## SCIENCE OLYMPIAD



This was the first year for the Regional Science Olympiad, a series of contests in many different areas of science. Hackberry participated with a team of 13 enthusiastic students. They went all out preparing, in a short while, for 18 contests. Points were scored for first through 10th places, although only 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners were announced. The overall team scored 7th out of 25, most of whom were some of the largest schools from Baton Rouge to Lake Charles. First place winners were The Sounds of Music team with Christina Perrodin, Wendy LeBlanc, and Jeremy Henry; and Cecilia Walther in Tree Identification. Layne Kyle and Jared Jinks placed 2nd in the Egg Drop and 3rd place was taken by Clint Hewitt and Jared, using Leroy Simon's invention in the Mousetrap Vehicle Race. The teams helped each other in designing and planning many of the entries such as the Hot House, Balloon Race (which Leroy and Mike Wright almost won!) and Aerodynamics. The remainder of the school team was made up of Michael LeGros, Shannon Carroll, Tony Thompson, and Michael Guillory.



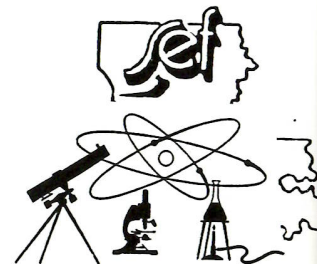
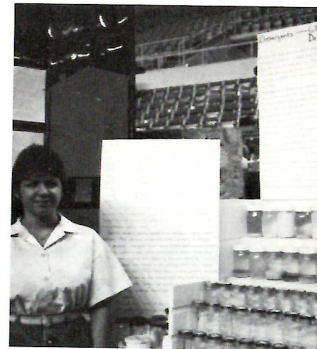
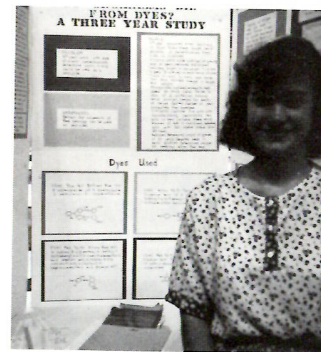
# SCIENCE FAIR

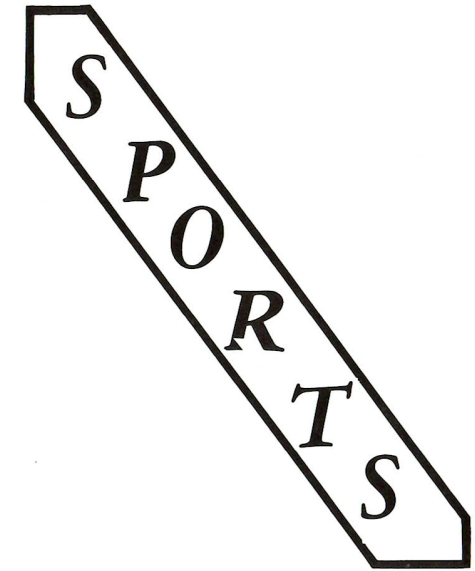
This year's MUSTANG was not an easy one to put together. The hardest part was deciding on a theme. Once that was accomplished, things began to start falling in place.

Success is having faith, laughing and loving, winning the respect of others and the affection of children, appreciating beauty, finding the best in others, giving of one's self, leaving the world a little bit better, or knowing that even one life has breathed easier because you have tried. This is to have succeeded.
