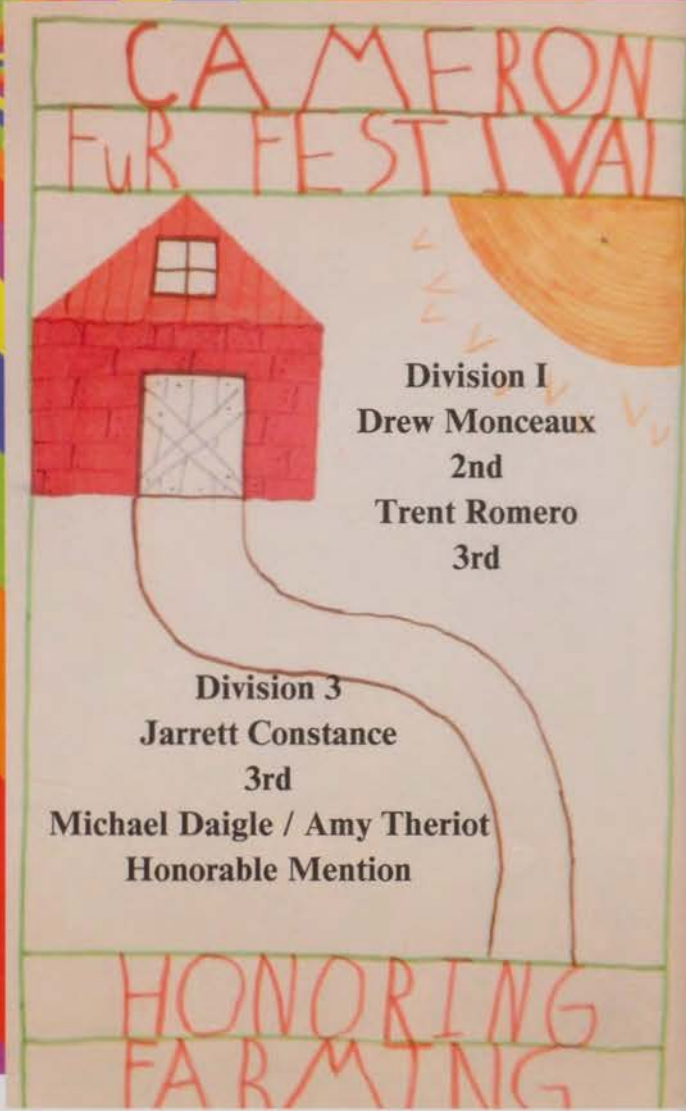
Mrs. Lynda Deniger presented Patti Pelican and the Gulf Oil Spill, one of her books in her series. Her presentation included her book, music, and student participation.

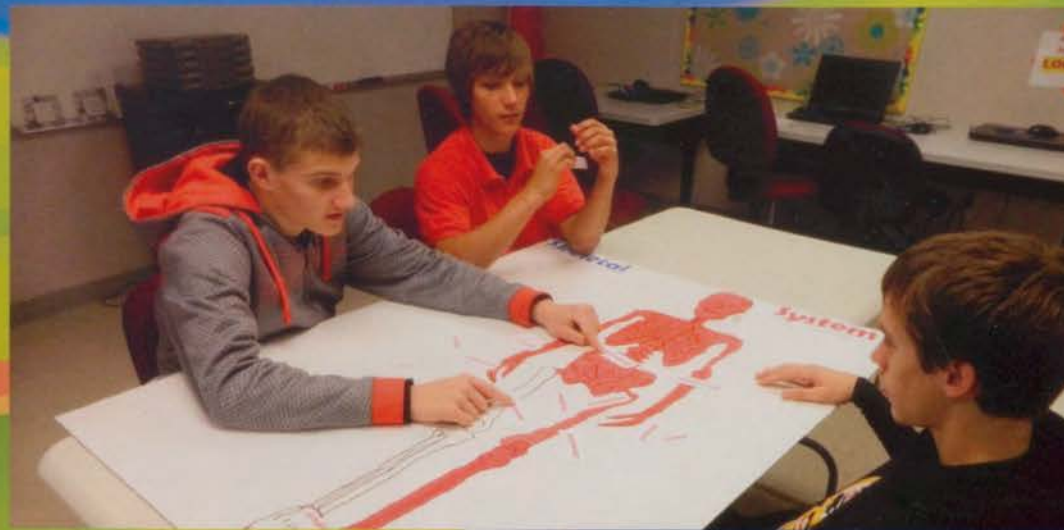

There was nothing typical about the groundbreaking of our school on January 29, 2013. Each and every shovelful of dirt represented so much to so many.
