Prophecies

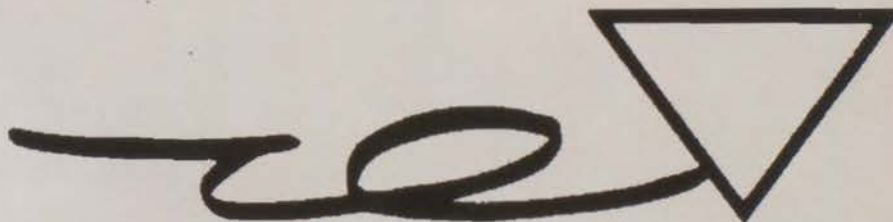
