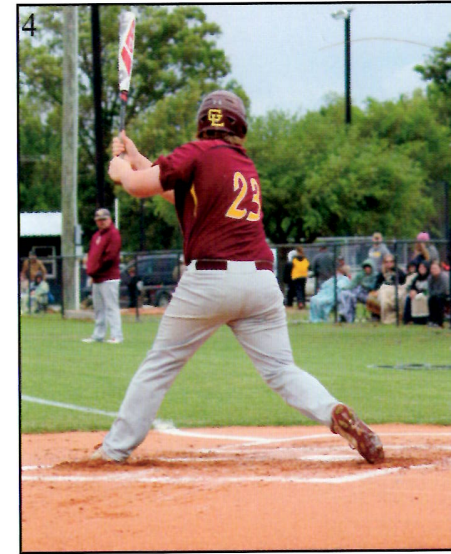

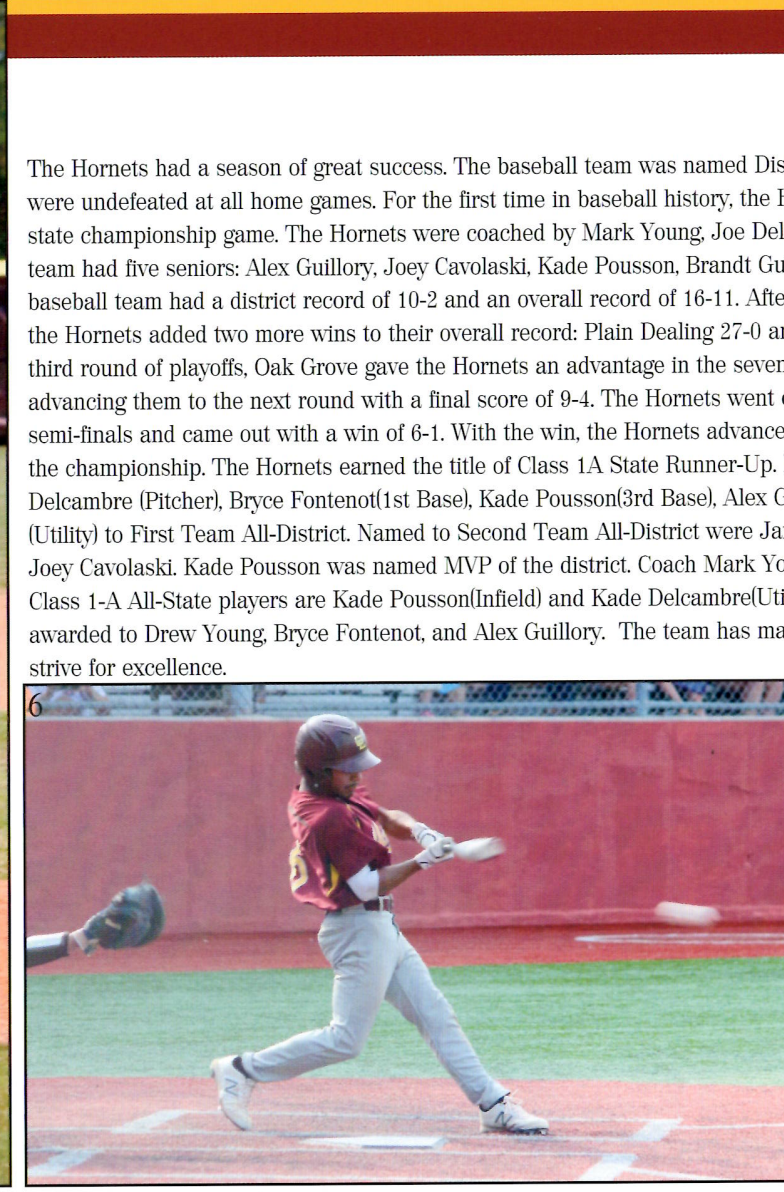

3) While having her shot contested, Marlee Boudreaux(11) attempts to make the shot. Boudreaux and Kayla Devall were co-captains this year.

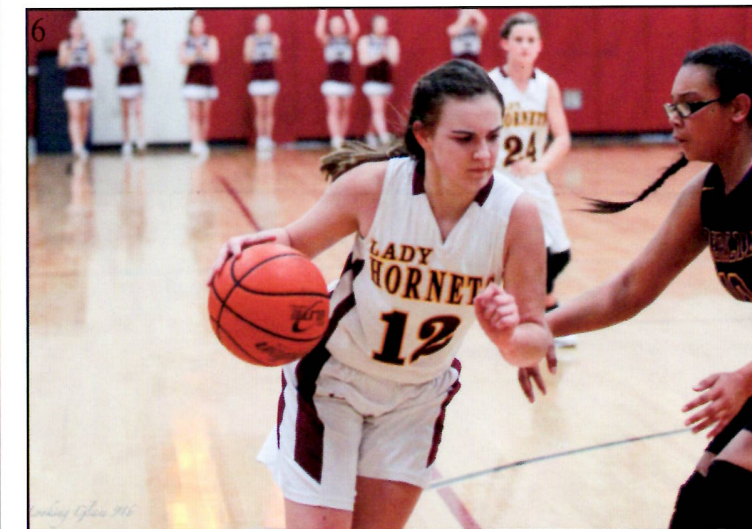

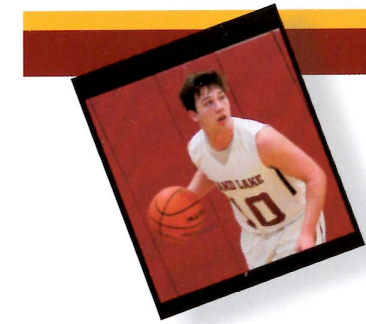
5) Point guard, Maci Montie(9) beats the Oberlin defender into the lane. Montie was the leading scorer for the Lady Hornets.

6) The Grand Lake Hornets run through the new tunnel to take on the LCCP Trailblazers. The hornets scored two touchdowns in this game.



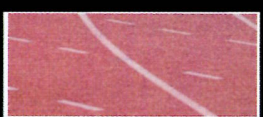
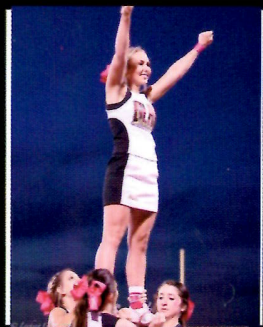

Falynn Foreman

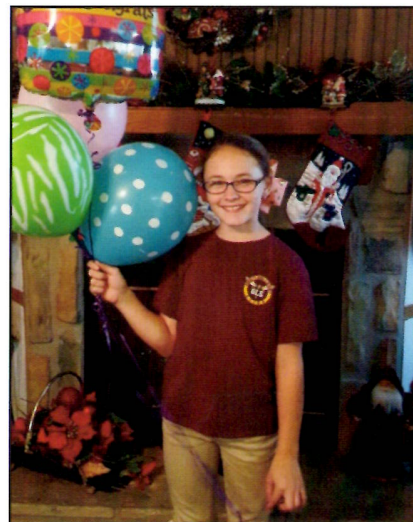

8th Grade Student of the Year

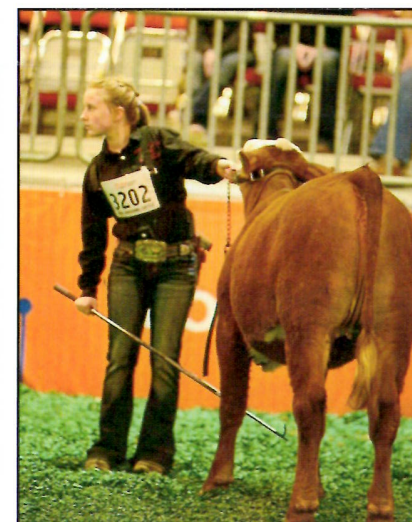

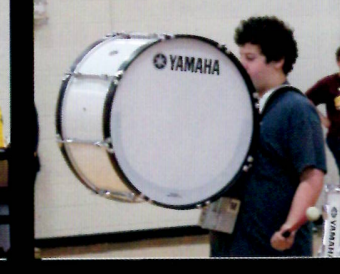
Prom

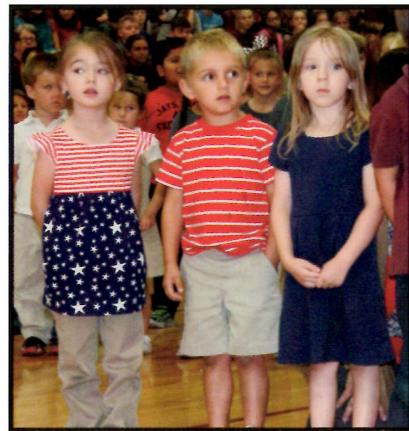
Drumline

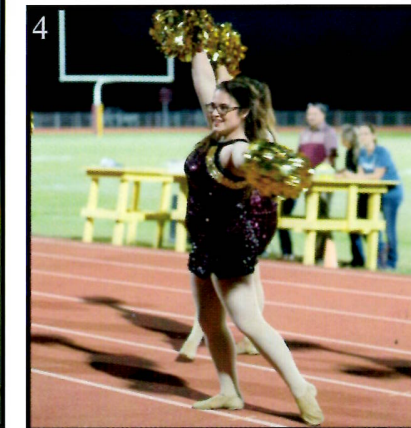
1) Last year's king, Jacob Guidry, returns to the school to crown the newly elected king. Jacob had the honor of crowning his brother, Paul Guidry(12).

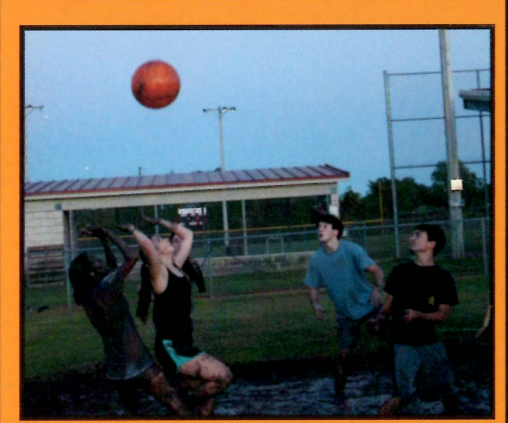
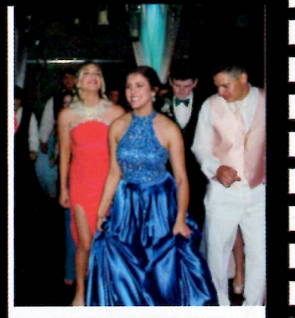
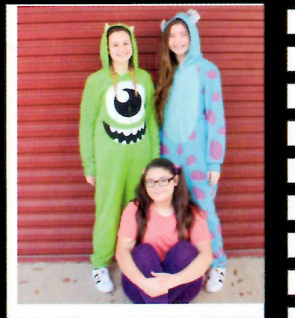
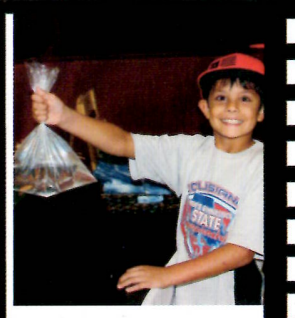
Around the School

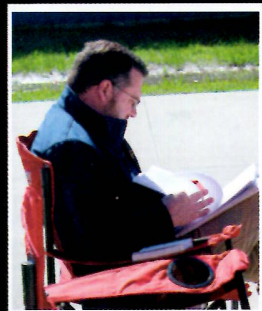
