

With a first place finish in District, the Mustangs now entered the third Season—the State Playoffs—and again the Mustangs climbed that next plateau. The Mustangs dropped a heart breaker to Pleasant Hill 56 to 49. With the loss the Mustangs were by no means a loser, for the Mighty Mustangs had posted one of the best seasons ever (33-8) and had taken a community and placed it on the map.

His sophomore year, Ernie placed again in District Literary Rally and represented the district at State Literary Rally in biology.


As a junior, he demonstrated his leadership abilities. He became Wrestling Team captain (a position he held through his senior year) and was HHS's Boy's State representative.










