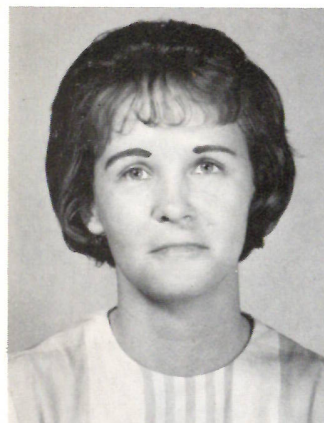
The complexity of education demands that the intellectual and emotional capacities be developed for a happy and socially useful life. The English Department accepts the challenge.

The Industrial Arts Department is designed to offer the student opportunities to learn and put into practice the art of all phases of carpentry.

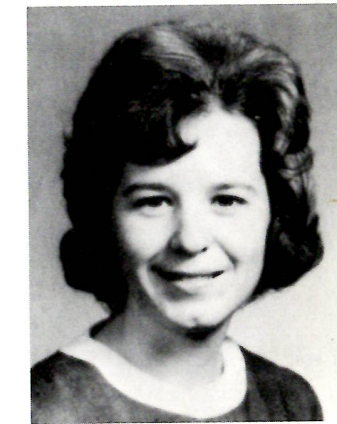
The Business Education Department prepares students for a position in the business world or for further education in business.

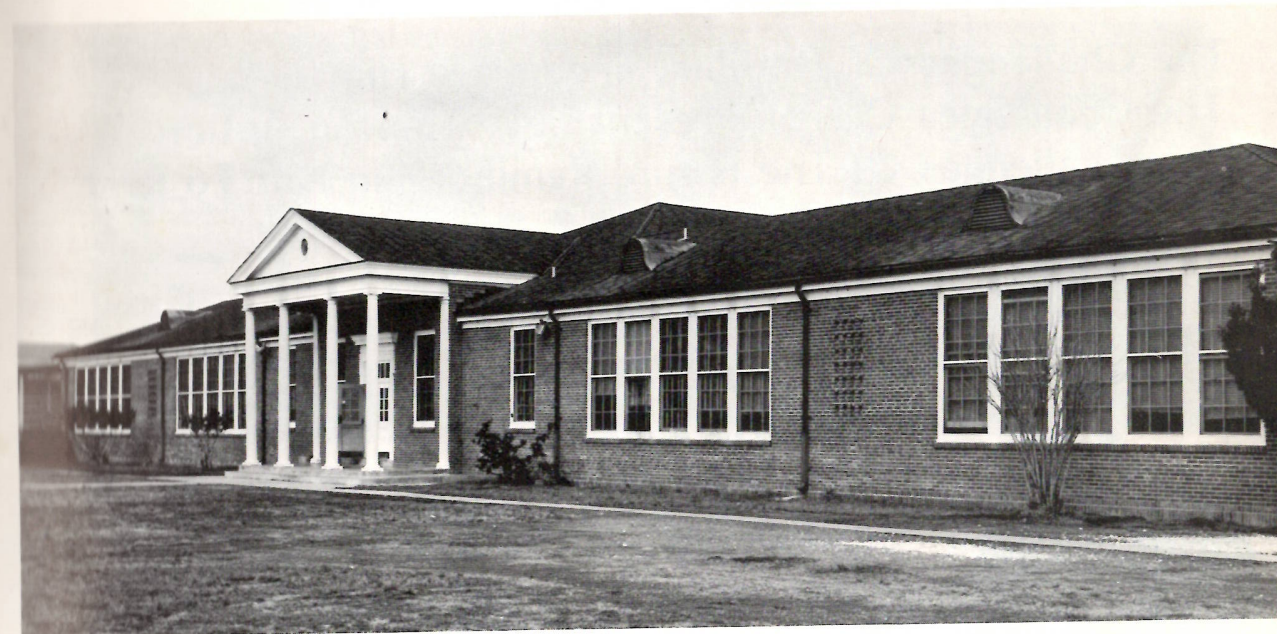
